### **FRA Post Accident Inspection**

Investigators reviewed Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) track inspection reports from inspections conducted on the Union Pacific (UP) Estherville Subdivision in May of 2017. Initially, investigators reviewed five reports, these reports noted 58 defective track conditions, including 40 locations of defective crossties, and 5 locations with rail fasteners not maintaining gage. These inspections were found to include all main track between milepost (MP) 78.4 and MP 0.0; with the only exclusion being between MP 59.0 and MP 48.59. Upon further review, NTSB investigators found two additional inspection reports from the May 2017 inspections. The additional reports were originally overlooked because of duplicate report numbers. Investigator determined that with the inclusion of these inspection reports, all the main track from MP 78.4 to MP 0.0 was inspected. Investigators noted that during the May 2017 inspections, FRA inspectors noted 78 defective track conditions. Of these 78 defective conditions, 51 locations with defective crossties and 5 locations with rail fasteners not maintaining track gage were reported.
