As of 8 am ET, Sandy was about 15 miles east of Great Abaco Island in the Bahamas and heading to the northwest at about 10 miles per hour. The storm had maximum sustained winds of 80 miles per hour.

This is taken from the weather channel:

Peripheral impacts from Sandy are expected along the Southeast coast through Saturday even with the circulation center staying well off the coast.

The pressure gradient between Sandy and high pressure in the Northeast U.S. will lead to increasingly strong winds over the Florida Peninsula, spreading northward to the Outer Banks of North Carolina and Virginia Beach through at least Saturday. Winds of 20 to 30 mph with gusts to 50 mph along the immediate coast are possible.

Rip currents, high surf, and, eventually, some coastal flooding are possible in areas of the most persistent onshore flow. Bands of rain on the outer periphery of the circulation will occasionally wrap into the coast, as well.

I will keep trying to find more info through the day on the path and severity. You will probably get inundated with emails from me today keeping you updated. Please be safe!
