Dear Sir/Madam:

We are navigating on old boats with out of date equipment, depending on our own senses and intuition, based on years of experience. We utilize dated hydrographic research of tide and current changes in Upper New York Bay. Docking car ferries, which are 37 years old and undependable with more than when three thousand people aboard, relying

only on knowledge of current and tide in any weather condition, takes a lot of gray matter from your brain. You must concentrate every second and have intuition working for you all the time often navigating in dense fog and storm weather. These are the world's biggest inland ferries: 3 ferry boats "J.F. Kennedy class ---- 3,500 passengers, 2 ferry boats "Newhouse" class ---- 6,000 passengers. We have tremendous responsibilities for thousands of passengers on every half hour trip of our eight to twelve hours duty. Our head must be clean of all thoughts about financial situations but this is impossible. Our flat salary is \$55,000. Our NET 2 weeks pay check is \$1,300 - \$1,400. This is \$300.00 more than a deckhands check, close to a McDonald's manager wage. Sandy Hook Pilots salaries go to \$300,000. Fort Lauderdale Pilots salaries go to \$300,000. Captains on airliners making to \$200,000 carry only 150-300 passengers and are not doing ten-sixteen landings for 8 hours, with thousands of passengers every half hour, as we are. We do not have the variable supplement to our pension. NYPD with 40,000 employees has it, as do Correction Department of NY, and Fire Department of NY. Staten Island Ferry division has only 450 employees, including 21 captains.

We have tremendous risk, super responsibility for thousands of people for every minute of our duty, over pressure, what doubles now.

Dear NTSB we need:

- 1. Normal Wages.
- 2. Early Retirement.
- 3. Variable supplement to our pension.
