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MR. WIEMEYER: On the record.
Okay. Would you, first of all, give us your first
name and spelling on your last name.
MR. PEREZ: Franklin.
MR. WIEMEYER: The first name is Franklin?
MR. PEREZ: Right.
MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. And your middle initial?
MR. PEREZ: D, D as in David.
MR. WIEMEYER: And your last name?
MR. PEREZ: Perez. P as in Peter, e-r-e-z.
MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. And what's your local address,
mailing address?
MR. PEREZ: It's 47-48 39th Place, in Sunnyside.
MR. WIEMEYER: And the Zip code?
MR. PEREZ: It's 11104.
MR. WIEMEYER: And local phone number?
MR. PEREZ: It's 718 area code, 937-1049.
MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. And you're an employee of TWA?
MR. PEREZ: Yes.
MR. WIEMEYER: How long have you been with TWA?
MR. PEREZ: Since '79, March 5th, '79.
MR. WIEMEYER: And what is your position?
MR. PEREZ: I'm an AMP mechanic, hangar line.
MR. WIEMEYER: Okay, what certificates and licenses

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1 do you hold? ALP I have an (AMP), air frame and power plane. 2 MR. PEREZ: 20P 3 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. What was your exposure to 4 Flight 800? 5 MR. PEREZ: Well, all I did was, I taped the lavatory 6 service panel in the back with speed tape, that's all I did. And there was a fact that they guy told us the bags -- there -7 was some -- of bags or something, and I told the guy. Yeah, he 8 9 said, put them on. That's it. 10 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay, what was the need to speed-tape the lav service door? 11 MR. PEREZ: Oh, the latch is -- one latch was not --12 13 was not staying on secure, so. 14 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. So it wouldn't stay closed, in 15 other words? 16 MR. PEREZ: Right, wouldn't stay closed, it wouldn't 17 say. MR. WIEMEYER: What would've been -- been required to 18 make a -- a permanent repair on that? 19 20 MR. PEREZ: Oh, you would've had to replace the Because that came up towards the end of the -- they had 21 latch. just serviced, and it was almost ready to go, so they had to 22 23 write a -- make a write-up. And what we did was, we did a temporary repair, which is to put a -- speed tape around the 24 door, the access door. 25

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MR. WIEMEYER: How long were you around the aircraft? 1 MR. PEREZ: 2 y ten, twenty minutes. 3 MR. WIEMEYER: Do you remember whether it was early 4 or late in the cycle? MR. PEREZ: It was late, because I was working the 5 6 next flight coming out. MR. WIEMEYER: Okay, where is this lav service door ⁻ 7 located? 8 9 MR. PEREZ: It's rear of the bulk of the bulk cargo, roughly around that same area on the bottom of the aircraft. 10 11 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. You mentioned something about 12 some bags. Would you expand on that a little? 13 MR. PEREZ: There was some bags that they wanted to put back on, because -- so they said that they had a bag pull 14 15 or something, and he said put it on. So the guy told me to 16 tell them to put it on, and he put it on. 17 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. Did you assist him with putting those on? 18 MR. PEREZ: Yeah, I gave him a hand. 19 MR. WIEMEYER: Do you recall -- and that went back in 20 21 the bulk cargo? MR. PEREZ: No, that was in the forward cargo. 22 MR. WIEMEYER: In the forward cargo. And do you 23 24 recall anything with regards to temperature of the cargo holds or anything like that, as far as your exposure to this? 25

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1 MR. PEREZ: No, it was pretty -- pretty cool; wasn't -- was a normal day, summer day. 2 3 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. 4 MR. PEREZ: Eighty. 5 MR. WIEMEYER: While you were out there on the airplane, did you notice if the fuelers were there on the 6 7 airplane working the airplane, or not? 8 MR. PEREZ: No, I didn't notice that at all. 9 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. 10 MR. PEREZ: Don't recall. MR. WIEMEYER: And so, you primarily were down on the 11 right-hand side of the airplane? I'm trying to picture this 12 correctly. 13 MR. PEREZ: It's -- if you look at the aircraft, it's 14 closer to the tail end of it, but it's -- it's aft of the bulk 15 16 cargo, is where they service the lavs. So I was told by my lead at the time, I wasn't even working that flight, too. 17 18 Because the other guys were busy with other stuff, so they told me go -- why don't you go put some speed tape on --19 20 block it up. 21 MR. WIEMEYER: Did you have any conversations with any of the other maintenance people that worked on the airplane 22 23 about anything that --24 MR. PEREZ: Perez. MR. WIEMEYER: -- you can recall specifically? 25

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MR. PEREZ: No. Because I wasn't part of that group 1 2 that was doing the work on it. MR. WIEMEYER: Okay, I don't have anything, Terry. 3 MR. STACEY: Terry Stacey with TWA, I'm a 747 pilot. 4 5 So you weren't in the aft cargo at all, or the --6 MR. PEREZ: No. 7 MR. STACEY: -- cargo area, just in the forward 8 cargo? 9 MR. PEREZ: Just the forward cargo. 10 MR. STACEY: Nothing else. MS. LIEBER: I'm Lu Lieber with the FBI, and I have 11 12 -- don't have any questions. 13 MR. KLAPACH: Steve Klapach from the FAA. I don't have any questions, either. 14 15 MR. LONGWELL: I'm Kevin Longwell, with Boeing. I 16 have no questions. 17 MR. SANTIAGO: Dennis Santiago with IAM. Just one question. 18 19 When you approached the aircraft, did anybody approach you ask you any questions, any fuelers or anything? 20 21 MR. PEREZ: No. MR. SANTIAGO: No? Were they finished fueling at the 22 time? 23 MR. PEREZ: I don't really recall. 24 MR. SANTIAGO: You don't recall. 25

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MR. PEREZ: Because there was a lot of --1 2 MR. SANTIAGO: Activity? MR. PEREZ: Yeah, activity around the aircraft. 3 4 MR. SANTIAGO: But did you actually go inside the 5 forward cargo hold? 6 MR. PEREZ: Yeah, I did. 7 MR. SANTIAGO: Did you hear any noises or anything 8 inside? MR. PEREZ: Nothing. Not a thing. Normal. 9 MR. SANTIAGO: Okay, I don't have anything else. 10 MR. BURNS: Hi, I'm Lou Burns, with Airline Pilots 11 12 Association. No questions. MR. WIEMEYER: I have one follow-up question. 13 Did you notice any condensation or any other fluids dripping off 14 15 the wings? 16 MR. PEREZ: Well, I really didn't look for. MR. WIEMEYER: Is this something that you do see on 17 18 occasions? MR. PEREZ: Condensation on the wing? Sure. 19 MR. WIEMEYER: Okay. In your opinion, could that be 20 misinterpreted to be some other fluid by people? 21 MR. PEREZ: No. 22 MR. WIEMEYER: Well, that was quick. I don't have 23 anything else. 24 Anybody else? 25
