I took off from Fredericktown, Mo. airport. I could not get the gas pump to turn on at the airport. I had an hour and twenty minutes of fuel in the tank. I decided to fly to Farmington, Mo. about 20 miles. Somehow I didn't make the right turn, I became lost, I decided to make an off airport landing. The area was all hills and trees and some landing spots. When I made the landing the nose wheel came down, caught in the heavy grass and I went over on the top. I was able to exit the airplane.
