LIEUTENANT JAMES LANE

PRESENT:

ROB JONES, NTSB JACK CALDERONE, FDNY RICHARD GONZALEZ, USCG

1	PROCEEDINGS
2	MR. JONES: It is October 22. This is an
3	interview with James Lane. And if you could start,
4	please, just where you, how you are employed with the
5	fire department, what rank and everything.
6	LIEUTENANT LANE: Lieutenant, Ladder 114,
7	Brooklyn.
8	MR. JONES: I need you to speak up a little
9	bit or sit a little closer.
10	LIEUTENANT LANE: Okay. I am a quiet talker.
11	MR. JONES: Okay.
12	LIEUTENANT LANE: Employed for 17 1/2 years,
13	lieutenant for six, almost six. And that day I took
14	the three o'clock ferry. A friend of mine, a Major
15	Shanahan, I don't know if you want to contact him. He
16	is with the courts. We sat on the upper level, back
17	left from the accident.
18	MR. JONES: Upper level would be the next deck
19	up from the
20	LIEUTENANT LANE: The top level, we were on
21	the top level.
22	MR. JONES: All the way up top.
23	LIEUTENANT LANE: Yes.
24	MR. JONES: Okay.
25	LIEUTENANT LANE: In the back, towards the

back of the boat, back to mid. And we were, our seats 1 were facing Manhattan and heading to Staten Island, so 2 we were looking away from where the accident would be. 3 The trip was uneventful until we got closer to that point. And looking backwards, I would, you know, I 5 didn't have, I couldn't see exactly where we were 6 coming close to the dock, but I would look over and I 7 would see Brooklyn, because I worked over that way. 8 looked down a little bit more, and then I see the Verrazano Bridge, so I knew we were getting close and I 10 see people get up and walking towards the front. 11 was engrossed in conversation with a friend of mine, so 12 I really didn't see it, but I realized, we are getting 13 close, but he didn't reverse the engines, they do that. 14 15 I never heard that sound. I have taken the ferry, you 16 know, numerous times and that never happened. Right prior to impact, I heard a lot of 17 commotion up front, I guess it was the people gathering 18 19 up in the front to get off the boat. They, a group of them turned, I heard yelling, they turned and they were 20 running towards the back of the boat. And right, right 21 after that, I heard the first impact. But, it really 22 wasn't, it wasn't a violent impact. A couple of people 23 got shaken up, you know, thrown off balance, but nobody 24

went sprawling down on the ground. I didn't get pushed

- out of my seat. I was still sitting at the time. We didn't get up and go to the front.
- A lot of commotion after that. People still
- 4 running to the back of the boat, getting life
- 5 preservers. And we heard a loud, and a grinding noise,
- first the impact, grinding noise and then like a series
- of boom, boom, boom. And I couldn't figure out what it
- was, so a friend of mine, we got up, we looked over the
- 9 side, and that is chaos, people screaming and yelling.
- I looked over the side and saw a few pylons in the
- water on my side of the boat, the left side of the
- 12 boat, facing Staten Island.
- MR. JONES: Okay.
- 14 LIEUTENANT LANE: So I just assumed it was a
- pylon got hit with the prop or whatever. I went down,
- we took a look on the next level and people with life
- 17 preservers all over, gearing up, still nothing
- appreciable. So, we went down to the bottom level and
- that is when we saw what happened. And the boat was
- opened up maybe, from the front to mid point, maybe
- even two thirds of the way back. And the booms, I was
- just assuming were the columns being snapped. So, we
- took a look around, people, again, panic on that bottom
- level, what was left on there that didn't already go
- upstairs, was screaming. So I saw Rudd, who is a black

PD cop, she was trying to get people away from the 1 scene, away from that side of the boat. So, I went 2 over, identified myself as did my friend and to 3 somebody with a white shirt, ferry type, I really 5 couldn't tell you if it was the captain or whoever it was, I don't know who it was. 6 MR. JONES: Do you remember any stripes? 7 LIEUTENANT LANE: I don't. It was a white 8 shirt. It was a ferry type shirt. MR. JONES: Okay. 10 LIEUTENANT LANE: I identified myself to see I 11 12 could help and he was looking over towards the accident side of the boat. There was one, I didn't see up to 13 the front yet, because it was still a lot of concrete 14 15 dust. 16 MR. JONES: Let me interrupt one second. LIEUTENANT LANE: Go ahead. 17 MR. JONES: Have you seen pictures of both 18 19 captains in the papers right now? LIEUTENANT LANE: Yes, I did see pictures of 20 both of them, but I couldn't tell you if it was, it 21 definitely wasn't the younger guy. 22 MR. JONES: Okay. 23 LIEUTENANT LANE: Was it the other quy, I 24

really couldn't say.

1	MR. JONES: Okay. All right.
2	LIEUTENANT LANE: But, it wasn't Gansas,
3	whatever his name is.
4	MR. JONES: Yes.
5	LIEUTENANT LANE: Yeah, it wasn't him.
6	MR. JONES: Okay.
7	LIEUTENANT LANE: Took a look right next to
8	him, where he was kind of holding everybody back, where
9	this guy was, there was a body right there. And I was
10	going over the help and goes no, he is gone. He is
11	gone already. So, like I said, I couldn't see a face.
12	There was a lot of concrete dust and people back and
13	forth. So, I think it was right about that time, I
14	made the first call to our dispatcher, Staten Island
15	dispatcher. I told him there was accident to the side
16	of our boat, it was opened up. I said, you know, set
17	up the land units and maybe get a boat going, too, and
18	I don't know what else I said to him.
19	After that we passed that little barrier
20	where everybody was kind of staying still, and as we
21	went pass there, and there a black guy on the floor, we
22	kind of did an assessment on him. All the way I am
23	looking forward seeing more and more casualties. And I
24	was worried about the decks above, because I have no
25	idea what is holding them up at this point.

1	MR. JONES: Right.
2	LIEUTENANT LANE: I know there is two decks
3	above it.
4	So, we saw the first guy, it was a black
5	gentleman on the floor, he was banged up, but, he was
6	okay. After him, there was another guy, it looked a
7	construction worker, he was pretty banged up. There
8	were three more casualties that were definite DOAs
9	right, in that vicinity which is probably mid point.
10	Another guy we dug out, he was right along side the,
11	where the boat was opened up, but he wasn't too bad.
12	We kind of stabilized him. We kept going further and
13	further and just came across numerous injuries. There
14	was a gentleman there who had lost his legs. He was in
15	a state of shock. There was a woman with him. I
16	think it turned out to be that English.
17	MR. JONES: Right.
18	LIEUTENANT LANE: I didn't speak to them,
19	actually I think my friend spoke to her. I think she
20	identified herself as a nurse. So, we kind of left him
21	to her, because there wasn't much I could do for him.
22	When a little further, there was a woman
23	there who also had lost her legs. I think there was a
24	police officer with her. I think he might have been
25	even in uniform. He might have been working the ferry

- detail. We went up a little further, there was 1 another person we helped dig out. You know, there is 2 all dangled, did you see the scene? 3 MR. JONES: Yes. LIEUTENANT LANE: Dangle of chairs, we were pulling them off, but trying not to further damage any 6 people that are down there. 7 MR. JONES: Yes. 8 LIEUTENANT LANE: So, we dug out another, probably another two people, closer to the front of the 10 boat. And went a little further and there was another, 11 12 other guy that I couldn't get to. And I guess, actually when, the first black gentleman I saw, the 13 next quy, the construction worker, I think I made 14 15 another phone at that point, to ask for, you know, 16 advanced life support or advanced help. MR. JONES: Okay. 17 LIEUTENANT LANE: And after that we were just 18 19 back and forth, doing whatever we could, dug out, like 20 I said, maybe dug a total of three, four people, whatever. Some people obviously dead. There was one 21 guy that was not decapitated, but, his head was, you 22 know. 23 MR. JONES: Yeah.

LIEUTENANT LANE: Mushed around and another

guy lost his legs. He was kind of like split in the 1 middle and a lot of gruesome deaths. 2 MR. JONES: Yes. 3 LIEUTENANT LANE: Other than that, I mean, looking at the boat like I said, I was concerned, not only for myself, but for everybody working, I kept 6 looking at the decks, because there was, I don't know, 10 columns gone, or I don't what there was. 8 MR. JONES: Yes. LIEUTENANT LANE: Did you get a total on it, I 10 mean, do you know how many, just out of curiosity? 11 MR. JONES: I would say, I would say it is 12 around that number, eight to ten. 13 LIEUTENANT LANE: Yeah. Okav. 14 15 MR. JONES: I wasn't looking at that, but, 16 but, we have good pictures and it is amazing. LIEUTENANT LANE: Yeah. 17 MR. JONES: Now did you stay with the boat? 18 19 LIEUTENANT LANE: We stayed on the boat. 20 After the accident, all this while now, the boat is stopped after the accident, kind of hung out there for 21 a second, I really couldn't tell you how long, then we 22 started backing up. We spun around, I think we spun 23 around and then a tugboat came along side, and we asked

that guy, whoever the tugboat was, I couldn't tell you,

1	we asked that guy for any kind of medical kits or
2	whatever he had on the boat.
3	MR. JONES: You actually asked them.
4	LIEUTENANT LANE: They bumped the boat.
5	MR. JONES: Yeah.
6	LIEUTENANT LANE: Before, I guess they pushed
7	a little bit, but they came right nose to where the
8	MR. JONES: Yeah, they came
9	LIEUTENANT LANE: I could see the guy and I
10	was speaking to him.
11	MR. JONES: Right.
12	LIEUTENANT LANE: And they had nothing.
13	MR. JONES: Who was speaking to them?
14	LIEUTENANT LANE: I was speaking to them.
15	MR. JONES: You were speaking.
16	LIEUTENANT LANE: One of the deck hands.
17	MR. JONES: Okay.
18	LIEUTENANT LANE: They had nothing to give us
19	as far as medical stuff.
20	MR. JONES: Yes.
21	LIEUTENANT LANE: At that point we drifted, I
22	guess, I am guessing 20 minutes, I really couldn't tell
23	you. Somewhere, we backed up, we hung around, we
24	floated around. I didn't hear the motors go on, so I
25	don't know if they actually drove the boat or the tugs

1	pushed it in.
2	MR. JONES: Yeah.
3	LIEUTENANT LANE: I couldn't tell you.
4	At that point, you know, 20 minutes later,
5	whatever, they pushed it back into the slip. I didn't
6	see anybody get off, I was too busy. And that is when
7	the FD and the PD and the EMS came on the boat. And I
8	hung around for another 45 minutes to an hour, to give
9	a hand.
10	MR. JONES: So you were down on the lower
11	level the whole time?
12	LIEUTENANT LANE: The whole time, yeah.
13	MR. JONES: So, when you, when the other first
14	fire responded.
15	LIEUTENANT LANE: Right.
16	MR. JONES: Was anybody directing them?
17	LIEUTENANT LANE: I knew
18	MR. JONES: Like crew.
19	LIEUTENANT LANE: I knew the guys, I knew a
20	few guys coming in, you know Bobby Nola? I knew Bobby
21	and I saw Bobby coming on. I go, Bob, you have got a
22	few definite DOAs. You have got some people in rough
23	shape. You are going to need backboards. I said, I am
24	assuming you have the binds with the advanced
25	parameters. I said, you are going to need, you have

got amputees, you have got a few different things. 1 said, you are going to need the heist tool, torch. 2 MR. JONES: What is the heist tool? 3 LIEUTENANT LANE: The jaws of life. MR. JONES: The jaws of life. LIEUTENANT LANE: You are going that, you are 6 going to need a torch and you need, I said, bring the airvax. I told him and Richie Simms. I saw those two. 8 Then a bunch of firemen, but those guys were officers, so, I kind of gave them a heads up. 10 MR. JONES: At this point, after you said you 11 saw the first crew member, or what you perceived to be 12 was a crew member. 13 LIEUTENANT LANE: Right. 14 15 MR. JONES: Did they stick around that area 16 or --LIEUTENANT LANE: He was there for a few 17 minutes, and then I don't know, then I passed, I passed 18 19 that part with the first DOA was. 20 MR. JONES: Right. LIEUTENANT LANE: I passed him and then I 21 didn't look back, so I don't know. 22 MR. JONES: Okay. 23 LIEUTENANT LANE: I don't what he did. 24

didn't really, couldn't tell you if I noticed any crew

- members, although, no, I did see a few crew members on
- the bottom level, what they were doing, I don't know.
- But, there was some crew members there.
- 4 MR. JONES: Prior or during? Prior to the
- 5 accident or during?
- 6 LIEUTENANT LANE: Prior to the accident, I
- don't know, I was on the upper level.
- 8 MR. JONES: Yeah. Okay.
- 9 LIEUTENANT LANE: When I got down there, there
- was a couple.
- MR. JONES: Okay.
- 12 LIEUTENANT LANE: There was an off duty PD
- guy, he pulled his shield out. Like I said, the black
- 14 cop, the young white guy cop, on duty guys. And after
- that there wasn't a whole lot of people down there. A
- 16 couple of construction guys stayed and helped their
- 17 friends.
- 18 MR. JONES: Yes. So, for the 20 minutes that
- 19 you estimate that it took to get back to the dock,
- 20 besides yourself, and passengers or friends that were
- 21 helping the injured.
- LIEUTENANT LANE: Right.
- 23 MR. JONES: Any other crew members coming down
- there to, that you could --
- LIEUTENANT LANE: Like I said, once I passed

- that first guy with the white shirt, I did see a 1 couple, but I don't know what they were doing, because 2 I was just making, like making a survey and seeing what was going on, and myself and my friend, Major Shanahan, we kind of stuck together. MR. JONES: Okay. You said you saw the guys on 6 the tuq. LIEUTENANT LANE: Yes. 8 MR. JONES: Do you know how they got that line onboard, did any of you, guys, help them or --10 LIEUTENANT LANE: When I saw them, when I was 11 12 speaking to them, they didn't have a line. They just, they just nosed up to the side of the boat. 13 MR. JONES: And pushed. 14 15 LIEUTENANT LANE: And pushed a little bit, 16 really they bumped and I didn't realize what they were doing. I don't know if they were trying to push us or 17 they just bumped up, you know, very gently. 18
- MR. JONES: Yeah.
- LIEUTENANT LANE: And then I asked a question,
- they couldn't help me, so I went back to what I was
- doing.
- MR. JONES: Okay.
- 24 LIEUTENANT LANE: So I don't know if they were
- 25 the actual tug that pushed us in.

1	MR. JONES: Yes. I think so.
2	LIEUTENANT LANE: I don't know. I think it
3	was blue. I couldn't tell you.
4	MR. JONES: Okay. Okay. That is all I have
5	right now. Richard?
6	MR. GONZALEZ: Richard Gonzalez.
7	When you came down to the first deck, and
8	which side, which ladders did you come down?
9	LIEUTENANT LANE: I came down the Manhattan
10	side. The rear of the boat.
11	MR. GONZALEZ: The undamaged area.
12	LIEUTENANT LANE: Well, if this were the boat,
13	I was over here, that is Staten Island. I came down
14	these stairs, and it was damage. The front one were
15	creased.
16	MR. GONZALEZ: Where in relation to the vessel
17	did you see that crew member with the white shirt?
18	LIEUTENANT LANE: Like I said, I was here, I
19	came down these stairs, this is mid point, he was like
20	roughly here.
21	MR. GONZALEZ: Roughly mid point.
22	LIEUTENANT LANE: Between me and the first
23	casualty.
24	MR. GONZALEZ: And

LIEUTENANT LANE: Probably two thirds of the

way from the front of the boat. 1 MR. GONZALEZ: Okay. 2 LIEUTENANT LANE: I would estimate two thirds. MR. GONZALEZ: On the damaged side. LIEUTENANT LANE: On the damaged side, yes. MR. GONZALEZ: Okay. That is all. 6 MR. CALDERONE: Chief Calderone. Jim, one of the things we are trying to pinpoint is the location of 8 the deceased, those that were killed immediately. LIEUTENANT LANE: Okay. 10 MR. CALDERONE: We have a diagram showing six 11 This was the end of the tear and this guy was of them. 12 up against the wall. 13 LIEUTENANT LANE: Okay. Right. 14 That was the 15 first one that I had seen. 16 MR. CALDERONE: Okay. LIEUTENANT LANE: I came down here, there was 17 a black gentleman, like if this is mid point, roughly 18 19 the stairs, I quess were here, well, anyway, this is 20 the, I don't know what you call it, engineering room, whatever. 21 MR. CALDERONE: Right. 22 LIEUTENANT LANE: The first black gentleman 23 was here, but he didn't look like he was damaged, 24

looked at a picture, I mean, he looked he was going out

- of the picture. I looked at the, I didn't see him.

  But, here -- Actually and over here was a construction
- worker, and I don't know what happened to him. I think
- 4 he might have been the Frank Sullivan, because there
- was a friend of friend, that is the only reason I know
- 6 the name.
- 7 MR. CALDERONE: Okay.
- 8 LIEUTENANT LANE: But, the definite DOAs were
- this guy, and there were four here, and there was one
- up here.
- MR. CALDERONE: A male?
- 12 LIEUTENANT LANE: I believe so, yes.
- MR. CALDERONE: What kind of injuries do you
- 14 remember?
- 15 LIEUTENANT LANE: I couldn't see, because that
- is the one I couldn't get to. We started digging and
- it was just too much debris and that is what I told
- 18 Bobby, Bobby Nola and those guys, I think actually, was
- the Captain over there, Grasseanna(ph)?
- MR. CALDERONE: Grasseanna.
- 21 LIEUTENANT LANE: I think he was the one guy
- who started working over there with tools.
- MR. JONES: Would this help at all, doing it
- on here? Actually we can stop the interview just for a
- 25 second. We are going to do the drawing for the

- deceased.
- 2 (Off the record.)
- MR. JONES: Continuing the interview with Mr.
- 4 Lane.
- MR. CALDERONE: You were on the third level,
- on the same, on same level where the door to the pilot
- 7 house goes. Did you happen to see anybody come out of
- 8 that door?
- 9 LIEUTENANT LANE: I did not see, no. I was
- sitting, I could probably roughly say, these seats
- 11 right here.
- MR. CALDERONE: Okay. That is the only thing.
- 13 That is the only other question I had.
- 14 LIEUTENANT LANE: I didn't know, I couldn't
- even tell you where the door to the pilot house was. I
- wouldn't even, you know, have no way of knowing.
- MR. CALDERONE: Okay.
- MR. JONES: But, you did come down the main
- 19 stairwell.
- 20 LIEUTENANT LANE: I came down the rear stairs,
- the main stairs, second level clean, third level,
- bottom level is where all the damage was.
- MR. JONES: Did you hear, after the crash, any
- 24 announcements at all?
- LIEUTENANT LANE: There was some blurb, but I

- 1 couldn't decipher what it was saying.
- MR. JONES: You were down the lower level at
- 3 that time?
- 4 LIEUTENANT LANE: I couldn't actually say
- where I was, but I did hear something, it was
- 6 unintelligible and that was it. Just like a two, three
- second bing, and that was it. That is the only --
- 8 MR. JONES: Okay. Okay. Any more, Jack?
- 9 MR. CALDERONE: No. That is all I have.
- MR. JONES: All right, I am going to stop the
- 11 tape.
- 12 (Whereupon, the interview was concluded.)
