

To Whom it may Concern:

I was asked to recall the events and days leading up to the fatal accident that took my sister, Heidi Dowland on January 13, 2019.

On the morning of Saturday, January 12, 2019, we met my sister and Mr. Anderson at my nephew's basketball game in Prescott, AZ at 11:00. The game ended around 12 and my sister and Mr. Anderson decided to fly to my sister's lake home in Meadview, AZ to attend a party at the bar that night.

From what I understand they took off after noon from Prescott Airport headed to Meadview, AZ. They landed on the dirt runway in Meadview around 3-4 Saturday afternoon. They were picked up at the runway by a friend named Eric. Eric took them to my sisters home so they could get ready for the party.

They attended Chucks surprise 70TH birthday Saturday night at the bar called Fisherman's Landing, [REDACTED]. Bartender was Anthony Carter [REDACTED]. My sister and Mr. Anderson were drinking heavily that night until 1:30ish Sunday morning. She has photos of that night on her phone that is in FAA custody. They left the bar and made it home just before 2:00 am the morning of the accident.

My sister text me Sunday morning around 8:30 am and told me they were at the plane in Meadview, they were going to take off and head to Kingman, AZ for fuel. At 10:01 I received a text from my sister stating they were "Wheels up" and leaving Kingman, AZ headed for Glendale, AZ to meet up with us.

At 11:30 Sunday morning, my mom and I waited at Glendale Airport for my sister to arrive. At 12:15, I hadn't heard from her, so I started making phone calls. I called Eric Brunner, a friend who works in aviation. He informed me that he had heard of a plane down in the Hualapai Mountains and it matched the description of my sisters' plane. I began to call Mohave County Sheriffs office and Search and Rescue. They were less than helpful, and I have since filed a complaint. I was then contacted by Mr. Anderson's step daughter and told that he had lived, and my sister was killed. She was clearly upset and expressed her concern with his blood alcohol level at that time. I rushed to my sisters' children side and proceeded back home to Chino Valley.

Concerns:

Mr. Andersons blood alcohol level at the time of accident

Mr. Andersons blood sugar level at the time of accident (he is an insulin dependent diabetic with an external pump)

The integrity of the fuel they took on in Kingman, AZ

The maintenance logs of the airplane, was the motor tampered with?

We are deeply concerned with the large amount of life insurance that my sister had, through several policies, naming him sole beneficiary, changed recently.

Mr. Anderson owes the IRS 1.43 million dollars, and they only had been dating for 3.5 yrs.

I appreciate all your hard work and I trust that you will fully investigate my sister's death and allow justice to prevail.
