Okay, good morning. My name is Joe Gordon; I'm MR. GORDON: the NTSB Roadway Work Group Chairman. We're here today on July 17, 2022, in Oakland, California, to conduct an interview with Sergio Tovar [sic], who works for Union Pacific Railroad.

This interview is in support of the NTSB investigation RRD22FR011. In this accident a roadway maintenance machine was struck by an Amtrak passenger train on July 15, 2022.

Before we begin with the questions, we're going to go around the room and formally introduce ourselves. I'm Joe Gordon; spelling of the last name is G-O-R-D-O-N, with the NTSB.

MR. ALLEN: My name is Adam Allen, I'm with the BMWE, last name is A-L-L-E-N.

MR. FELIPE AYALA: Felipe Ayala, A-Y-A-L-A, FRA Track Inspector.

James Ridgway, R-I-D-G-W-A-Y, CPUC Track. MR. RIDGWAY:

Robert Nagel, Amtrak, last name is N-A-G-E-L. MR. NAGEL:

Jeremy Ritch, R-I-T-C-H, Union Pacific MR. RITCH: Railroad.

MR. ACOSTA: Narciso Acosta, A-C-O-S-T-A, Union Rail with BMWE.

MR. TORRES: Sergio Torres from -- I work for Union Pacific as a backhoe operator.

All right, thank you, Sergio. And, as we MR. GORDON: discussed before, we're going to be recording the interview today

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and have it transcribed and give you a chance to review it. It will eventually be a part of the docket, of the public docket, so we can't quarantee any confidentiality. Do we have your permission to record today?

MR. TORRES: Okay.

INTERPRETER: I did ask him that and he said he wasn't sure what they --

INTERPRETER: -- discussed as far as what Jose instructed Sal.

MR. GORDON: Okay, okay. And when the work was done in the

MR. TORRES: Well, that's normal, you're thinking you're going to eat your lunch and do the process what you're going to do.

MR. GORDON: Right.

MR. TORRES: And it's like I ate my lunch before I go in there. Well, I did it before and there's so much garbage and it's like -- I came home and the wife, oh, no thank you.

MR. GORDON: Yeah, yeah, exactly, I get it.

MR. TORRES: No.

MR. GORDON: Yeah, you've got to come out of those clothes immediately.

MR. TORRES: Well she has to -- the garbage and tires they're
