## 1. INITIAL BRIEFING/REVIEW GROUND RULES

 Review ground rules (who is responsible for AC, aborts, who will fly what legs etc.).

High minimums/low time procedures (use LCP's minima on OE).

• Discuss, in broad strokes, how the OE will progress. Discuss the practical, line-oriented focus of the OE with special emphasis on topics and maneuvers not taught in flight training such as the crossbleed starts, descents and energy management.

 Give taxi techniques and tips to Captains. Discuss FCTM taxi speeds, braking, 90 and 180 degree turns, visual references for main gear trucks, single engine taxi.

- Discuss takeoff and landing characteristics of all aircraft.
- Sterile flight deck: OE related questions are OK as they come.
