I witnessed the opening of the Integrated Avionics Computer, part no. 7017000, s/n 94090355, on January 13, 2000 at Honeywell. The opening was conducted by a technician and observed by Michael Landreth, Carl Carter, and Jim Sneed of Honeywell, Renato Lutz of the FAA, and Denev Sonderland of Cessna. The circuit cards were mechanically and thermally damaged. U39, the memory chip that could have contained data from the flight was severely damaged and no data was salvagable. Jim Sneed will send you a report with pictures. Sorry we could not help.
