2		EXAMINATION
3		BY MR. WALSH:
4	Q	Viveka, would you please give us your full
5	name and	spell it for us, please?
6	A	My name is Viveka d'Souza. It's V-i-v-e-k-a
7	d, apost	rophe S-o-u-z-a.
8	Q	And your crew number is, Viveka?
9	A	Four zero one.
10	Q	Safety number?
11	А	Three six zero.
12	Q	And your cabin?
13	А	Cabin number?
14	Q	Please.
15	А	Norway 1004.
16	Q	And you've been on board the Norway now how
17	long?	
18	А	Since January 26.
19	Q	Of 2003?
20	А	Right.
21	Q	And your job on board, Viveka?
22	А	Senior auditor.
23	Q	What do you do as senior auditor?
24	А	Responsible for all cash payments for
25	passenger	s and crew, cash, credit card, any kind of

1	bill.
2	Q And your normal working hours, the hours you
3	work every day?
4	A Generally from 8:00 to 12:00, 4:00 to 8:00.
5	Q And on a turn around day in Miami?
6	A I work from 10:00 p.m. Saturday night until
7	around probably 10:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
8	MR. UNKNOWN: I'm sorry, I didn't hear you.
9	You work from 10:00 p.m. on a Saturday night all the
10	way through 10:00 a.m. Sunday?
11	THE WITNESS: We have a break for coffee,
12	like in the night, and then in between when we finish
13	work we rest some time for an hour, two hours.
14	BY MR. WALSH:
15	Q As the senior auditor, are you doing
16	reconciliation for all the numbers from 10:00 p.m. to
17	10:00 a.m.? Reconciliation for all the cash, credit,
18	et cetera?
19	A (No response.)
20	Q As senior auditor, you're doing the numbers?
21	A Yes.
22	Q And reconciling the books?
23	A Can you rephrase that?
24	Q What exactly are you doing from 10:00 p.m
25	A We close the cruise, bring bills for all

1	passenger	s so that they can have their statements								
2	before th	e morning and tell them what we are charging								
3	to their	accounts. Those paying in cash come to the								
4	desk in the morning and pay it in cash.									
5	Q When do the passengers typically leave the									
6	ship on Sunday morning?									
7	A	Somewhere around 9:30.								
8	Q Do you carry a radio with you?									
9	A No.									
10	Q	What is your emergency assignment on board?								
11	А	I have to get all valuables that I have, like								
12	the cash	that I have and take it over to the chief								
13	purser.									
14	Q	And then what do you do?								
15	A	Then I stay there until we get further								
16	instructi	ons.								
17	Q	And your abandon ship station is where?								
18	A	That's at the sports bar.								
19	Q	The sports bar is on what deck?								
20	A	The same, International Deck.								
21	Q	Have you ever been on any other ship than the								
22	Norway?									
23	A	Yes.								
24	Q	What other ships?

1	Q	And you started with Norwegian Cruise Lines							
2	when?								
3	А	July of 2001, 23rd July.							
4	Q	What is the emergency signal?							
5	А	A Seven short and one long.							
6	Q	And the abandon ship signal?							
7	А	It's one long.							
8	Q	Do you know what a Code Alpha is?							
9	А	Yes. Medical.							
10	Q	Code Bravo?							
11	А	Fire.							
12	Q	Do you recall hearing any of those							
13	announcements or signals when you were in the chief								
14	purser's	office on Sunday morning?							
15	А	Yes.							
16	Q	Did you hear anything else, any other							
17	announcem	ents or pages over the public address system?							
18	A	Like what other?							
19	Q	Did you hear announcements to the crew?							
20	А	There were announcements.							
21	Q	Could you tell us about those announcements?							
22	А	They were codes, like they called Bravo, they							
23	called ou	t Alpha and the captain spoke, the cruise							
24	director	spoke, telling us about the situation, what							
<b>25</b>	was exact	ly happening and when the fire was put out and							

- 1 they were constantly updating us.
- A I wasn't worried or panicked, because we were
- 4 in Miami already.
- **5** Q But you were under the impression there was a
- **6** fire?
- 7 A They announced it, so it was confirmed.
- 8 Q I was just asking the question. Do you
- **9** recall hearing the cruise director tell the passengers
- 10 to leave their muster stations to go down to their
- 11 cabins?
- 12 A I don't recall.
- 13 O Do you recall hearing the captain?
- 14 A I am not sure. I don't think that was
- announced, but I don't know if I was aware, listening
- 16 to all the announcements, because I was doing a lot of
- 17 stuff too.
- 18 Q What were you doing?
- 19 A Kind of like I had to get the money out and
- after that, we went down to get the passports out.
- 21 O You went down where?
- **22** A To Biscayne Deck to get the passports, to get
- the passports with the personnel manager.
- Q And what do you do with the passports?
- 25 A Bring them up to the chief purser's office

- 1 and then after that we took them off.
- 2 O You took them off?
- **3** A All of us, yes. Not me alone.
- 4 Q You took them off and where did you go with
- 5 them?
- **6** A We went to the pier right outside the ship.
- 7 You went to the pier right outside the ship.
- **8** How did you leave the ship?
- § A The gangway. I don't know which gangway it
- **10** was.
- 11 Q Was it a passenger gangway or a crew gangway?
- 12 A I'm not too sure, but I think it was -- it
- was not a crew gangway, it was a passenger gangway.
- 14 Q So you left the passenger gangway and then
- where did you go?
- 16 A We took them right out to the pier and from
- 17 there, we -- I think it was Terminal we had to take it
- 18 to, from where the passengers are disembarking so that
- 19 they can get it there.
- 20 Q Who from the office did you see at Terminal
- 21 10?
- 22 A I don't know.
- 23 Q Did you see anyone from the office on board
- 24 the ship?
- 25 A Which office? Miami office?

1	Q	Miami office.
2	А	I don't recognize people from Miami office,
3	so I don'	t know if they were there or not.
4	Q	Were you there when the passengers started
5	coming of	ff?
6	А	Yes.
7	Q	And what were the passengers doing?
8	А	They were waiting for instructions.
9	Q	Who was giving them instructions?
10	А	The people shore side who were there at the
11	terminal.	
12	Q	Immigration?
13	А	Immigration.
14	Q	Did you hear what those instructions were?
15	А	No. I left from there then and I came back
16	to the sh	nip.
17		MR. WALSH: No further questions.
18		MR. KERSON: No questions.
19		MR. WALSH: Juan?
20		EXAMINATION
21		BY MR. TORRES:
22	Q	I just wanted to find out when did you first
23	hear w	hat was the location?
24	А	I was in my office.
25	Q	You were in your office when you first heard

1	or felt -	_
2	A	Yes.
3	Q	What did you do?
4	A	I heard a blast. I was in my office.
5	Q	And then when you were in your office and you
6	heard the	blast, what did you do next?
7	A	I did not do anything. I just waited for
8	announceme	ents.
9	Q	What was the first announcement that you
10	heard?	
11	A	I don't remember. But the lights went off.
12	Q	What time more or less was it when you felt
13	the blast	?
14	А	I think it was around 6:30, quarter to 7:00,
15	some time	there.
16	Q	Who was with you at the time when
17	A	Nobody.
18	Q	There was nobody with you. When did you
19	first hear	r the signal, the emergency signal?
20	А	(No response.)
21	Q	Can you recall the time?
22	А	No. I didn't look at the time after that.
23		MR. TORRES: That's all I have.
24		MR. WALSH: Thank you very much, Viveka. That
25	concludes	the interview with the senior auditor on
