Hello Mrs. Monia,

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB; www.nts.gov) has received notification of an accident involving an aircraft that was piloted by Mr. Robert Monia (your husband), which occurred on July 5, 2021, and resulted in serious injuries and substantial damage to the airplane.

Title VII of the Federal Aviation Act, 1958, as amended, and the Independent Safety Board Act, 1975, as amended, requires the NTSB to investigate all civil aircraft accidents to determine the probable cause.

The rules pertaining to the notification and reporting of aircraft accidents (49 CFR 830), require the operator and/or pilot of an aircraft involved in an accident, or certain incidents, to file a report on NTSB Form 6120.1 and furnish other information as may be required, **within 10 days** after the determination that an accident has occurred. Completion of the enclosed form(s) is a joint responsibility of both the operator and all crewmembers on board the aircraft.

Attached you will find the **PILOT/OPERATOR AIRCRAFT ACCIDENT REPORT, NTSB FORM 6120.1**, and any attached supplemental information sheets, which are to be completed as thoroughly as possible and returned to my office in the required time.
