Narrative:

The following is a synopsis of the information provided by Mr. Johnson to the NTSB IIC, via an email message.

- Clint traveled to the location where the N1905A wreckage was stored. The wreckage was kept in a secure facility in Wasilla, Alaska.
- The internal cargo (hunting gear, camping gear, and personal gear) from the airplane weighed about 125 pounds.
- A 5-gallon fuel tank that ruptured on impact was found. If full of 100LL fuel, this would be about 30 pounds.
- Various firearms were removed from the wreckage onsite by the Alaska State Troopers, including a shotgun (about 6 pounds total), two hunting rifles (about 14 pounds total), and a pistol (about 3 pounds total).
- The total weight of all items would be about 178 pounds.
