Discussion Onshore flow will develop along the upper Texas coast today, resulting in periods of fog across the Houston Ship Channel. In addition to the fog, heavy rain during the day on Monday may result in reduced visibility. The most likely period of any channel closure due to fog or heavy rain will be late Monday afternoon and into the overnight. Channel closures lasting a couple hours at a time are possible. Patchy dense fog could last into early Tuesday morning. Meteorologist: Cameron Self High risk (>70% chance) of dense fog.
