

JOSE DOLLOSO-crew 145, safety 067, Hotel repairman-he is in plumbing maintenance, Cabin on Biscayne Deck, zone 8, B-1185, all the way aft. His safety duty is a firefighter, fire team No. 9.

He was asleep, then heard a bang, smelled fumes. He woke up and he knew something happened. He put on his coveralls, then heard the call for a stretcher team, then Code Bravo and he went to his emergency station, located in the control room, and got on his firefighting equipment. Then they waited for further instruction. Six people on his team, all stood by.

Then they were told to search the starboard side of the C deck, in Zone 5. All six of them went down to conduct the search. They were searching all fo the cabins. They found one guy (fatality) and took him out. They saw him and called the stretcher team right away. They did not see any other crew members.

After they completed the search the called the staff engineer and told him that they had found one guy. When they finished they asked again the staff engineer what ato do, and he told them to go to the meeting place after they completed the sesrach. At the meeting place they stayed there awaiting further orders.

He arrived at his fire station after the leader. He did not remember seeing the fatality. The chief engineer and staff engineer were in the control room when he got there. After he got dressed the staff chief told him to check the cabins. He is the team assistant leader.

He saw the MIA FD passing by on the Biscayne Deck, starboard side, while he was going aft. He saw them by the gangway.

He did not go into the boiler room or the engine room.

The fumes that he smelled were like diesel fumes, like a bunker. He did not see smoke. He saw the sprinklers on B deck leaking. There was a lot of water on deck. They brought hoses in the bags, while checking the bags.
