The Forest Service (FS) values the opportunity to comment on the Carson Helicopters, Inc. (CHI) Letter of Petition of March 11, 2011, about the Weaverville Helicopter N612AZ accident that claimed nine lives. The FS has reviewed the CHI Letter of Petition as well as response letters to the petition from the engine manufacturer, GE Aviation, and the airframe manufacturer, Sikorsky Aircraft Corporation (SIK).

CHI claimed its March 11, 2011 Letter of Petition was about new information. All but one item (E-POLY) did not address new information but rather reintroduced findings that were addressed by the NTSB factual report of December 7, 2010, and the response letters submitted by GE Aviation and SIK expertly refuted CHI by providing factual evidence that these claims were not applicable to the outcome of the accident. The E-POLY item, while being new information, had no bearing on the accident outcome (reference the GE Aviation response letter, paragraph 3).
