I, Jessica Davis, of Whiteville NC, state:

1. On 17 February at about 1:20pm, I saw the three students entering into the aircraft 85R from my position near the repair hanger about 15 feet away from them.

- 2. I saw Jake Parson entering the aircraft last after ensuring the other passengers, Dominique Northcutt(in the back), Vanessa Leal(in the back) and Justin Elliot(front, left side), were securely in the aircraft.
- 3. Once the occupants were securely inside the aircraft I watched them taxi and begin the normal run-up procedures for the aircraft.
- 4. After the successful run-up procedures and traffic check, I watched the aircraft align itself properly centered onto runway 35 for a normal take off with the flaps up.
- 5. From what I could tell or see, the aircraft began a normal building of speed to achieve the correct MPH for take off.
- 6. On the aircraft ascending from the runway into a climb around 100ft it looked as though the nose of the aircraft was continuing to elevate upward. At this point I moved from the repair hangar onto the grass taxiway.
- 7. From where I stood, it appeared as though the aircraft nose angled up skyward enough where I could see the nose of the aircraft from my position near the numbers of 35 right of the runway.
- 8. At what I believed to be around 150 feet in the air, the aircraft looked as though it stalled and dipped towards the left quickly losing altitude and crash-landing front-first into the field to the left side of the runway.
- 9. I believe that the contents of this statement are true and correct.
