FIXE AIRCRAFT N9593U THAT OCCURRED 1/5/2020					
DIGEST Took off in my plane 9593U yesterday, 3 youth on board. This was their 1st flight with me headed out for a ± 40 min scenic + orientation flight with these boys. (Climbed to 4000' ASSL and then headed away from AVL airspace, flew past Sugar Loaf. Demonstrated to the boys + and - G, did some turns + quick release response of the Cheetah. The Cheetah is very nice + responsive in release response. Entered into Hickory Nut gorge, flew past Chimney Rock, altitude was at ± 3000 MSL. Flew over Lake Lure, doing some scenic stuff, then climbed away from the lake, to ± 4400 MSL. Wanted to demonstrate to the boys what a "lazy 8" looks like + then demonstrated + straight ahead stall. The Cheetah has excellent + docile stall characteristics. The plane always drops slightly the left wing, and is easily managed with a bit of right rudder. However this time (it's never happened before) the right wing dropped very quickly, I hit opp. rudder, dropped the nose applied medium power, but the plane entered into a

Right from flat spin. I have never experienced this in the 10 years I have owned this plane. I tried dropping the nose some more, & kept hitting that leftudder. The plane would not budge from the flat spin. Nose down attitude was not working, so I pulled the yolk all the way back, right up into my chest area. This allowed the plane to pancake onto the terrain. All on board survived, and within minutes some local people arrived to help ~~us~~ us out. 1st Responders arrived quickly too and placed us on stretchers. The boys were sent to Mission Hosp, and I to St Luke's, Columbus. The boys and I received some cuts and bruises, also we had some spinal compression from the pancaking in. 2 boys and I were discharged from hospital that night, the 3rd boy is still at mission Hospital, and hopefully will get released today later.
