Discussion	
<p>Onshore flow will develop along the upper Texas coast today, resulting in periods of fog across the Houston Ship Channel. In addition to the fog, heavy rain during the day on Monday may result in reduced visibility. The most likely period of any channel closure due to fog or heavy rain will be late Monday afternoon and into the overnight. Channel closures lasting a couple hours at a time are possible. Patchy dense fog could last into early Tuesday morning.</p> <p>Meteorologist: Cameron Self</p>	

FOG	LOW	Slight risk (>16% chance) of occasional or intermittent patches of dense fog. May result in brief periods of channel/port closures, generally less than 2 hours of the 6 hour interval.	MODERATE	Moderate risk (>50% chance) of dense fog. May result in longer periods of channel/port closures, possibly up to 4 hours in each 6 hour interval.	HIGH	High risk (>70% chance) of dense fog. Likely to result in extended periods of channel/port closure, possibly 4-6 hours of each 6 hour interval.
WIND	LOW	Periods of 25 kts or greater winds generally less than 2 hours of the 6 hour interval.	MODERATE	Periods of 25 kt or greater winds possible up to 4 hours in each 6 hour interval.	HIGH	Periods of 25 kt or greater winds likely 4-6 hours of each 6 hour interval.
