

Quick look at weather conditions:

Cairo Regional Airport (KCIR) was located between the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers, north of the downtown area and reported the following conditions:



Cairo weather at 2355 CDT (0755Z), wind from the south or from 190° true at 5 knots, visibility 10 statute miles or greater, sky conditions clear, temperature 77° F, dew point 70° F, altimeter 30.02 inches of mercury. No precipitation reported in the past 24 hours.

WSR-88D Weather radar indicated no significant radar echoes in the vicinity.

Astronomical conditions indicated sunset at 2019 CDT, end of civil twilight at 2049 CDT, moonrise at 2041 CDT. At the time of the accident the moon phase was a waxing gibbous with 100% of the disk illuminated, with the moon at an azimuth of 148° and at 27° above the horizon.

No weather issues identified, beside nighttime conditions.
