

As the dot started to come down, it exploded as a single burst of flames into a bright orange fireball. He observed two defined, staggered sections of flames falling. From his vantage point he was unable to see the flames landing. heard no sounds. More described the timing of events were as follows: the dot rose and curved for ten to fifteen seconds; there was an explosion and the flames fell for 30 seconds.
