This firm represents Emery Worldwide Airlines ("EWA"). By letter dated December 1, 1999 (the "Letter"), the San Jose Flight Standards District Office ("San Jose FSDO") advised EWA that the San Jose FSDO had decided to amend EWA's operations specifications. We have attached a copy of that Letter.

Pursuant to the provisions in Federal Aviation Regulations § 119.51(d), EWA hereby petitions for reconsideration of the decision reached by the San Jose FSDO in the Letter.

EWA takes very seriously the concerns expressed by the San Jose FSDO in the Letter and looks forward to working with you and your staff to provide you with any relevant information you may require about the substantive issues as you consider this petition. To begin the process of providing you with this information, EWA proposes to discuss via telephone with you or your staff what information you will require. If necessary, we would also be happy to meet with you at an appropriate time. Following these discussions, EWA would then be able to provide written material to you addressing any concerns expressed by you or your staff.

Additionally, we want to point out that since the time the Letter was issued by the San Jose FSDO, the FAA transferred EWA's certificate from the San Jose FSDO to the Cincinnati FSDO, effective December 17, 1999. EWA intends to work closely with the receiving FSDO during the pendency of your review to reach a
