Effective date: You will receive an official notice of proposed safety rating from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration in Washington, D.C. The Unsatisfactory rating will take effect 60 days after the date of the official notice.

PROHIBITION: Under 49 USC 31144(c) and 49 CFR 385.13, a motor carrier that receives a final Unsatisfactory safety rating is prohibited from operating a commercial motor vehicle in interstate and intrastate commerce. If applicable, the motor carrier shall have its operating authority registration revoked under 49 USC 13905(f)(1)(B).

You may request a safety rating upgrade based on corrective action under 49 CFR 385.17 and/or an administrative review under 49 CFR 385.15.

Change to safety rating based on corrective action: You may request a change to a safety rating under 49 CFR 385.17 at any time by providing evidence that you have taken actions to correct the deficiencies that resulted in the safety rating. You must make this request in writing to the Field Administrator for the FMCSA Service Center in which you maintain your principal place of business. A pending request for a change in safety rating under 49 CFR 385.17 will not delay the effective date of the rating.

Administrative Review: You may appeal your proposed safety rating in a petition filed under 49 CFR 385.15 if you believe FMCSA made an error in assigning your safety rating. You must submit your appeal within 90 days of the date of the proposed safety rating or within 90 days after denial of a request for a change in rating under section 385.17(i).

You should submit your appeal within 15 days of the date of the official safety rating notice to allow FMCSA to issue a written decision before the prohibitions in 49 CFR 385.13 take effect. A petition under section 385.15 will not delay the effective date of the rating unless the Chief Safety Officer grants a stay.

DataOs: If you dispute the violations recorded in the Violations section of this investigation report, and the violations were not used in

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the calculation of your safety rating, you may submit a Request for Data Review (RDR) through DataQs. The DataQs system is the method to remove violations that did not affect your safety rating. DataQs is an online system that allows a motor carrier or driver to request and track a review of Federal and State issued data that it believes to be incomplete or incorrect. BASIC: Hours-of-Service Compliance Process Breakdown: Monitoring and Tracking

Alebachew Ademe is in charge of the carrier's safety management. The motor carrier has not been effectively monitoring and tracking hours of service records to ensure drivers are properly using their electronic logging devices and following regulations. The carrier needs to implement an effective process of monitoring and tracking hours of service records, ensure drivers' records accurately reflect actual activities, and comply with the FMCSR.

Specific Recommended Remedies

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking:

1. Implement an effective process for monitoring, tracking, and evaluating all drivers' compliance with Hours-of-Service (HOS) regulations and company policies.

BASIC: Controlled Substances/Alcohol Process Breakdown: Training and Communication

Alebachew Ademe is responsible for the carrier's safety management. The carrier has failed to conduct any post-accident controlled substances & alcohol tests when required per FMCSR requirements. The carrier needs to ensure management personnel and drivers are educated on FMCSR controlled substances and alcohol testing requirements. In addition, the carrier needs to ensure drivers are being tested when required.

Specific Recommended Remedies

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Training and Communication:

1. Convey expectations to all applicable staff for adhering to controlled substance and alcohol regulations and to company policies and procedures, and for executing responsibilities by providing new-hire and refresher training. Establish communication channels such as newsletters and/or meetings focused on resolving conflicts: for example, for drivers, between testing requirements and lifestyle decisions with regard to controlled substance and alcohol abuse or misuse.

BASIC: Driver Fitness Process Breakdown: Monitoring and Tracking

Alebachew Ademe is in charge of the carrier's safety management. The carrier has not been properly maintaining driver qualification files and driver documents to ensure drivers are properly qualified when operating CMVs. The carrier needs to implement an effective process

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Specific Recommended Remedies

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking:

1. Review and retain each driver's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) at least annually to ensure compliance with company policies, Federal regulations, and State and local laws and ordinances related to driver fitness. If a driver seems to have numerous violations, the MVR should be reviewed more often. Random MVR checks in addition to annual checks are also effective. File the MVR in each driver's driver gualification file after review.

BASIC: Vehicle Maintenance Process Breakdown: Policies and Procedures

Alebachew Ademe is in charge of the carrier's safety management. The carrier does not currently have a systemic maintenance policy for its vehicles. The carrier needs to develop and implement a systemic maintenance policy. The policy should have a schedule for periodic maintenance, inspection, and record-keeping. In addition, the carrier must ensure drivers are properly educated about the policy.

Specific Recommended Remedies

To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures:

1. Develop a procedure ensuring that vehicle defects that impact safety and/or safety compliance are reported, repaired, and certified before the vehicle is operated.

A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six-year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six-year period.

3. Carrier Crashes

The Division Administrator/State Director will continue to consider preventability when a motor carrier contests a proposed safety fitness rating. The motor carrier may deem that the recordable accident rate is not a fair means of evaluating its accident factor (Factor 6) on the CR report. If so, the motor carrier must submit the compelling evidence within seven calendar days if the proposed rating is Unsatisfactory and 10 calendar days if the proposed rating is Conditional to:

8. **10-year driver employment history required.** Ensure that drivers provide a 10-year employment history on their employment application.

9. Ensure that all drivers' logs are accurate.

Ensure that all drivers' records of duty status (logs) are accurate. Check them against "supporting documents" to verify accuracy. Prohibit falsification of logs by any driver. Review the rules on supporting documents. Take appropriate action against drivers who falsify logs.

10. Driver drug tests required.

Ensure that all drivers subject to pre-employment, random, reasonable cause, post accident, return to duty, and/or follow-up controlled substance testing are tested as required by 49 CFR Parts 40 and 382 of the FMCSR.

11. MRO must have knowledge of the drug regulations.

Ensure that the Medical Review Officer (MRO) used in your drug testing program is knowledgeable about the reporting and review of test results requirements of 49 CFR 40.33.

12. Maintain a complete file documenting the qualification process.

Ensure that all drivers are fully and properly qualified before operating in interstate commerce. Maintain a complete file as required for each driver, documenting the qualification process.

13. Establish a maintenance records program for all vehicles.

Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed.
