- 2 MR. CHHATRE: Good morning, everyone. Today is
- 3 Thursday, January 6th, 2011. We are currently in Burlingame,
- 4 California, at the San Francisco Airport Marriott. We are meeting
- 5 in regards to the investigation of pipeline rupture in San Bruno,
- 6 California that occurred on September 9, 2010. The NTSB accident
- 7 number for this investigation is DCA-10-MP-008.
- 8 My name is Ravindra Chhatre. I'm with National
- 9 Transportation Safety Board in Washington, D.C., and I am
- 10 Investigator-in-Charge of this accident.
- I would like to start by notifying everyone present in
- 12 this room that we are recording this interview for transcription
- 13 at a later date. All parties will have a chance to review the
- 14 transcripts when they are completed.
- 15 Also, I'd like to inform Mr. Robertson that you are
- 16 permitted to have one other person with you during the interview.
- 17 This person is of your choice, your supervisor, co-worker, family
- 18 member, or if you choose, no one at all. So for the record,

- 20 BY MR. GUNTHER:
- Q. Could I have your job title, please?
- 22 A. I'm the Program and Project Supervisor for Utility
- 23 Safety and Reliability Branch, Gas Safety Section.
- Q. And what are your duties?
- 25 A. My duties are pretty much I oversee all the staff

- 1 engineers, the senior engineers, couple of administrative staff.
- 2 I review all the audit reports. I sometimes go with staff on some
- 3 of their audits. I basically just review the work overall
- 4 general.
- 5 Q. Okay. With the latest corrective action order, did you
- 6 have a part in formulating that and the letter that was sent out?
- 7 A. No, I did not.
- 8 Q. Are you involved in the Integrity Management audits?
- 9 A. Not -- basically I reviewed the last Integrity
- 10 Management audit, but I was not involved.
- 11 Q. Okay. And I guess this was asked, but how often do you
- 12 do Integrity Management audits?
- 13 A. That's something we're looking at right now. We're
- 14 developing our policy on that, but I would like to see at least a
- 15 three-year and possibly even a two-year audit. And, of course, it
- 16 depends on the size of the pipeline operator.
- 17 Q. Are you looking to include the new threat into your
- 18 auditing system and what you're looking for?
- 19 A. I would imagine, yes, we would definitely look into
- 20 that, yes.
- MR. GUNTHER: And I'll go ahead and pass. City of San
- 22 Bruno.
- MR. CALDWELL: City of San Bruno, no questions at this
- 24 time.
- MR. DAUBIN: No questions.

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- 1 MR. FASSETT: Bob Fassett, no questions.
- MS. FABRY: No questions.
- 3 MR. SHORI: Sunil Shori, no questions.
- 4 MR. KATCHMAR: Peter Katchmar, U.S. DOT, no questions.
- 5 MR. GUNTHER: No questions.
- 6 MS. MAZZANTI: No questions.
- 7 MR. SPERRY: No questions.
- 8 MR. NICHOLSON: No questions at this time.
- 9 MR. CHHATRE: Ravindra Chhatre, NTSB.
- 10 BY MR. CHHATRE:
- 11 Q. For the record can you tell us how many staffing
- 12 engineers or senior engineers do you have that you have delegated
- 13 to pipeline gas -- natural gas pipelines?
- 14 A. It's changed a little bit over the last couple months,
- 15 and I believe right now we have eight dedicated engineers. We
- 16 have one senior engineer. We have one administrative staff.
- 17 However, we have two engineers on loan from our electric section,
- 18 as well, so --
- 19 Q. Do you oversee both electrical and natural gas or just
- 20 natural gas?
- 21 A. Currently I just oversee gas, but about six months ago I
- 22 did both.
- 23 Q. Now, is your staff dedicated as utility specialists,
- 24 meaning the same person would go and do THE audits for the same
- 25 utility or just kind of random?

- 1 A. I'm sorry, I didn't hear the first part of the question.
- Q. When it comes to utility audits, do you have a staff
- 3 dedicated for certain utility, meaning just -- anybody can go at
- 4 random go audit utility?
- 5 A. Based on the size of a state and the utilities involved,
- 6 basically Southern California does SoCal or Sempra and Northern
- 7 California does PG&E. However, Southwest Gas is both North and
- 8 South, so we both do the Southwest gas audits.
- 9 Q. All your staff located at headquarters in San Francisco
- 10 or --
- 11 A. No. We have an LA office and a Sacramento office, as
- 12 well.
- 13 O. And you supervise all three of them?
- 14 A. All three offices. Yes, I do.
- 15 Q. The audit reports any direct reactions. Do they refer
- 16 themselves or is there like a senior engineer does that?
- 17 A. The engineers will write up the audit reports and
- 18 basically suggest or recommend corrective actions. Mostly they
- 19 just basically cite the utility for their findings and then ask
- 20 for a corrective response from the utility.
- Q. In the past audits of PG&E, and let's just go back the
- 22 last ten years, do it every three years, the audits take place for
- 23 natural gas.
- 24 A. It depends on district or division.
- Q Okay. Do you recall any difficulties in PG&E's

- 1 recordkeeping or documentation keeping?
- 2 A. Okay. Now, I personally have not done a PG&E audit for
- 3 maybe over ten years, okay. Do you want me to go back that far?
- 4 Q. I was not really asking whether you had done any -- I
- 5 realize you wouldn't be doing any audits in your position.
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 O. The audit reports would eventually go through you for
- 8 review. Do you remember any record difficulties with PG&E audits?
- 9 A. Yes, on some of the current audits I have reviewed.
- 10 MR. CHHATRE: Other than that, I have no more questions.
- 11 Any follow-up questions?
- MS. FABRY: Klara Fabry.
- 13 BY MS. FABRY:
- 0. On the available engineers, you were just a qualifying
- 15 question -- you were assigning them to be responsible
- 16 consistently for certain section of the system or you are
- 17 selecting them based on how they are --
- 18 A. It's based on the geography of the state basically and
- 19 where a staff is located. I mean, it's very difficult for a staff
- 20 in LA to go do a PG&E audit up north, so it more has to do with
- 21 just the convenience of where staff is located.
- 22 Q. The same person will go back for the next audit for
- 23 that --
- A. In some cases, yes, that has happened, but we always
- 25 like to have a new engineer go along and learn the particulars of

- 1 that particular division or unit or whatever.
- Q. This is not a principle of how you are setting up your
- 3 office operation?
- 4 A. I'm not sure what you're asking. If you're asking that
- 5 the same staff goes back and does another audit --
- 6 Q. They are responsible for certain -- on an ongoing basis,
- 7 that they have higher knowledge about that part of the system than
- 8 other engineers on your staff. You are dividing responsibility
- 9 for certain geographical area and they are consistently going back
- 10 to audit the same system, or not?
- 11 A. Basically it's the same pipeline operator, okay. SoCal
- 12 staff, LA staff does Sempra and some Southwest Gas and Sempra
- 13 includes San Diego Gas and Electric and So Cal Gas. Northern Cal
- 14 staff basically focused on PG&E, okay. And it's not so much a
- 15 responsibility, because we move the staff around from one audit to
- 16 another. It's the geographical location.
- 17 BY MR. SHORI:
- 18 Q. Sunil Shori, PUC. I just had a real good clarification.
- 19 I think you're looking to see if one particular district or
- 20 territory or region is always the same individuals.
- MS. FABRY: Yes, with consistency.
- THE WITNESS: Well, that's why I said, it's the pipeline
- 23 operator that's mostly consistent but not so much the division or
- 24 the district.
- 25 BY MR. SHORI:

Τ	Q. Staff maintained for us I think there was a time
2	years and years ago for a very, very small operators, where we
3	would assign a geographical area to people, simply because there
4	was a lot of personnel interaction involved, but I don't think we
5	do that anymore.
6	A. Not to my knowledge, it hasn't been done.
7	MR. CHHATRE: Any other follow-up questions?
8	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No.
9	MR. CHHATRE: If not, thank you so much for coming.
10	THE WITNESS: Great.
11	MR. CHHATRE: I guess we talked to you much less than I
12	kept you waiting outside. Appreciate your time. Off the record
13	(Whereupon, the interview was concluded.)
