INTERVIEW 1 2 MR. KAMINSKI: This is Ron Kaminski. 3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Hi, Ron. How are you? 4 MR. KAMINSKI: Good. Is this Mr. Price or Pat? 5 MR. MCGRODER: I think you've got everybody. I think you've 6 got Dayton, Daren and Pat, Ron. 7 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. So let me add my colleague, Kenny 8 Bragg. He's our human performance investigator. 9 MR. MCGRODER: Okay. 10 MR. BRAGG: This is Kenny Bragg. 11 MR. KAMINSKI: Yeah, Kenny. Hey, we're starting off here. I'm going to merge the calls. 12 13 Okay. Is everybody on? Kenny are you on? 14 MR. MCGRODER: Pat McGroder here. 15 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. 16 MR. BRAGG: This is Kenny. I'm here. 17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Why don't we do attendance. So 18 Darren's here. Dayton, if you could answer, and then Ornella, you 19 can answer, and then Pat, I guess. 20 (Crosstalk) 21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah, I'm on as well. 22 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. So I know Dayton and Darren are on. 23 Pat, you're on. And --24 MR. MCGRODER: And Mrs. Price, Dayton's mom, is on. 25 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. And her first name?

MR. MCGRODER: Ornella.

MR. KAMINSKI: Ornella? Okay.

MR. MCGRODER: Yes, sir.

MR. KAMINSKI: And then I'm Ronald Kaminski, and then Kenny, can you speak up?

MR. BRAGG: Sure. My name is Kenny Bragg. Can you guys hear me okay?

THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay, great. And as you know, Pat, that I'm going to record this so -- so I can, you know, we -- so I don't have to worry about taking notes on every little thing, and we just record it. I'll get it transcribed, and I will give you a copy of the transcription.

MR. MCGRODER: Great, Ron. That's fine with us.

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. So, Dayton, basically what we're looking to get is I know trying to get you to -- I hate to bring you back into that horrible time, but get you to try to remember starting from the trip leaving after the golf tournament. And then Mr. Bragg and I will just have some follow-up questions. So why don't you start with that, or would you rather start with the seating, the seating chart?

MR. BRAGG: Hold on, Ron.

MR. KAMINSKI: Yes.

MR. BRAGG: Before we do that, can I get -- just do a formal introduction into the interview, get everyone to say and spell

their first and last names? That way that will help the transcriptionist out tremendously.

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. Good idea, Kenny. I apologize for that.

MR. BRAGG: Okay. Hold on. I'm going to go ahead, and set up recording as well just so we'll have a backup.

MR. KAMINSKI: Tell us when you're ready, Ken.

MR. BRAGG: Hold one second. Small technical glitch here.

My -- I got to use another phone. It won't recall while I'm on it apparently.

MR. KAMINSKI: Well, I'm going -- I'll just start. I got --

MR. BRAGG: Hold on for a second here.

MR. BRAGG: Okay. My name is Kenny Bragg. I'm an investigator with the National Transportation Safety Board, Office of Highway Safety. This interview is in connection with a motor vehicle crash that took place in Andrews, Texas, on March 15, 2022. Also from the NTSB we have --

MR. KAMINSKI: Ronald Kaminski, K-a-m-i-n-s-k-i. I'm a survival factors investigator with the Office of Highway Safety.

MR. BRAGG: And the attorney for Dillon. Can you --

MR. KAMINSKI: Dayton.

MR. BRAGG: I'm sorry. For Dayton, yes. Can you go ahead and state your name as well as your organization?

M-c-g-r-o-d-e-r. I'm with the Law Firm of Beus, B-e-u-s, Gilbert, G-i-l-b-e-r-t, and McGroder, M-c-g-r-o-d-e-r, in Phoenix, Arizona. My clients are Mr. and Mrs. Daren and Ornella Price as well as my client Dayton Price, all of which are on the phone.

Sure, Ken. My name is Pat, P-a-t, McGroder,

MR. BRAGG: Great. And, Mrs. Price, can I get you to spell your first and last name, please?

MS. PRICE: Certainly. It's O-r-n-e-l-l-a.

MR. KAMINSKI: Thank you.

MR. BRAGG: And just on behalf of myself, Ron, I would like to just thank you for giving us this interview.

INTERVIEW OF DAYTON PRICE

16 BY MR. BRAGG:

- Q. Dayton, if you don't mind, could you go ahead and start off by telling what happened that day, and what you, what you observed?
- A. Yes, sir. Do you want me to start from before we left for Midland or would you like me to start after the golf tournament?
- 22 | Q. You can start from before you left Midland.
- A. Okay. So I remember getting up around four o'clock in the morning, 4 a.m. We had to load our bus with the trailer attached by 4:30 in order to get to Midland in enough time for our team to

warm up, and get ready for this upcoming golf tournament that we had. So it was pretty, pretty regular morning. We all got on the bus, and sat down, and started driving. One of the main things I remember on the bus is seeing a really nice sunrise on our way to Midland. And then we stopped at a gas station just outside. I think it was in Odessa. I'm not, I'm not too sure. I'm not too familiar with Texas. Stopped at a big gas station, and myself and my teammates we got some, got some breakfast, and breakfast burritos for, for breakfast and to get ready, and then we all got back in the bus. We arrived at the golf course. There was a lot of, a lot of players there. The range was pretty much filled with all, with all the teams, and guys and girls.

And then we began our round, our first round. There was two rounds that day. Myself, from what I remember myself I played pretty well. I didn't really see many of my teammates during the day. I saw my coach, coach James a few times, and he came around, and gave us water, and snacks and such. And we played the first round, and started up our second round again. And by the end of it we were all pretty tired. Unfortunately, our team didn't play too well. So some of the guys were a little frustrated with themselves, but we still had another day to play. So we were looking forward to tomorrow.

Then we got -- we loaded the bus back up; got back in the bus. And then as a team we decided we wanted to have some Chickfil-A because their milkshakes are pretty good. So we went to

- Chick-fil-A. It was in the mall. And we ordered our food, and we sat down, and we had, we had our chicken sandwiches and chicken nuggets, and whatever else they got. But we ate, and then we all got back in the bus.
- And then the last thing I remember is trying to break the glass.
- Q. And so what time did you -- was the first tee-off for the girst round in the morning?
- 9 A. I believe it was 8 a.m. (indiscernible).
- 10 Q. Okay. And you said you were at the, the bus -- you got up
- 11 about 4 a.m. You were at the bus at 4:30 a.m., and then about
- 12 | what time did the bus leave?
- 13 A. About 4:35, sir.
- Q. Okay. And is that New Mexico time or Texas time or is it the same? Is there a time change?
- 16 A. Yes, sir. Yes, sir, that was New Mexico time. We left so
- 17 | early because we had to account for an hour time difference.
- 18 Texas was an hour ahead of New Mexico.
- 19 Q. Right. Okay. And why don't we touch on the seating chart.
- 20 | I know you said -- I did get some notes that your dad gave me when
- 21 I was there at the hospital, and I talked to him, and I guess he
- 22 | just got this information from when he was listening to you talk
- 23 to the police or something. But so we have the coach in the --
- 24 driving in the front left seat, correct?
- 25 | A. Yes, sir.

- 1 Q. Okay. And then we have a female that was in the passenger
- 2 seat. What was her name?
- 3 A. Laci Stone.
- $4 \parallel Q$. Laci Stone. Okay. And then the second row behind the coach
- 5 was that Jackson Zinn?
- 6 A. Yes, sir.
- 7 Q. Okay. And next to Jackson would have been Mauricio Sanchez?
- 8 A. Yes, sir.
- 9 Q. Okay. And behind -- or next, and then the -- on the outside,
- 10 | I guess, it would have been Karisa Raines?
- 11 | A. Yes, sir.
- 12 Q. Okay. And then in the third row, you were in the third row
- 13 next to the window, correct, on the left side, on the driver's
- 14 | side?
- 15 A. Oh, yes, sir, yes, yes, sir.
- 16 | Q. Okay. And next to you in the middle would have been Tiago?
- 17 A. Yes, sir.
- 18 Q. Okay. And next to Tiago would have been Hayden?
- 19 A. Yes, sir.
- 20 | Q. Okay. And we have Travis Garcia, he was in that last row
- 21 | alone, correct?
- 22 | A. Yes, sir.
- 23 Q. Okay. Do you happen to know was he -- where he was seated
- 24 | back there? Was it more towards behind you, behind Tiago or maybe
- 25 | all the way to the right by the other window, passenger side? Do

you recall?

- 2 A. I believe, yeah, I believe he was on the right-hand side
- 4 Q. Okay. Great. Thank you. And as for seatbelts, was -- do
- 5 you recall anyone being -- having their lap shoulder belts on
- 6 other than the driver?

- $7 \parallel A$. No, sir.
- 8 Q. Okay. So you're not even -- do you know or you're not sure
- 9 about Laci Stone up in the front wearing her seatbelt?
- 10 A. I'm not too sure.
- Q. Okay. That's fine. Okay. So that's it for the, for the seating chart.
- MR. BRAGG: Ken, you want to follow-up with anything regarding the trip right before the crash?
- 15 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- Q. Yeah, sure, Dayton. Let's talk a little bit about your background with the team. How long had you played on the team?
- A. It was my freshman year. So about a semester, and I guess a semester and then until March 15th. So I'd say about half a
- 20 semester and one semester. So not quite a full year.
- Q. And was it just a normal occurrence on the team that you take these types of trips for different golfing events?
- 23 | A. Yes, sir.
- Q. And do you normally drive? I mean, did the team normally take a highway vehicle?

A. Yes, sir.

- Q. And do you normally take the van that you were in during the crash?
- 4 A. Yes, sir, that's our -- that was our usual van. Sometimes
- 5 the basketball team would have to take our, our van. So we would
- 6 use the almost identical one, but those were the vans that we
- 7 took, yes.
- 8 Q. Okay. And do you normally take a trailer along --
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 | Q. -- as well? And is coach James is he always the driver?
- 11 | A. Yes, sir.
- 12 \mathbb{Q} . Have you ever been on a trip when he wasn't the driver?
- 13 A. No, sir.
- 14 | Q. In your experience this -- all this time riding with coach
- 15 James, have you ever, have you ever felt unsafe or had, had any
- 16 concern about the way he drove?
- 17 | A. No, sir.
- 18 Q. Okay. Have you ever known him to get pulled over on these
- 19 | trips by the police?
- 20 | A. No, sir.
- 21 | Q. Okay. And this trip, this was a two-day event, correct?
- 22 | A. It was -- technically we played a practice run the day
- 23 | before. So you could say it was a three-day trip for us, but the
- 24 | tournament was only two days, yes, sir.
- 25 Q. And so did you, did you go make the same trip the day before

- $2 \mid A$. Yes, sir. We left around the same time, 4:35 a.m.
- Q. And how long did it take to go from the school -- and I
- 5 A. Yes, sir, school parking lot, yeah.

assume you left from the school --

- Q. Okay. So how long did it take you to drive from the school to where the tournament was being held?
- 8 A. Unfortunately, I don't really remember.
- 9 0. Was it more than five hours?
- 10 A. No, sir.
- Q. More than two hours? Somewhere about that time? I mean, I'm just asking. I'm just trying to narrow it down.
- A. Yeah. I would say, I would say anywhere from like an hour 45 minutes to two and a half hours. I don't think it's -- I think
- 15 the maximum amount of time it would have took us two and a half
- 16 hours. I'm just -- I was a little confused now because we had to
- 17 account for the time difference. So I'm just -- I was just a
- 18 | little confused.
- 19 Q. Okay.
- 20 A. It was between -- I would say it was definitely close to like
- 21 an hour 50, two hours and 15 minutes, around there. It's my best
- 22 guess for sure.
- 23 Q. And you stated earlier that the coach stopped and got fuel on
- 24 | the way to the tournament?
- 25 A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Correct?
- 2 A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. Does he have to get -- would he have to get fuel each,
- 4 | each way there? Meaning --
- $5 \parallel A$. Yes, sir. He filled up when we got to Odessa or Midland, and
- 6 always on a trip back from wherever we were coming from he'd
- 7 | always stop pretty much the same gas station (indiscernible) New
- 8 Mexico, and fill up either -- even if it's the next morning or for
- 9 the next USW Athletic Team's use.
- 10 Q. Okay. So you indicated that Pat -- no. I'm sorry. What was
- 11 | the young lady that was sitting next to him?
- 12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Laci.
- 13 | THE WITNESS: Laci Stone.
- 14 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 15 | 0. Laci?
- 16 | A. Yes.
- 17 Q. Did Laci sit next to him on the way down there as well?
- 18 | A. Yes, sir.
- 19 Q. Does she always sit up front or does -- do you guys move
- 20 | around or what's the seating situation like?
- 21 A. Usually -- or the senior on our team Justin Pasitney, he
- 22 | usually sat up front with coach James and either played music or
- 23 | talked to the coach. But he, he wasn't traveling with us that
- 24 day. So Laci took the front seat.
- $25 \parallel Q$. Okay. And when they play music, they used the radio in the

van or they used a cell phone or what did they -- how did they normally?

- A. Yes, sir. She used her -- I believe there was an auxiliary cord that was plugged into the radio or into the radio system there, and she could play her preferred songs (indiscernible), and it would come out of the speakers on the bus (indiscernible).
- Q. And when you got to the, to the golf tournament that morning, what did you guys do?
 - A. We got there, we got there, I believe, about an hour, hour and 20 minutes early. Some of the players stayed in the van for a little bit, and ate something, and -- because it was a little cold outside or chilly for Texas weather, I guess. And they -- some of the -- some of my teammates had energy drinks or coffee or stuff like that, and they just sat in the van for a little bit. Myself, I went to the range. Put my headphones in, and started just hitting golf balls to warm up. And then everybody just gradually started coming out of the van, and went to the range, and then went to the putting facility, and warmed up there, and then we walked out to our designated holes.
 - Q. And what did coach James do during the day?
- A. He made his way around the golf course. He had two teams to take care of; the guys' team and the girls' team. He was in a cart, and we would see him maybe every five or six holes, or he was up
- $25 \parallel -- \text{ up on, for example, like the ninth hole, and see, see the}$

- players come through. Or he would be talking to some other coaches. So that's, that's pretty much where he -- what he does during our tournaments.
- Q. Does he get to take a break at all? I mean, have you ever -does he just go into maybe the clubhouse and have lunch and just
 take a little time off or --
- A. No, sir. We started on -- myself, I started on, I think the 12th hole, and you would play your full round, and then (indiscernible), and then coach James would bring you a to-go container with a, with a sandwich in it, and a cookie, and a drink, and then you would just keep going. You would start back on the 12th hole, and play again. And then after the round, we almost immediately left after we (indiscernible).
- Q. And so when you left, you said you went to Chick-fil-A that was in a mall?
- 16 | A. Yes, sir.

- 17 Q. How long do you think you were at the Chick-fil-A?
- 18 A. I would say about 30 minutes, 30, 40 minutes.
- 19 Q. So you all sat down, consumed your food, and you left?
- 20 A. Yes, sir.
- 21 0. Did coach James have a drink with him when he left?
- 22 | A. It would have been -- not alcoholic drink. No. It would
- 23 have been --
- Q. No, no, no. I mean, did he have a, did he have a cup of iced team or a milkshake with him when he was driving?

- 1 A. Yes. I believe he had a Dr Pepper. That's pretty much all he drank.
- Q. You remember seeing him, seeing him with it getting in the vehicle?
- 5 A. Yes, sir.
- 6 Q. Okay. And so when you left, you don't remember anything 7 after that; is that what you stated?
- 8 A. Yes, sir.
- 9 Q. Okay.
- A. Oh, sorry, sorry. Let me -- I remember trying to remember break, break the glass. Because I was -- I believe I was stuck inside the van. But other than that, unfortunately, I don't remember anything else.
- Q. Do you remember, you know, were they talking? Were people talking on the van? Was he talking to the front -- the front seat passenger? I mean, were they riding in silence? Describe that a
- 17 | little bit for me.
- A. Myself and Tiago were listening to music on our phones. I had my headphones. I had one, one headphone in. And I, I couldn't really tell what was going on in front of me. I believe there was music playing, but I'm not, I'm -- I don't really know.
- Q. Okay. Do you remember, like, any movements of the van?
 Like, do you remember the driver coach either slamming on brakes
 or swerving? You remember anything like that?
- 25 | A. No, sir.

MR. BRAGG: Okay. All right, well thank you. I don't have any further questions.

Ron, do you?

BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. Yeah. I was just going to say, so Dayton, so when did you first realize that -- I mean, when you were listening to music, did you have your eyes closed at the time, you just kind of chilling?
- A. Yeah. I believe my eyes were open. I was just -- I believe
 I was on my phone and looking out the window, and just listening
 to music, and talking to Tiago Sousa.
- Q. Okay. So you don't recall then if there was any kind of a sudden brake at the end or kind of swerve right before the impact?
- 14 | A. Unfortunately --
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 A. Unfortunately, no, sir.
- Q. And when you -- so when you realized -- you said you had to bust out the window. Is that what -- can you describe that what
- 19 | happened there?
- A. Yes. Yes, sir. I remember trying to take my shirt off, and trying to wrap it around my fist, and then trying to break the window with my foot and my, and my fist.
- 23 | Q. And did your fist finally break it or did your foot?
- 24 A. I'm not, I'm not too sure. I just remember trying to break
- 25 | it. I don't remember if I got out or not through that exact

point.

- 2 Q. Okay. But I think you did have some arm, right arm
- 3 fractures. Is that your primary arm you use, your right hand?
- $4 \mid A$. Yes, sir. They put, they put two plates in my forearm.
- 5 Q. Okay. So it was probably a good chance you were probably
- 6 using your, your right hand there to break that out. So okay.
- 7 And regarding the -- did the coach ever discuss any kind of, you
- 8 know, you guys put on your seatbelts or you don't have to wear
- 9 your seatbelts? Anything regarding seatbelt usage?
- 10 | A. No, sir.
- 11 | Q. Okay.
- 12 A. Yeah, we were never -- yeah.
- 13 | Q. Okay. And that had been on the other trips too the same
- 14 | thing?
- 15 A. Yes, sir.
- 16 Q. Okay. Then as for other injuries, I know you had the, the
- 17 | right arm fracture, and then the ulna and radius. You had some
- 18 | facial fractures too; is that correct?
- 19 A. Yes, sir. I believe (indiscernible) my orbital bone.
- 20 Q. Okay. On your right side? Was that your right?
- 21 A. Yeah, right side, yes, sir.
- 22 Q. Okay. And okay. And then also was it a lacerated spleen you
- 23 | had as well?
- 24 | A. Yes, sir.
- 25 Q. Okay. And I guess just -- your -- let's get your date of

1 birth, make sure we have that correct. 2 Α. Okay. 3 0. 4 Yes. 5 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. That was all the questions I have, 6 Mr. McGroder. So and if Kenny doesn't have any more, I guess 7 we're done. I just want to thank you all for taking the time for 8 talking with us. 9 Thank you gentlemen. MR. MCGRODER: 10 MR. KAMINSKI: Speedy recovery there, Dayton. 11 MR. BRAGG: Yeah, Dayton, wish you the best in your recovery. 12 THE WITNESS: Thank you so much 13 MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. God bless you all. 14 MR. MCGRODER: Thank you. 15 MR.
