


West bay: suspension



Timeline - allision

- 0620 Pilot aboard, heavy fog
- 0658 Pilot reported concerns with radar, crew assists with tuning



Timeline - allision

- 0620 Pilot aboard, heavy fog
- 0658 Pilot reports concerns with radar, crew assists with turning
- 0714 Paperwork completed, waiting for traffic
- 0808 Ship underway, first engine order



Timeline - allision

- 0822 Pilot questioned chart symbol
- 0823 Pilot ordered port rudder
- 0826 Pilot ordered starboard rudder
- ~ 0827 Ship's radars became "distorted"
- 0827 VTS called ship's pilot
- 0830 Ship allided with delta tower



Damage to M/V Cosco Busan



Damage: \$2.1 M

Size: 220 ft x 14 ft

Spilled: 55,000 gal



Damage to Bay Bridge



Damage: \$1.5 M



Timeline – environmental response

- 0830 Pilot notified USCG VTS that ship struck bridge.
- 0846 Pilot Association rep notified USCG COTP
- 0849 Pilot Association rep notified USCG VTS oil was "pouring out of the hull"
- 0857 Pilot notifies VTS of oil around the ship,
- 0903 USCG Pollution Investigation Team responded
- 0905 Relief Pilot notified Oil spill Response Organization (OSRO)
- 0915 Qualified Individual (QI) notified



Timeline – environmental response

- 0930 Incident Management Division (IMD) Chief briefed COTP, D-11 Commander, and Chief of Response
- 0935 Oil Spill Response Organization began mobilization
- 1000 USCG team boarded ship
- 0942 Qualified Individual (QI) notified California Office of Emergency Services (OES)
- 0945 The State On-Scene-Coordinator and USCG IMD established a Unified Command
- 1000 Oil spill response contractors began encountering skimmable oil



Timeline – environmental response

- 1030 Qualified Individual notified the Coast Guard of involvement
- 1044 The PI Team reported to Sector Command Center
- 1205 DFG Oil Spill Prevention Specialist departed for ship
- 1336 and 1506 Oil spill contractors to conduct overflight operations
- 1600 The DFG Oil Spill Prevention Specialist reported spill amount
- 1730 On-water oil spill recovery operations for Day 1 suspended
- 2100 State OES conducted a conference call with local jurisdiction emergency services


NOAA Oil Trajectory Animation
