- 23 ducks, do you remember --
- 24 A. Oh.
- 25 Q. -- them talking about the weather?

- 1 A. Oh, I do. They said -- I remember that we were in line. And
- 2 | the guy said there's a lightning effect, or whatever it's called.
- 3 Q. Sun, yeah.
- 4 A. And they went, but they went ahead and let us go on the
- 5 boats.
- 6 Q. So you got on the boat?
- 7 A. Yes, sir.
- 8 Q. And do you remember, what do you remember getting on the
- 9 | boats? Do you remember talking about lifejackets or anything on
- 10 | the boat?
- 11 A. Yes. The, the captain was, see, like telling us how to put
- 12 | it on.
- 13 Q. But that was a demonstration, though, right?
- 14 A. Yes.
- 15 Q. Was that before you got in the water?
- 16 A. Yes, sir.
- 17 Q. And then the captain was doing the demonstration of life
- 18 | jackets. And then one guy drove out there, right?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- 20 Q. And then somebody else ended up driving into the water.
- 21 A. So --
- 22 Q. Do you remember that?
- 23 A. Yes, sir. And they also let kids drive the boat a little
- 24 bit.
- 25 Q. Yeah.

- 1 A. So it was my little stepbrother first, I think, was it --
- 2 | yeah, I think it was my little stepbrother, and then my little
- 3 step-cousin. Then they let the actual person drive the boat.
- 4 Q. So you go into -- you drive into the water. And where were
- 5 you sitting at on the boat?
- 6 A. More towards the back, I think.
- 7 Q. Were you on the right? If you're looking -- if you're in the
- 8 boat, and you're looking forward, are you on the right side or the
- 9 left side?
- 10 A. I was on the left side.
- 11 Q. You were on the left side. So it, when the boat started to
- 12 fill, it filled, it was on the other side from you. Is that
- 13 right?
- 14 A. Yes, sir.
- 15 Q. So you were on the left side. Who were you sitting beside?
- 16 A. I was sitting by my step-cousin,



- 18 A. Yes.
- 19 Q. And so, you remember going down the road, starting in the
- 20 | water and everything seemed normal at first. Is that right?
- 21 A. Yes. But I had a very bad feeling once it started raining
- 22 and stuff. And the rain was -- so they put down the windows so
- 23 | water wouldn't get in, the rain. And then waves started coming
- 24 and like getting, you know, really strong. And then waves started
- 25 coming in the boat. And like I had started crying, but my

- 1 stepsister said everything's going to be okay. Even though it
- 2 wasn't going to be okay.
- 3 Q. Right.
- 4 A. And so, the boat started sinking. And I remember there was a
- 5 boat like, it there was up here. It was like kind of --
- 6 Q. So you remember the boat kind of filling in the back to the
- 7 | right first?
- 8 A. Yes. Yes. And --
- 9 Q. Do you remember seeing the captain do anything?
- 10 A. No sign.
- 11 Q. Not really?
- 12 A. I really don't. But I was panicking myself. I do remember
- 13 seeing this little boy in a green shirt. You know, I wanted to
- 14 help him when I found him, but I couldn't.
- 15 Q. I'm sorry. Do you remember how you got out?
- 16 A. Yes. We didn't know that the -- so the boat, like, filled up
- 17 | all the way. And I didn't know if the top was off yet. But I
- 18 think like for a couple of seconds it wasn't up yet and the water
- 19 was filled completely up because my head was hitting the top of
- 20 the roof. But that couple of seconds felt like 10 minutes to me.
- 21 But I finally got to the top, which felt like it took forever,
- 22 | even though realistically it didn't. And then I got my head up
- 23 above and I saw my dad. And my dad was helping me, like, you
- 24 know, telling me you can do it.
- 25 Q. So you got to the top of the water?

- 1 A. Yes, sir.
- 2 Q. Did you have to kind of get out from underneath the roof a
- 3 little bit or something?
- 4 A. No, sir. I just had to keep -- I just literally just swam.
- 5 Q. Just swam, just swam up.
- 6 A. Yeah.
- 7 Q. Okay. And but you got pulled down in the water a little ways
- 8 | then; is that right?
- 9 A. Yes, sir. It was really scary.
- 10 Q. And then you made it to the top, and you see who?
- 11 A. I see my dad. But no one else. I honest, I wasn't looking
- 12 for anyone.
- 13 Q. How did you get out? I mean, how did you get -- to a boat or
- 14 did you go to the land?
- 15 A. Well, so, you know, the boat and then they have the
- 16 steamboat, I think it is.
- 17 Q. Yeah. Yeah.
- 18 A. Well, this guy -- so, I got there, and my hand was, I was
- 19 holding onto the rope and I was getting really weak. But they
- 20 were helping me and they were holding me. And they got my dad out
- 21 of the water, and then my dad was helping me. And I think it was
- 22 | this paramedic lady, but she -- because I couldn't move or
- 23 anything because I was really weak. And then this guy finally
- 24 said you'll need to move and get in something, because the waves
- 25 were getting really strong and stuff. So --

- 1 Q. So you got in on the boat, the big boat then; is that right?
- 2 A. Yes, sir.
- 3 Q. Did you go to the paddle wheel? Is that where you ended up?
- 4 Or did you go just off to the side, or --
- 5 A. The paddle.
- 6 Q. The big paddle thing that turned on the back? Some people
- 7 kind of went there. You don't remember -- you didn't go there?
- 8 A. I think it was like to, kind of towards that. You know what
- 9 looked like a boardwalk way?
- 10 Q. Yeah.
- 11 A. I was kind of where that was.
- 12 Q. Okay.
- 13 A. And I was holding onto this string. Like --
- 14 Q. The cable?
- 15 A. Yes, sir.
- 16 Q. Okay. All right. But you never put a life jacket on or
- 17 anything like that?
- 18 A. No, sir. It happened so fast.
- 19 Q. All right. And nobody said anything, captain never said
- 20 anything about get your life jackets on or --
- 21 A. Nope.
- 22 Q. -- anything like that?
- 23 A. Not that I recall. I never heard him say anything.
- 24 Q. All right.
- 25 A. He didn't even tell us the roof came up.

- 1 Q. All right. Well, I think that's all that I have. I don't
- 2 know that I have -- need to contact you anymore, but I'd like to
- 3 keep that option open then.
- 4 A. Yes, sir.
- 5 Q. Okay?
- 6 A. Okay.
- 7 Q. All right. I'm very sorry that this happened to you.
- 8 A. It's okay.
- 9 Q. Okay?
- 10 A. Thank you.
- 11 Q. All right. Well, thank you very much. Okay?
- 12 A. Thank you.
