1	PROCEEDINGS
2	MR. TURRELL: Good morning. It is November 3,
3	at seven o'clock in the morning. We are in the offices
4	of James McCanty. We are conducting interviews of the
5	owner and crew of the Dorothy J. And I will go around
6	the room. My name is Morgan Turrell, Group Chairman,
7	Operations, NTSB.
8	MR. CONCE: Charles Conce, Coast Guard
9	Investigations, New York.
10	MS. DEOS: Christine Deos, Coast Guard
11	Investigative Service.
12	MR. MCCANTY: And Jim McCanty, Dorothy
13	Julian's representative.
14	MS. JULIAN: Dorothy Julian
15	MR. TURRELL: And Dorothy, do you acknowledge
16	this is being recorded for accuracy?
17	MS. JULIAN: Yes, I do.
18	MR. TURRELL: Okay. Thank you.
19	Dorothy, would you please relate to us how
20	long you have owned the tug, Dorothy J.
21	MS. JULIAN: I purchased the tug, Dorothy J in
22	December of 1999.
23	MR. TURRELL: And can you please tell us some
24	details about the tug?
25	MS. JULIAN: She is twin crews, steel hull,

- model bound, she has got 16 C 92s, which is equivalent
- to 1400 horsepower. Pretty much shallow track, depth 10
- foot max, seven and a half lights.
- 4 MR. TURRELL: Okay. And what type of work does
- 5 the Dorothy J perform?
- 6 MS. JULIAN: Pretty much anything in the
- 7 harbor. On this particular day, I was shifting oil
- barges down at the ferry maintenance facility.
- 9 MR. TURRELL: Okay. And who was working on the
- 10 boat that day?
- 11 MS. JULIAN: Captain Mark Kramer was the
- 12 captain.
- MR. TURRELL: Okay.
- 14 MS. JULIAN: The mate was Robert Seckers. The
- engineer was Michael Druda.
- 16 MR. TURRELL: Could you please spell that?
- MS. JULIAN: D-R-U-D-A.
- MR. TURRELL: Okay.
- MS. JULIAN: And the deck hand was Paul
- secker.
- MR. TURRELL: And on October 15, where was the
- Dorothy J around 3:00 p.m?
- MS. JULIAN: We were in ferry maintenance
- facility slip, I believe the south side of the pier.
- MR. TURRELL: Okay. And what was the vessel

- during there at the time?
- MS. JULIAN: She was dead ship on standby
- 3 status.
- 4 MR. TURRELL: Okay. What type of
- 5 communications normally does that vessel maintain while
- she is in dead ship status?
- 7 MS. JULIAN: Are you --
- 8 MR. TURRELL: Of the vessel, what frequencies
- 9 monitor, cell phones?
- MS. JULIAN: We maintain watch constantly.
- 11 And my personal communications with the boat is via
- 12 Nextel.
- MR. TURRELL: Okay.
- MS. JULIAN: Or cell phone.
- MR. TURRELL: And VHF frequencies that they
- were monitoring that day?
- MS. JULIAN: Fifteen, 16.
- 18 MR. TURRELL: Okay. And routinely in a dead
- ship status, who, who on your crew would be standing by
- 20 normally, what is their location?
- MS. JULIAN: The mate, well, depending on the
- time of day, it was the mate's watch. So, the mate was
- on duty.
- 24 MR. TURRELL: And what shift, what type of
- shift rotation do they have?

MS. JULIAN: Captain's watch is 6 to 12. 1 MR. TURRELL: Okay. 2 MS. JULIAN: And, 12 to 6, mate. MR. TURRELL: Twelve to six. MS. JULIAN: Yes. MR. TURRELL: Okay. Dorothy, from your direct 6 knowledge, what happened that day from what the crew told you, you know? 8 MR. MCCANTY: Let me just, we discussed this before the interview and what Dorothy knows would be, 10 you know, relayed to her by the crew and --11 MR. TURRELL: Okay. Okay. We don't want that. 12 We just want --13 MR. MCCANTY: She wasn't on the boat that day, 14 15 so I think it would be unfair to ask her, you know, you have the eyewitnesses here, I think, it is time to move 16 onto them. 17 MR. TURRELL: Sure. 18 19 MR. MCCANTY: I prefer to do that. 20 MR. TURRELL: Sure. Is there anything you 21 would like to add? MS. JULIAN: No. 22 MR. TURRELL: Okay. Great. I will open the 23 questions to Chuck? 24
