There was a report of pollution of ethanol from the FMT 1052. The OSRO estimated the discharge into the waterway to be approximately 1380 gallons.

As far as total cost of damages, I only had the initial estimate but heard it was over \$2 million. So your best bet would be to reach out to the companies directly on an updated figure.

- I need to get the total cost of damage to the barges and/or towing vessels. Do you have this info? If not, I will ask the companies.
