2			EXAMINATION
3			BY MR. WALSH:
4		Q	Would you state your full name, please?
5		A	Todd Jonathon Kerr K-e-r-r. Safety number
6	324,	crew	number 403.
7		Q	And your job on board?
8		A	Personnel manager.
9		Q	Personnel manager. What do you do as a
10	pers	onnel	manager?
11		A	I arrange transportation, tickets for the
12	crew	home	, transfers, leave/duty files.
13		Q	What kind of hours do you work typically?
14		A	Typically, 8:00 in the morning until noon and
15	prob	ably	4:00 until 8:00 in the evening, 8:00 until
16	9:00	in t	he evening.
17		Q	And your cabin number, Todd?
18		A	Biscayne 152.
19		Q	So you're on the port hand side?
20		A	Correct.
21		Q	Forward?
22		A	Mid to forward, yes.
23		Q	Mid to forward, okay. How long have you been
24	on b	oard	the Norway, Todd?
25		A	Now, including these two weeks, ten weeks.

1	Ó	Q	What is your typical contract?
2	j	A	Six months.
3	(	Q	Have you been on other ships before?
4	7	A	Yes.
5	(	Q	Which ships?
6	i	A	This contract?
7	(	Q	So you go on more than one ship in a
8	contra	act?	
9	i	A	Correct.
10	(	Q	Oh, okay. Yes, this contract.
11	i	A	This contract I started off on the Norwegian
12	Sun,	then	the Norwegian Dawn and lastly the Norway and
13	now I	'm dı	ue for a vacation.
14	(	Q	So how long do your normally spend on each
15	ship?		
16	Ž	A	This contract, two months, eight weeks.
17	(	Q	That's typical, eight weeks?
18	7	A	For me it is, yes.
19	(	Q	And your emergency position on the ship is?
20	1	A	I go to my office and stand by for
21	instr	uctio	ons.
22	(	Q	Where is your office?
23	i	A	Biscayne Deck.
24	(	Q	Is there a number on that?
25	Ĭ	A	No.

1	Q	Biscayne Deck mid ship, port side, starboard
2	side?	
3	А	Starboard side, forward of the sealed off
4	zone.	
5	Q	What were you doing on Saturday the 24th on
6	board?	
7	А	Preparing the immigration paperwork for the
8	crew that	signs off on the 25th, including myself.
9	Q	So you were preparing immigration paperwork.
10	That's a	normal part of what you do?
11	А	Yes.
12	Q	Do you prepare it for the passengers as well?
13	А	No.
14	Q	What time did you go to bed that night?
15	А	Probably around 11:30, midnight.
16	Q	When did you wake up the next morning?
17	А	My alarm went off at 5:45.
18	Q	Can you take us through your morning?
19	А	I was up from I hit the snooze once or
20	twice, so	I was up around 6:00. I started finishing my
21	packing s	ince I was to sign off that day. Had a
22	shower.	I had just gotten out of the shower when I
23	heard a ba	ang.
24		Then the power went out as I was finishing
25	dressing a	and I heard people running down the hallway

- and chatter on the radio. 1 2 Do you have a radio in your cabin? Not in my cabin, but I could hear the radios out in the hallway. So I knew something had happened 4 and I proceeded to go to my office. I was scheduled to 5 6 be in my office anyway by 6:30. 7 Q You mentioned the lights went off, the power 8 went out? Α The power went out. So the lights were off? Q 11 Α Correct. 12 Q Was it dark in your cabin? Yes, I'm an inside cabin. 13 Α 14 Did you have a flashlight in there? Q I did have a flashlight, but I had packed it 15 16 the evening before because I was getting ready to 17 leave. I always have a flashlight and know where it is, except for this morning, so I had to --18
- 19 Q So are you feeling your way around?
- 20 A Feeling the way around, yes.
- 21 Q Now you open your door and what is it like
- outside in the Biscayne passageway?
- 23 A Empty.
- Q Nobody there?
- 25 A I don't remember seeing anybody there. It

1	wasn't un	til I walked into the crew side of Biscayne.
2	Q	Was it dark?
3	А	There was emergency lighting on.
4	Q	Did you smell anything?
5	А	Not that I remember, no.
6	Q	Now you're walking aft?
7	А	No. Right across. My cabin is situated
8	here, com	e out my door, across the hall, there's two
9	doors her	e, I walk into Biscayne to the crew side.
10	Q	So you're on the Biscayne crew side, which is
11	the starb	oard side?
12	А	Starboard, yes.
13	Q	You're on the Biscayne crew starboard side,
14	now what	happens? Is it dark over there?
15	А	It is dark.
16	Q	Is it wet?
17	А	Yes.
18	Q	Is the wet on the floor, on the bulkhead, on
19	the ceili	ng?
20	А	Floor I noticed.
21	Q	The floor is wet.
22	А	Yes.
23	Q	What else do you notice?
24	А	I remember seeing the safety manager there

talking on the radio.

1	Q	Do you hear what he was saying?
2	A	No.
3	Q	Are there a lot of crew members around?
4	A	Not a lot, there were a few.
5	Q	Were any of them screaming?
6	A	No. Not that I remember.
7	Q	A lot of flashlights?
8	A	Flashlights, yes. Lots of flashlights.
9	Q	Can you smell anything at this point?
10	A	I don't remember smelling anything. I just
11	remember	it was warm, moist in there, because my
12	glasses s	steamed up as soon as I walked in there.
13	Q	So now what happens?
14	А	I walked past Dave, I kind of gave a look and
15	still did	not know what happened and I walked into my
16	office, v	which is where I needed to be anyway, whether
17	it was a	regular day or an emergency.
18	Q	And what do you do in your office?
19	А	That morning or regularly?
20	Q	That morning.
21	A	That morning I saw Monica, who was sitting
<b>22</b>	there, sh	ne's the pay master and also shares the office
23	with me.	She asked what had happened, I said I didn't
24	know. Sł	ne then informed me that the computers weren't
24	know. Sh	ne then informed me that the computers weren't

working, I said I know, the power is out in this area.

1		I grabbed we have two flashlights in our
2	office.	I then phoned up to the chief purser to let
3	her know	that Monica and I were in the office.
4	Q	Do you report to the chief purser?
5	А	Yes.
6	Q	And I take it she was there when you
7	reported'	?
8	А	Yes.
9	Q	And what did she tell you or he tell you?
10	А	She told me okay, that's good, to stand by.
11	Q	You stayed in your office?
12	А	I stayed in the office with Monica. I could
13	still hea	ar people in the hallway. Now at this point I
14	had turne	ed on my radio.
15	Q	So your radio is in your office all the time?
16	А	Yes.
17	Q	Do you normally take it to your cabin?
18	А	If I'm on duty I take it to my cabin, but in
19	the even:	ings no, I usually leave it to be charged.
20	Q	What channel do you keep your radio on?
21	А	I keep mine on channel six, the hotel
22	channel.	
23	Q	The hotel channel is six. Okay. So now what
24	do you he	ear on the radio?

25

A

Not much on channel six. Everything was on

1	channel five.
2	Q So you went to channel five?
3	A No. I flipped it for about half a second and
4	they would never call me on channel five, so I'm back
5	to six, because that's the hotel channel, that's how
6	the chief purser or hotel director would get in touch
7	with me.
8	Q Purser, hotel director. So on channel six
9	not much traffic?
10	A Not that I recall, no.
11	Q And you're waiting in your office?
12	A Waiting in the office. I went to the door,
13	just to stick my head out in the hallway to see what
14	was happening.
15	Q It's still dark out there?
16	A It's still dark. There are people clearing
17	whatever debris was in the hallway. Just clearing it
18	to the side. I saw one of the stretcher teams come by
19	and I just got out of the way and went back to my
20	office and closed our door and waited.
21	Q Was there anyone on the stretcher?

### **22** A Yes.

23 Q Male or female?

24 A I'm assuming male. I didn't get a good look 25 at this person, but all the injured were males.

1	Q	So you close the door, you're back in the
2	office.	
3	А	Close the door, back to our office. The
4	chief pur	ser called me back and told me to start
5	gathering	the crew passports, so the pay master and I
6	did that.	We collect all the money out of her safe and
7	all the c	rew passports.
8	Q	Where did you go with the money?
9	А	After we get those instructions, we're to
10	report to	the chief purser's office.
11	Q	And where is that?
12	А	That's up on International Deck.
13	Q	So you report up to International Deck. What
14	is the mo	ney in?
15	А	The money is in a canvas bag and then we have
16	large wat	ertight plastic bags that we put the passports
17	and the m	oney in.
18	Q	So you're up in International Deck. Are
19	lights on	up there?
20	А	No. Emergency lighting only, but
21	Internati	onal Deck is all windows, so
22	Q	Do you see passengers?
23	А	Yes.
24	Q	Anybody asking questions?
25	А	Not to me directly, but there was a lot of

ı	cnatter,	but they were at their muster stations.
2	Q	Now what does the chief purser want you to
3	do?	
4	А	We all just stand and wait for further
5	instructi	ons again.
6	Q	So you're waiting. What is the next
7	instructi	on you got?
8	А	At some point we were asked, I think this is
9	my Immig	ration, to bring out all the passports out pier
10	side.	
11	Q	When you say "all passports," that's crew and
12	passenger	rs?
13	А	Crew and passengers, right.
14	Q	So who does that?
15	А	There's a second purser.
16	Q	Do you know their name?
17	А	Her name is Orshi.
18	Q	Orshe?
19	А	O-r-s I'm not sure.
20	Q	So Orshi brings all the passports out?
21	А	My assistant at this time was also up in the
22	chief pur	ser's office, because the
23	Q	That's Monica?

she came up with me, but Donna assists in the morning

No, that's Donna. Monica is the pay master,

1	with the p	passenger immigration.
2	Q	Okay.
3	А	So we were all there. We carried the
4	passports	out.
5	Q	You did too?
6	A	Yes. I left the ship.
7	Q	How did you leave the ship?
8	A	Through the passenger gangway.
9	Q	Which one?
10	A	That's stair tower one.
11	Q	When you come down to stair tower one at
12	Norway De	ck, what do you see there?
13	A	There were crew members obviously in their
14	emergency	stations. But other than that
15	Q	Do you see luggage?
16	A	No.
17	Q	Do you see the zone leader there?
18	A	I'm not sure. I'm not sure who the zone
19	leader wo	uld be.
20	Q	Was there a security guard there?
21	A	There was security at the gangway, yes.
22	Q	Shore side or shipboard?
23	A	Both.
24	Q	And they were on the ship or on the shore
25	side?	

1	А	Both.
2	Q	When you walked out the gangway, what did
3	they say?	
4	А	I can't recall. I mentioned to our guys that
5	I had to t	take the passports out to Immigration, they
6	let us go	. They marked down our names.
7	Q	Were there four of you?
8	А	Myself, my assistant, Monica, one of the port
9	agents was	s with us at this time to help carry the bags
10	and the ca	asino manager, because he was in the chief
11	purser's	office as well.
12	Q	Todd, Donna, casino manager, who was the port
13	agent?	
14	А	That morning all of them were there, I can't
15	remember v	who helped carry the bags. It might have been
16	Felix or A	AC or JC. No, JC was away on vacation, so it
17	was RC or	Felix.
18	Q	You, Donna, casino manager, Felix or RC and
19	anyone els	se?
20	А	Not that I remember.
21	Q	I'm missing somebody. I'm missing the junior
22	purser, r	ight?
23	A	She wasn't out there with us at that time.
24	Q	So it was just you and Donna and the casino

25

manager?

1	A That I know of at that time, yes.
2	Q And where did you go?
3	A Down underneath here in the terminal at first
4	and we talked. All the Immigration and Customs
5	officers were there, so we had to talk with them before
6	they decided that we were going to go to Pier 10.
7	Q Why would you go to Pier 10?
8	A I'm not sure. Immigration decides that.
9	Q So you all are going to take your passports
10	down to Pier 10?
11	A Because they wanted to finish the non-U.S.
12	They were going to bring the passengers, they wanted to
13	finish the non-U.S.
14	Q Did the Immigration folks ask you what was
15	going on?
16	A No, they didn't ask me anything.
17	Q Did you hear any conversation between other
18	crew members and the Immigration folks?
19	A No.
20	Q Typical process, you come across, here's the
21	passports, take them down here?
22	A The Immigration officers were talking amongst
23	themselves.
24	Q Right.

I only had one that would talk to us or they

- 1 would talk to the agent, who relayed it to us.
- **2** Q So you all go down to Pier 10?
- **3** A Went down to Pier 10.
- 4 Q And then what happened?
- **5** A We left the passports there with my assistant
- 6 and Monica. At this point I'm not sure if the senior
- 1 auditor came.
- **8** Q So Monica is down there now?
- **9** A She's down there now. Guests had left the
- 10 ship at this point and they were being channeled
- 11 through Pier 10.
- 12 Q All guests, not just the foreign guests?
- A I assume it was all guests, yes.
- Q So you haven't been back on the ship yet?
- **15** A No.
- 16 Q So all guests are being off loaded.
- 17 Disembarked. Monica, Donna, the casino manager and you
- and one of the agents and they're all going down to
- 19 Pier 10. Are there any of your shore side people with
- 20 you now?
- 21 A Not with me directly, no.
- 22 Q Do you see them in the area?
- 23 A People that are normally at the pier on a
- 24 debarkation day, yes.
- 25 Q Who do you see there? And what time is it,

1	approximately?
	approximatery:

- 2 A I can't remember who I saw. I just remember
- 3 seeing the jackets, the pier personnel that wear the
- 4 blue jackets. I don't know them by name because I
- 5 don't work on the pier.
- **6** Q So blue jackets. Can you give me an
- approximate count of how many blue jackets you see?
- **8** A I couldn't.
- **9** Q So blue jackets, now the passengers are all
- 10 coming off. How do they get their passports?
- 1 A I don't know. I didn't stay for that. The
- 12 guests were asking us lots of questions, we were not
- answering them, just how to get to wherever they were
- 14 setting up the passports.
- 15 Q So it was Immigration and you're sending them
- 16 to Immigration and saying go talk to Immigration and
- 17 get your passport. Were there any of the blue shirts
- 18 helping?
- 19 A They were trying to keep people in line and
- 20 directing them.
- 21 Q They were directing them this way?
- **22** A Yeah, but nothing to do with Immigration or
- 23 the passports. We went behind another wall and we were
- 24 separated momentarily.
- 25 Q Okay. Now do you go back on board the ship?

1	A No, not at that point. I went back to the
2	terminal to talk to the agent.
3	Q When did you go back on board?
4	A After the passengers had gone off I went back
5	on board.
6	Q How come you went back on board?
7	A I went back on to go to the chief purser's
8	office, because that is my station. I did not if we
9	had to go to a full crew muster I did not want to be
10	off the ship, because then they would be looking for
11	me, so I had to report back. We waited, the passengers
12	were off, we did a crew muster and we went to our life
13	boat stations.
14	Q And then from there?
15	A We waited a long time.
16	Q Do you remember any other crew members going
17	ashore while you were at your muster station?
18	A Not that I'm aware of.
19	MR. WALSH: Okay. I don't have any other
20	questions. Thanks a lot, Todd. Johannas?
21	MR. KERSON: No questions.
22	MR. WALSH: Juan?
23	EXAMINATION
24	BY MR. TORRES:
25	Q When you were at the muster station Juan

1	Torres, U.S. Coast Guard. When you were at the muster
2	station, did you hear any announcements going on?
3	A There were announcements being made from the
4	bridge, yes.
5	Q Can you recall what type of announcements
6	were being made?
7	A Off the top of my head, no, I can't recall.
8	I just remember there being the standard announcements
9	to remain calm, everything was being handled.
10	Q Do you recall who was making the
11	announcements?
12	A The cruise director.
13	Q Were these announcements made forwards the
14	crew members or passengers?
15	A In the beginning the passengers, when they
16	were on, but then I left the ship, so I don't know how
17	many were made after that. Then when the crew was on,
18	it was the crew just to remain at their muster station.
19	MR. TORRES: That's all I have.
20	MR. WALSH: Thanks, Todd. That concludes the
21	interview with the personnel manager aboard the SS
22	Norway.
