2	MR. NICHOLSON: Good afternoon. Today is Thursday, July
3	17th. My name is Matthew Nicholson. I am an investigator with
4	the National Transportation Safety Board in Washington, D.C. We
5	are at the

10	MR. NICHOLSON: Thank you.
11	For the interview of Denise Mabry. This is Case Number
12	DCA-14-MP-001. This interview is being recorded and may be
13	transcribed at a later date. A copy of the transcript will be
14	provided to the interviewee for review prior to being entered in
15	the public docket.
16	To start, I'd like to go around the room, have each
17	person state their name with spelling, and your title and agency
18	or organization you are representing. I will start and we'll
19	proceed to my right.
20	My name is Matthew Nicholson, M-a-t-t-h-e-w,
21	N-i-c-h-o-l-s-o-n. I am an investigator with the NTSB.
22	MR. CHHATRE: Ravi Chhatre. That's R-a-v-i,
23	C-h-h-a-t-r-e. I am pipeline accident investigator at National
24	Transportation and Safety Board.
25	MS. McATEE: Nancy McAtee, N-a-n-c-y, M-c-A-t-e-e. I'm

a fire and explosion specialist with the National Transportation
 Safety Board.

3 MR. ALLEN: I'm Mitch Allen. I'm one of the attorneys
4 representing Ms. Mabry here today.

16 MR. NICHOLSON: Thank you.

17 MS. WATSON: My name is Leila Watson. I'm one of the 18 lawyers for the Mabry family. My first name is L-e-i-l-a.

19 MR. NICHOLSON: Excellent. Thank you.

20 And Denise, could we get the spelling of your name, 21 please, on the record?

MS. MABRY: Mabry?

23 MR. NICHOLSON: Sure.

MS. MABRY: M-a-b-r-y.

Well, I think --18 Ο. -- you can go with. 19 -- this is where his bed was, over against the wall. Α. 20 Q. Okay. 21 Α. The wall. Every time you walk in there, you walk right 22 into the bed. 23 Okay. Ο. 24 Α. And I think that's the way it was. 25 Q. Okay. Terrific.

1 I hope that I've got it right. Α. 2 All right. Did you say -- you said he had an air-Q. 3 conditioning unit. And did you say you had a little space heater 4 in your room? 5 I had a little space heater. Α. 6 Ο. Okay. 7 My little space heater I use to sit it here at the foot Α. of the bed or on the (indiscernible). 8 9 Ο. Okay. Excellent. It would usually be there or I'll put it at the foot of 10 Α. the bed. 11 Right. Because I have a plug there and a plug here. 12 Q. Okay. Two plugs in the --13 And this plug didn't work. Something was wrong with Α. 14 this plug. I couldn't use that plug. I would have to use the 15 other one on doing things. 16 Was this the only plug in the whole apartment that Ο. 17 didn't work, do you know? 18 Α. That's the only one in my room that didn't work. 19 Okay. Q. I don't know about any of others. 20 Α. 21 Ο. The others worked. 22 Were there any wall switches that did not work in your 23 apartment? 24 Α. This one right here. 25 That's an -- was that an outlet or a wall switch? Q.

1 A. A wall swi

2 Q. Oh, a switch. Oh, okay.

3 A. Oh, an out -- a outlet. I'm sorry.

4 Q. Oh, okay. That's --

5 A. I'm sorry.

6 Q. -- that's an outlet.

7 A. My mistake, an outlet.

Q. Okay. Okay. Terrific. Okay, Denise. So those are
wonderful. So I'll take these. I'm going to put your name on
them, and we'll use these for the rest of our conversation.


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
