- Yeah. Well, I was, like normal, I'm in the break room. Ι watch vessel watch when they get closer so I can get a nice -okay, they're going to call in pretty soon. Saw them starting to arrive from the distance. So I just went scanned motorcycles, and then once I got to the transfer span, I was just beginning to walk onto it, and I saw that the boat was kind of curving a little bit

to my left, and I'm just, like, oh --

-- different angle kind of, which is normal. They always go with the wind or the waves or something like that. And before I
