- 4.1.2 If deemed necessary, request an assist tug if one is not already present.
- 4.1.3 Consult Operations for direction.
- **4.2** Kirby chartered vessels will not transit in zero visibility conditions those bridges designated by Kirby as narrow span bridges. (See Kirby Charter Handbook)
- 4.3 When approaching and transiting the bridge, the minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage way and adequate control of the barge is recommended.

5.0 BRIDGE TRANSITS PROCEDURE

- 5.1 The wheelhouse person on watch will assess his own human performance factors:
 - 5.1.1 Physiological and physical state
 - 5.1.2 Mental stressors
 - 5.1.3 Health and well-being
 - 5.1.4 Morale
- 5.2 If any of the aforementioned human performance factors will interfere with the bridge transit, call the Duty Port Captain immediately.
- 5.3 The wheelhouse person on watch will gather necessary information and properly plan for the bridge transit. Some factors to consider are:
 - 5.3.1 Adequate, reliable and timely information
 - 5.3.2 Tow configuration
 - 5.3.3 Weather conditions and considerations
 - 5.3.4 Waterway conditions and considerations
 - 5.3.5 Other vessel traffic in the area
- 5.4 Under no circumstances will the wheelhouse person on watch responsible for the transit make the bridge due to:
 - 5.4.1 Management pressure
 - 5.4.2 Pride
- 5.5 The wheelhouse person on watch for the transit will be:
 - 5.5.1 Current on applicable licenses required
 - 5.5.2 Proficient with the Rules of the Road
 - 5.5.3 Familiar with the route.
