The following are verbatim excerpts of the text of emails from Ms. Pierce to the NTSB on the noted dates, in response to NTSB queries regarding the results of the pilot's toxicology tests:

April 25, 2014 Exchange

<u>NTSB Query:</u> I just received Mr. Miceli's CAMI Toxicology report.

The only detected drug was Doxylamine, which is an antihistamine and can be used as a sleep aid or a decongestant/anti-sneezing/common cold treatment

If able, can you please provide me with any recollections of what and how frequently/recently he might have taken this

<u>Ms. Pierce Response:</u> He took an over the counter sleep at night to sleep, but never during the day. Would it affect him otherwise?

April 25 & 26, 2014 Exchanges

Ms. Pierce Questions/Statements:

4/25: Would an over the counter sleep aid from Costco cause an issue if it was taken at night at least 19 hrs before?

4/26: I just looked that up and it looks like that's what he was taking. http://www.amazon.com/Kirkland-Signature-Nighttime-Doxylamine-Succinate/dp/B002RL8FKM I occasionally took the diphenydramine that Walmart sells (25mg) but he said that made him groggy in the morning so he liked the one from Costco that he said didn't make him feel that way. He didn't take it every night, but frequently in the last couple of years.

NTSB Query:

4/29: So from this email am I correct in presuming that he did in fact take one?

Can you possibly specify the day and approximate time (and drug/dosage) that you think he took?

Ms. Pierce Response:

4/29: He would have taken it the night before (Friday) probably around 9 or 10 pm. He would take one of them. I believe those are 50mg. He had always said that they didn't make him groggy the following morning.
