Interview #1 Summary

Private Pilot from Dream Flight School at Carroll County Regional Airport

Interview date/time: January 13, 2015 1006 EST

Interviewer was Stein.

The interviewee stated that he held a private pilot license and was a student at Dream Flight School at Carroll County Regional Airport (DMW), Westminster, Maryland. He stated that he is always concerned when landing or departing from DMW because of N49094. During a previous encounter the interviewee was on the downwind airport leg preparing to turn base for runway 34. When he began his turn he immediately saw the Pitts airplane appear on final without any radio calls or notification of the Pitts pilot's intentions.



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Interview #1 Summary

Interview date/time: January 13, 2015 0945 EST

Interviewer was Stein.

The interviewee stated that she was a 260 hour private pilot license with instrument rating at the time of the interview. The interviewee reported that several students had previously complained about the Pitts airplane. During a prior encounter, the interviewee had taken a runway and started her ground roll moments before the Pitts pilot took the reciprocating runway. The interviewee made several attempts to communicate with the Pitts pilot over the radio, but was later informed that his airplane did not have any radios.
