### **Narrative:**

At about 1222 hours, the Washoe County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue responded to the Pah Rah mountain range to search for N1891X. The initial search efforts included an aerial search using a helicopter, but due to the limited visibility surrounding the accident coordinates, and the dangers of icing, the helicopter was unable to complete the search. The helicopter dropped search and rescue personnel as close to the last coordinates as possible to search for the airplane on foot. Crews located the airplane's engine at about 1424 and several minutes later they located the main wreckage.
