Biography of Joseph Giulietti

Joseph J. Giulietti became President of MTA Metro-North Railroad in February 2014. He returned to Metro-North after spending 15 years with the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority - serving first as its Deputy Executive Director and then as its Executive Director.

A 44-year railroad veteran, Giulietti joined the Penn Central Railroad as a brakeman and assistant conductor for New York passenger operations in 1971. He became a locomotive engineer in 1975. He took his first management position in 1977 as a road foreman then the instructor for the engineer's training program for Conrail. Throughout the mergers and bankruptcies of the northeast commuter railroads, he continued to dedicate himself to public transportation, holding every major operating position from Road Foreman to Assistant Manager of Operating Rules.

When Conrail became Metro-North in 1983, he became Superintendent for Transportation, and later became Engineer of Track for the Harlem and Hudson lines. Before leaving for SFRTA, Giulietti was tapped to be Metro-North's Director of Process Review. In this role, he successfully introduced and applied private sector business models to a public sector agency - leading to greater operational efficiencies and cost reductions.
