INVESTIGATION INTO THE ACCIDENTAL DEATHS OF RICK BLANCO, [REDACTED], AND SANDRA BRONNENBERG, [REDACTED], WHICH OCCURRED ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2011, AT APPROXIMATELY 10:20 A.M., AT RICHARDS FIELD, LOCATED AT 22101 SW 202 AVENUE, MIAMI, FLORIDA 33177.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

On Saturday, October 29, 2011, at approximately 11:07 a.m., while at the Homicide Bureau, this detective was contacted by OFFICER DENNIS EVANS, Badge #4016, of the Miami-Dade Police Department Cutler Ridge District, who made notification of the death of the victims, identified as RICK BLANCO and SANDRA BRONNENBERG. OFFICER EVANS advised the victims were involved in a plane crash, which occurred at Richards Field, located at 22101 SW 202 Avenue and were deceased as a result of their injuries.

This detective then responded to 22101 SW 202 Avenue, to initiate an investigation into the death of the victims.

At 12:16 p.m., this detective arrived on scene and met with OFFICER EVANS, who provided additional information as follows:

OFFICER EVANS indicated he arrived at the location of occurrence at 10:24 a.m., after being dispatched there in reference to a plane crash. OFFICER EVANS advised upon his arrival, he observed MS. BRONNENBERG lying on the ground, just south of the aircraft, where bystanders were performing CPR on her. OFFICER EVANS indicated that two additional bystanders were removing MR. BLANCO from the left seat of the aircraft, where he observed the victim sitting. OFFICER EVANS stated the bystanders on scene began performing CPR on MR. BLANCO.

OFFICER EVANS advised he then attached his automated external defibrillator (AED) to MR. BLANCO and MS. BRONNENBERG and continued life-saving efforts with the aid of the bystanders until the arrival of Tanker #60, commanded by LIEUTENANT CHERYL, who took over medical attention on both victims. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue continued to perform life-saving efforts on both victims, to no avail.

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OFFICER EVANS stated that according to Miami-Dade Fire Rescue at 10:35 a.m., MR. BLANCO showed no vital signs and at 10:37 a.m., MRS. BRONNENBERG showed no vital signs at any time.

OFFICER EVANS advised there were witnesses on scene who had observed the plane crash, who were identified as MAXIMINO REYES, RAFAEL LIMA, and CELSO PIZANO. OFFICER EVANS was unable to provide any further information concerning this investigation. For further details, refer to OFFICER EVANS' Offense-Incident Report, which was prepared by him.

This detective requested Miami-Dade Police Department Homicide Bureau DETECTIVE JESSICA ALVAREZ to interview MAXIMINO REYES and THOMAS BURTON. For further details refer to DETECTIVE ALVAREZ'S supplementary report.

At 1:06 p.m., this detective interviewed CELSO PIZANO, W/L/M/54, DOB: [REDACTED], [REDACTED], Miami, Florida 33193, [REDACTED]. MR. PIZANO advised he is currently a student pilot and has been for approximately one and-a-half years. MR. PIZANO indicated that he knew MRS. BRONNENBERG for approximately two years and MR. BLANCO for approximately one year.

MR. PIZANO advised he was an acquaintance of MRS. BRONNENBERG and met her at the airplane club Light Aircraft Flyers Association (Lafa), which he has been part of since May of 2009. MR. PIZANO indicated that MR. BLANCO was also part of the Lafa. MR. PIZANO indicated he purchased his first airplane from MRS. BRONNENBERG in May of 2009. MR. PIZANO stated he never flew with either of the victims. MR. PIZANO advised he never saw either of the victims fly together in the past. MR. PIZANO stated he believes that Mr. BLANCO was a commercial pilot or that he was one in the past.

MR. PIZANO advised on Saturday, October 29, 2011, he arrived at Richards Field, located at 22101 SW 202 Avenue, at approximately 8:00 a.m. in order to attend a pig roast, which was taking place inside the airplane hangar for the Lafa organization. MR. PIZANO indicated upon his arrival, he observed MRS. BRONNENBERG inside the hangar at Richards Filed. MR. PIZANO stated he immediately left Richards Field and responded to his father's residence, which is in the area, in order to use the bathroom. MR. PIZANO indicated he arrived back at Richards Field at approximately 9:00 a.m. and

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upon his return, he observed both victims outside, just north of the hangar, near the runway area. MR. PIZANO stated both victims were talking to two individuals and it appeared to him that the two victims were showing them the aircraft, which eventually was involved in the crash.

MR. PIZANO advised he believed MR. BLANCO owned the aircraft that was involved in the plane crash. MR. PIZANO stated for the past two weeks, he observed both victims working on the airplane, inside the hangar at Richards Field. MR. PIZANO further stated that RICH BRAGASSA and an airplane mechanic from Sea RV Aviation, possibly by the name of JOSE FERERRA, also worked on the aircraft inside the hangar.

MR. PIZANO advised at approximately 10:00 a.m., he was standing outside of the hangar at Richards Field with ARTURO REYES, where he was showing MR. REYES his airplane, which was located northwest of the hangar. MR. PIZANO stated he heard an aircraft flying above him and when he looked up into the sky above the Richards Field airstrip, he observed an aircraft, which he identified as the aircraft that the victim's were previously working on. MR. PIZANO indicated that the aircraft was performing stall maneuvers at approximately 1,500 to 2,000 feet.

Shortly thereafter, MR. PIZANO advised that he and MR. REYES began to walk back towards the hangar, at which time he noticed a shadow emerge from over his shoulder coming from the southwest direction. MR. PIZANO stated he looked back towards the southwest direction and noticed that an aircraft was falling straight down. MR. PIZANO advised he watched the aircraft spiral towards the ground, in a corkscrew-type motion until it crashed into the ground, southwest of the hangar.

MR. PIZANO advised he did not see anybody enter into the aircraft, nor did he see the aircraft take off from the air field prior to the plane crash. MR. PIZANO stated he only saw the aircraft flying in the sky.

MR. PIZANO advised that he and MR. REYES were the first to arrive at the scene where the plane crash occurred. MR. PIZANO further advised that MR. REYES arrived moments before him, because he contacted the Miami-Dade Police Department Emergency Operator (911) via his cellular telephone, which according to MR. PIZANO'S call log was conducted at 10:22 a.m.

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Upon his arrival, MR. PIZANO indicated he observed both victims slumped over inside of the aircraft, which was a 2004 Interplane SRO Skyboy, registration #N58784, Serial #082/2004, fixed wing, single engine type aircraft, with one reciprocating engine and two seats. MR. PIZANO stated both victims were wearing their seatbelts and that MR. BLANCO was seated on the left side of the plane (pilot seat), and MRS. BRONNENBERG was seated on the right side of the plane (co-pilot seat).

MR. PIZANO advised both victims were removed from the aircraft after their seatbelts were cut off and placed on the ground, just outside the aircraft, at which time bystanders began to perform CPR on the victims until the arrival of police and fire rescue personnel. MR. PIZANO stated that upon the arrival of police and fire rescue personnel, they took over life-saving efforts on both victims.

MR. PIZANO indicated he has seen MRS. BRONNENBERG fly a weight shift aircraft at Homestead General Airport in the past. MR. PIZANO stated he was not aware how long either victim was part of the LAFA. MR. PIZANO stated that MRS. BRONNENBERG'S husband is a flight instructor, but did not specify what type of instructor he is. MR. PIZANO further advised he was not aware if MS. BRONNENBERG was a flight instructor or not. MR. PIZANO stated he has seen MR. BLANCO fly the aircraft, which was involved in the crash approximately two or three times in the past. MR. PIZANO indicated it was unknown if the flight was an instructional training between the two victims.

MR. PIZANO advised he did not see either of the victims drinking alcohol that morning. MR. PIZANO stated he was not sure if the engine of the plane was on during the time of the crash, nor did he know if the area of the airstrip where the aircraft was being flown was a designated area to perform stall maneuvers. MR. PIZANO stated he did not know these answers because he was only a student pilot.

MR. PIZANO was unable to provide any further information concerning this investigation.

JOSE OBREGON, Aviation Accident Investigator, from the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB), and EDWARD CARDENAS, Aviation Safety Inspector, from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), responded to the scene and initiated the aviation accident portion of the investigation. For further details, refer to both MR. OBRGEON'S and MR. CARDENAS' reports.

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This detective then requested Miami-Dade Police Department Homicide Bureau DETECTIVE MICHAEL SCOTT, Badge #4829, to conduct the scene and body portion of this investigation. Prior to conducting the scene and body portion, DETECTIVE SCOTT interviewed RAPHAEL LIMA, [REDACTED] and JOE GUDMUNDSSON, [REDACTED]. For further details, refer to DETECTIVE SCOTT'S supplemental report.

At 2:52 p.m., this detective, along with NTSB Accident Investigator JOSE OBREGON and FAA Aviation Safety Inspector EDWARD CARDENAS, interviewed LOUIS RICHARD BRAGASSA, [REDACTED] Miami, Florida 33186, home telephone number [REDACTED], and cellular telephone number [REDACTED].

MR. BRAGASSA stated he has been part of Light Aircraft Flyers Association for the past 15 years, where he performed the duties as LAFA president in 2010, and safety officer in 2011. MR. BRAGASSA indicated that Richards Field is a non-controlled airport.

MR. BRAGASSA advised that MR. BLANCO was a friend of his who he knew for approximately six to seven years and met him through LAFA. MR. BRAGASSA advised he knew MRS. BRONNENBERG for approximately 10 to 15 years and had also met her through LAFA.

MR. BRAGASSA advised that both victims have flown together in the past. MR. BRAGASSA also advised he has seen the two flying together in the 2004 Interplane SRO Skyboy, which was the aircraft that crashed. MR. BRAGASSA stated MR. BLANCO has flown in MRS. BRONNENBERG'S weight controlled aircraft, which he referred to as a Trike. MR. BRAGASSA further indicated MR. BLANCO has flown with MRS. BRONNENBERG'S husband, DICK BRONNENBERG, who is also a pilot.

MR. BRAGASSA advised for the last two weeks, both victims were working on the 2004 Interplane SRO Skyboy inside the hangar at Richards Field. MR. BRAGASSA indicated MR. BLANCO was an airplane mechanic, but MRS. BRONNENBERG was not. He further indicated that MR. BLANCO was previously employed as a worldwide maintenance director of the Air Division for UPS and Air Chile, but is currently retired from the airline industry.

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MR. BRAGASSA advised on October 29, 2011, he observed MR. BLANCO rigging the aircraft in the airplane hanger and after doing so, MR. BLANCO conducted two to three touch-and-go landings as well as orbiting the surrounding area, making sure that all components were working properly on the aircraft, which he performed by himself. MR. BRAGASSA further advised that while MR. BLANCO was flying the aircraft MRS. BRONNENBERG manned the radio frequency from the ground. MR. BRAGASSA stated when MR. BLANCO was satisfied with the performance of the aircraft; MRS. BRONNENBERG accompanied MR. BLANCO inside the aircraft. MR. BRAGASSA indicated MRS. BRONNENBERG informed him that she was going to fly with MR. BLANCO inside the aircraft, but she did not specify what time that they were going to take off.

MR. BRAGASSA advised he did not witness the victims' take off in the aircraft. MR. BRAGASSA indicated that he believes the victims were flying in the air for approximately 30 minutes and observed the aircraft orbiting the surrounding area at approximately 2,000 to 3,000 feet, where they maintained the aircraft above the flight pattern, which is at approximately 1,000 feet.

MR. BRAGASSA stated that while he was inside the hangar, he heard a loud thump come from outside, at which time he observed other individuals who were present around the hangar start to run in the direction of where the aircraft crashed. MR. BRAGASSA advised when he looked outside in the direction of where the crash occurred he believed the aircraft had made an emergency landing. MR. BRAGASSA indicated he responded to where the plane crashed and observed both victims unresponsive inside the aircraft with their seatbelts on. MR. BRAGASSA advised that MR. BLANCO'S seatbelt had to be cut off him, while MRS. BRONNENBERG'S came off by releasing the seatbelt. Both victims were removed from the aircraft, and CPR was performed by bystanders on scene until the arrival of police and fire rescue personnel.

MR. BRAGASSA advised the aircraft the victims were flying in can either be flown by the pilot or the co-pilot because the plane has dual throttles, and the yoke, which is located between both seats controls the maneuvering of the aircraft. MR. BRAGASSA stated he was informed by the other bystanders that the motor of the plane was on during its impact.

MR. BRAGASSA advised the 2004 Interplane SRO Skyboy, registration #N58784, Serial #082/2004, fixed-wing, single-engine, experimental-type aircraft was registered to him. MR. BRAGASSA further

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advised that approximately six months ago, he was approached by MR. BLANCO, who asked if he would register the aforementioned plane in his name because his 18-wheeler tire business in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, which he owned with his wife, KARLA BLANCO, was experiencing financial difficulties and was going under. MR. BRAGASSA also explained that MR. BLANCO did not want to lose his aircraft because it was already paid for, and he was afraid he would lose it due to the financial difficulties he was experiencing with his tire company. MR. BRAGASSA stated he considered MR. BLANCO a friend and agreed to put the registration as the owner of the aircraft under his name.

MR. BRAGASSA advised MR. BLANCO purchased the plane approximately six to seven years ago and it was fully paid for. MR. BRAGASSA indicated he had no association with the aircraft, except for his name being on the registration paperwork as the registered owner. He further indicated that MR. BLANCO maintained the aircraft and the aircraft's maintenance records. MR. BRAGASSA was unable to provide any further information concerning this investigation.

At 4:18 p.m., this detective, accompanied by DETECTIVE ALVAREZ, interviewed the victim's wife, KARLA BLANCO, [REDACTED] cellular telephone number [REDACTED]

MRS. BLANCO advised that she and MR. BLANCO were married for 32 years and had two adult children in common. MRS. BLANCO stated the victim did not drink alcohol, did not smoke cigarettes, and did not take illicit drugs. MRS. BLANCO further stated the victim suffered from high blood pressure, which he took prescribed medication for. MRS. BLANCO indicated the victim recently underwent a physical, which he routinely performed once a year, in order to fly small aircrafts. MRS. BLANCO further indicated the victim was cleared by his doctor to fly after attending his physical.

MRS. BLANCO advised the victim flew his entire adult life and began his career approximately 34 years ago in 1976, when he flew fire bombing planes in Wyoming, which are planes that assist in controlling forest fires. MRS. BLANCO stated the victim had a commercial pilot's license. MRS. BLANCO indicated that during the victim's career, he was a mechanic and then became a supervisor on the maintenance side of the airplane industry. She further indicated the victim was a divisional manager of maintenance for the United Parcel Service (UPS). MRS. BLANCO advised the victim then became the

vice president of engineering and maintenance for the airline company Lan Chile and Florida West, prior to leaving the airplane industry approximately four years ago.

MRS. BLANCO advised approximately four years ago, after leaving the airplane industry, she and the victim opened Central Tire in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, which is a tire retail store. MRS. BLANCO indicated that within the last year, the business began to experience financial difficulties.

MRS. BLANCO advised the victim flew at the airstrip located at Richards Field for approximately 10 years on a weekly basis, where he was part of the LAFA. MRS. BLANCO stated she is not a member of the LAFA. MRS. BLANCO advised she was informed by a friend that an event was being held on behalf of the LAFA on Saturday, October 29, 2011. MRS. BLANCO indicated she never met MRS. BRONNENBERG or her husband before.

MRS. BLANCO advised that MR. BLANCO purchased the Skyboy aircraft approximately 10 years ago and that she flew with him on many occasions. MRS. BLANCO advised she never flew in the Skyboy aircraft with any other individual, besides her husband. MRS. BLANCO advised that other pilot friends of her husbands' flew in the Skyboy aircraft many times with her husband. MRS. BLANCO advised her husband was a very reserved and cautious pilot when it came to flying. MRS. BLANCO stated the Skyboy aircraft was a very stable plane and never experienced any problems or complications that she was aware of.

MRS. BLANCO advised the Skyboy aircraft was paid off. MRS. BLANCO also stated that her husband sold the aircraft to RICH BRAGASSA within the last year; however she was unaware of what agreements her husband made with MR. BRAGASSA.

MRS. BLANCO was unable to provide any further information concerning this investigation.

At approximately 8:09 p.m., this detective, accompanied by DETECTIVE ALVAREZ, responded to [REDACTED], where contact was made with MRS. BRONNENBERG'S husband, DICK BRONNENBERG, [REDACTED] Margate, Florida 33063, [REDACTED] MR. BRONNENBERG advised he and MRS. BRONNENBERG were married for 15 years and had no children in common. MR. BRONNENBERG

advised he had an adult daughter from a previous marriage. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated MRS. BRONNENBERG had no known medical conditions, was a social drinker of alcohol, smoked cigarettes, but did not indulge in illicit drugs.

MR. BRONNENBERG advised that MRS. BRONNENBERG flew a Trike aircraft, which is a weight-shift control aircraft, and is not a fixed-wing airplane. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated MRS. BRONNENBERG had been flying Trikes for approximately six years and flew a fixed-wing airplane in the past under the guidance of an instructor. MR. BRONNENBERG stated MRS. BRONNENBERG previously owned a fixed-wing aircraft, but sold it because she never got her license and preferred to fly Trikes. MR. BRONNENBERG advised that MRS. BRONNENBERG flew aircrafts for approximately 10 years. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated that he and MRS. BRONNENBERG had been part of LAFA for approximately eight years. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated MRS. BRONNENBERG was the secretary of the club at one time and he was the president twice in the past.

MR. BRONNENBERG indicated that on October 29, 2011, the LAFA was holding a barbecue for their members and friends, where new members could join at the hanger at Richards Field. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated he and MRS. BRONNENBERG were friends of MR. BLANCO'S and knew each other as acquaintances for approximately ten years and were good friends for the past two years.

MR. BRONNENBERG indicated his wife flew with MR. BLANCO on a regular basis, approximately once or twice every couple of weeks. MR. BRONNENBERG also indicated that MR. BLANCO flew with MRS. BRONNENBERG in her Trike in the past.

MR. BRONNENBERG indicated for the last two to three weeks, both MR. BLANCO and MRS. BRONNENBERG worked on the Skyboy aircraft, conducting routine maintenance. MR. BRONNENBERG also indicated that MR. BLANCO removed the wings completely off the Skyboy and added vortex generators to the top of the wings, which changes the air flow to the flight pattern of the aircraft.

MR. BRONNENBERG indicated that PETER VOLUM, who is also part of LAFA, advised him that MR. BLANCO flew the Skyboy aircraft for one pattern by himself prior to MRS. BRONNENBERG flying with

MR. BLANCO. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated one flight pattern takes approximately ten to fifteen minutes per pattern to complete.

MR. BRONNENBERG advised at approximately 9:30 a.m., he left Richards Field in order to pick up the barbecue food for the LAFA party. MR. BRONNENBERG further advised at approximately 10:15 a.m., he returned back to Richards Field, where he delivered the party's food to the aircraft's hangar. MR. BRONNENBERG stated upon his arrival back to the hangar he did not see MRS. BRONNENBERG. MR. BRONNENBERG advised he assumed she was flying with MR. BLANCO in the Skyboy aircraft, because both were absent from the hangar.

MR. BRONNENBERG advised moments later, while inside the hanger he heard a loud bang; however, he stated he paid no attention to the noise until he heard someone mention that a plane had just crashed. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated he looked outside the hangar and observed a crashed plane just west of the hangar, at which time he ran to where the crashed aircraft was located. MR. BRONNENBERG advised upon his arrival at the aircraft, he observed MR. BLANCO seated on the left side of the aircraft and MRS. BRONNENBERG seated on the right side of the aircraft. MR. BRONNENBERG advised the left side seat of the aircraft is commanded by the pilot and the right side seat is designated for the passenger. MR. BRONNENBERG stated that both victims were wearing their seatbelts.

MR. BRONNENBERG advised he cut the seatbelt off of MRS. BRONNENBERG and pulled her out of the plane, at which time PAUL DAVIS, who works at a local hospital, and an unknown female, who is a nurse, performed CPR on the victim. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated that other bystanders pulled MR. BLANCO out of the plane. MR. BRONNENBERG stated he left the scene prior to the arrival of this detective because he was in the Vietnam War and his father recently passed away and he was tired of seeing people die.

MR. BRONNENBERG advised he was unaware if MR. BLANCO did any other flying in the plane on October 29, 2011. MR. BRONNENBERG indicated the plane has been grounded and not able to fly for the past two to three weeks. MR. BRONNENBERG stated he never observed the plane in the air; however, he advised he heard from other individuals at Richards Field that MR. BLANCO was performing stall maneuvers. MR. plane to assist in the stall maneuvers or the landing of the aircraft. MR. BRONNENBERG advised that stall maneuvers are a common practice at Richards Field and are also a common training practice.

MR. BRONNENBERG was unable to provide any further information concerning this investigation.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

On Saturday, October 29, 2011, at approximately 11:10 a.m., this investigator was contacted by Miami-Dade Police Department Homicide Bureau DETECTIVE CHRISTOPHER VILLANO, regarding a plane crash, at Richards Field, located at 22101 SW 202 Avenue. DETECTIVE VILLANO advised that there were two victims deceased on the scene and requested that this investigator respond to the scene and assist him in the investigation.

At 12:15 p.m., this investigator arrived on the scene and made contact with Homicide Bureau SERGEANT MICHAEL BRACCI, who requested this investigator contact the Miami-Dade County Medical Examiner Department and request a Medical Examiner respond to the scene.

At 12:21 p.m., this investigator contacted the Miami-Dade County Medical Examiner Department and made contact with INVESTIGATOR CINDY LARSON. INVESTIGATOR LARSON advised that Medical Examiner DR. ERICA CURRY was responding to the scene.

Next, DETECTIVE VILLANO requested this investigator interview a witness that observed the plane crash.

Subsequently, this investigator made contact with MAXIMINO REYES, [REDACTED], of [REDACTED] Miami, Florida 33177, cellular phone number [REDACTED] MR. REYES advised that he has been flying since 1982 and flying ultra light aircrafts since 1996. He explained that he has been a member of Light Aircraft Flyers Association for about one month. He stated that on the day of the accident, he arrived at Richards Field at around 10:00 a.m., and was talking to his friend, who was at the hanger for an annual pilot's luncheon.

MR. REYES related that while he was speaking to his friend, he was showing him the work he was going to complete on another friend's Cessna when he observed the aircraft in the air. He reported that the aircraft did one short stall, then right after did a second stall that was not recovered. He advised that the aircraft began to spiral around 350 feet and struck the ground. He recounted that when the aircraft struck the ground; he ran over to the aircraft and discovered the pilots clearly deceased. He continued stating that stalls are practiced in case of an emergency situation. Lastly, he did not know the pilots and could not provide any further information regarding the investigation.

Next, DETECTIVE VILLANO requested this investigator interview another witness that observed the plane crash.

At 1:16 p.m., this investigator made contact with THOMAS A. BURTON, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Miami, Florida 33176, cellular phone number [REDACTED], home phone number [REDACTED]. MR. BURTON advised that he retired from United Airlines in 2004, after 40 years of being a pilot. He advised that he was cycling with his friend, identified as MADELAINE VOLUM from Deering Estates to Richards Field. He explained that MADELAINE'S husband, identified as PETER, has an ultra light aircraft inside of the hangar at Richards Field.

MR. BURTON explained that they arrived at the hangar and were outside talking. He stated that he heard the engine of an aircraft and looked up. He reported that he observed the aircraft flying in a south, southwest direction at an estimated 100 feet. He explained that as the aircraft was flying north, northeast at a straight level, it suddenly spiraled out of control, at a steep angle back in a south, southwest direction.

MR. BURTON recounted that the aircraft's wing and nose dropped, it spun once or twice, and could not tell if the engine was on or not. He further related that he could not tell if the aircraft was practicing any maneuvers. Lastly, he advised that once the aircraft struck the ground, he notified emergency services. MR. BURTON could not provide any further information regarding the investigation.

INVESTIGATION INTO THE ACCIDENTAL DEATH OF RICK BLANCO, [REDACTED], AND SANDRA BRONNENBERG, [REDACTED], WHICH OCCURRED ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 29, 2011, AT APPROXIMATELY 10:20 A.M., AT RICHARDSON FIELD, LOCATED AT 22101 SW 202 AVENUE, MIAMI, FLORIDA 33177.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY:

On Saturday, October 29, 2011, at approximately 11:07 a.m., this detective was notified by DETECTIVE C. VILLANO, ID #5394, of the Miami-Dade Police Department, Homicide Bureau, that a plane had crashed in a field located at 22101 SW 202 Avenue. Continuing, DETECTIVE VILLANO advised that the victims, identified as RICK BLANO and SANDRA BRONNENBERG, were seated inside the aircraft when it crashed. He disclosed that the victims were pronounced deceased on the scene.

This detective was requested to respond to the scene and assist DETECTIVE VILLANO, who had been designated as the lead detective in regards to this investigation.

At approximately 12:15 p.m., this detective arrived at the scene and made contact with SERGEANT M. BRACCI, ID #1500, of the Miami-Dade Police Department, Homicide Bureau. This detective was subsequently requested to interview a witness, RAFAEL LIMA.

At approximately 12:50 p.m., this detective made contact with RAFAEL LIMA, [REDACTED] Miami, Florida 33173, [REDACTED].

Upon interviewing MR. LIMA, he advised this detective that he is a member of the Light Aircraft Flyers Associations, which is a flying club based out of Homestead General Airport. Continuing, he indicated that this club has approximately 14 to 15 members. He went on to relate that one of the victims, RICK BLANCO, was a member of this club as well. Additionally, MR. BLANCO was an acquaintance of MR. LIMA.

In regards to the incident, MR. LIMA mentioned that he spoke to MR. BLANCO prior to him taking off in the aircraft. He informed this detective that MR. BLANCO advised him that the plane was "flying fine,"

and that he was going up for a pleasure flight, not training. This detective learned that MR. BLANCO took off in the aircraft with MS. BRONNENBERG. According to MR. LIMA, approximately five minutes after takeoff, the plane, which was at an attitude of approximately 1,000 feet began to spin to its left making two revolutions. Initially, MR. LIMA thought that MR. BLANCO was conducting a maneuver; however, during the second revolution, it appeared as though MR. BLANCO did not have control of the plane. He also indicated that the aircraft was intact while it was spinning. MR. LIMA ran into the club's hanger and informed the other members that the victim was in trouble. While inside the hanger, MR. LIMA heard the aircraft crash. MR. LIMA explained that he then entered his black Nissan Frontier and began to drive towards the crash site. Upon arrival, he observed the victims being attended to by civilians. While on the scene, MR. LIMA observed fuel coming out of the aircraft, at which time he turned the plane's engines off. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue responded to the scene and subsequently pronounced the victims deceased.

When asked about information in regards to the aircraft, he mentioned that it is considered a "Light Sport" and is registered with the FAA. He also explained that the aircraft is required to have an annual inspection and a certificate of air worthiness, which should be visible in a clear packet located somewhere inside the aircraft.

MR. LIMA concluded the interview by indicating that the club utilizes a private field which does not have a tower. He related that this type of field is referred to as an "unmanned" field. Additionally, he stated that members were required to pay a fee to be in the "Light Aircraft Flyers Association".

During the interview of MR. LIMA, he reported that MR. BLANCO appeared to be in good health and had no complaints.

No further information was provided by this witness.

At approximately 1:20 p.m., this detective interviewed JOHN GUDMUNDSSON, [REDACTED], Miami, Florida 33157, [REDACTED]

MR. GUDMUNDSSON advised this detective that he was riding his bicycle from Palmetto Bay to the hanger located on the incident. After arrival, MR. GUDMUNDSSON was sitting in the rear of the

hanger when he observed a yellow aircraft flying level. MR. GUDMUNDSSON explained that the aircraft nose began to dip slightly before spinning to the left approximately one or two times. Shortly after, MR. GUDMUNDSSON heard a crash and began running towards the crash site.

In addition to the above information, MR. GUDMUNDSSON advised that upon arriving at the crash site, the pilot and passenger were being tended to by other individuals. He went on to relate that he could not see who was inside the aircraft and did not know either victim. MR. GUDMUNDSSON then responded back to the hanger.

Lastly, MR. GUDMUNDSSON mentioned that the plane looked intact when spinning and he was not present when the plane took off from the airfield.

No further information was provided by this witness.

At approximately 2 p.m., this detective was requested by DETECTIVE VILLANO to conduct the Scene and Body portion of the investigation.

At 5:15 p.m., volunteers began to disassemble the aircraft in the field. The parts were placed on a trailer which was moved into the hanger located on the scene and secured for further investigation by the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

SCENE:

The scene is confined to 22101 SW 202 Avenue, an avocado field that is adjacent to a private airstrip, Richards Airfield, which is located in an agricultural area. A paved asphalt roadway is located on the south end of the area. A wrecked, yellow 2004 Interplane "Sky Boy" fixed wind single engine aircraft with "N587864" written on the tail is located between two avocado trees north of the roadway. The aircraft is in an upright position with the engine and propeller atop. One of the five propellers is ripped. A Portable Collision Avoidance System, Serial Number 34324, and an unknown damaged gauge are on the grass south of the aircraft. Aircraft debris is observed throughout the grassy area. A cellular telephone with a yellow rubber cover is observed under the right front passenger seat. A pair of orange "Harley Davidson" sunglasses are on the grass southwest to the right front passenger seat. A key
