N60RK NoCo traffic, Duke . . . just south of the Wal-Mart, entering, ah, we'll be entering a forty-five for left downwind to one five, NoCo.

1847:21

N60RK NoCo traffic, Six Zero Romeo Kilo, on a short . . . on a left downwind for one five and, um, we have an engine out, smoke in the cockpit.

1847:45

Unknown Yeah, we do see a fire on you, Duke, yeah the runway's clear.

1847:52

N60RK I've got a fire I'm gonna land it pretty darn quick. Please have the trucks come on out.

1848:02

Unknown . . . fire, we've got a fire on the runway

1848:09

N9274Q NoCo traffic, Saratoga seven four quebec there is an emergency, a Duke is making an emergency landing one five.

1848:33

Unknown And, ah, NoCo, be advised the Duke lost control. He has crashed.

1848:56

Unknown Airport, ah, airport, did you copy that the Duke crashed just to the east of the approach end to one five.

1850:07 NoCO traffic helicopter zero six golf is about two minutes out to the north inbound, yeah were gonna do an orbit near the accident site, see if we can land close.

1851:07

N9274Q Quebec . . . NoCo ops, we will be calling the NTSB. We did observe the accident. We'll be filing a report.
