This My statement on the Flight of N3031U Cessna 172 180HP. On April 30, 2019. Willy Matson and I made a flight around 5:30 pm, to (2) practice areas, #1 north, 18 nm of Wasilla and went on to #2 practice area, 9 nm southeast of Wasilla, At the preflight I had asked, Willy how much fuel was onboard the aircraft. He had stated approximately 3 hours, at practice area #2, I became concern about how much fuel we had, based on the Right fuel gauge which was showing little movement on the needle

It was not on empty, more like a quarter tank indication I asked Willy about time in tanks and his fuel burn I decided to turn back direct to Wasilla, at about 5nm the aircraft ran out of fuel at 3000' msl.

We got to 2 nm from Wasilla airport at 1000' agl over Knik Goose Bay Rd I found an open area, 1/2 mile south an open lot with a small road. We landed on the road heading east, was unable to avoid a power pole that was on right of aircraft which the right wing caught, I put in max left brake and rudder, right tip of wing gave way and we came to stop just short of Fern Rd. We exited aircraft around 7pm. Unhurt.
