## INTERVIEW

MR. KAMINSKI: My name is Ronald Kaminski with the National Transportation Safety Board. I'm here with David Rayburn with the Board. We're at Mr. Nicholas Green's residence and along with him is his parents, Marty and Andrew, and he's going to give us a brief description of what he remembers regarding the crash of June 9th.

#### INTERVIEW OF NICHOLAS GREEN

### BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- So why don't you just start with what you remember?
- So I remember I was driving home from downtown on the 202. was approaching Priest, there was a police stop spot. The signs were reading police stop ahead on Priest Avenue, or Priest -- not

I remember I looked back and I saw the semi-truck approaching me quite quickly in the distance and I kind of thought well, this is pretty fast and then I felt something and I don't remember anything else. So I didn't really have a whole lot of time to be real aware of my surroundings at that point because it was moving pretty quickly as every other car wasn't. I blacked out immediately after that.

#### BY MR. RAYBURN:

- You said you saw something by the sign that said some kind of police activity?
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- Q. Is that that overhead sign?
- A. Yeah, on the electronic signs there's something saying that there was either a police stop, or something of that nature on Priest -- the Priest exit. So there was a pretty long line of cars leading up from the 52nd street exit. So it was pretty

backed up and I was basically stopped in traffic when I got hit.

- 7 Q. So you were completely stopped when you got hit?
  - A. Yeah, I might have been going maybe five miles an hour to like move it forward, but it was --
- 10 Q. Creeping --

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- 11 A. Stop to crawl.
- Q. How long -- I know it's probably a difficult question -- were you stopped a long time, or just a few seconds? How long do you
- 15 A. I was stopped maybe a couple of minutes. My memory gets real fuzzy because --
- 17 Q. Sure.
- 18 A. I definitely got concussed.

think you were stopped?

- MS. GREEN: He's got a head wound also. He has a head wound.

  MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: They told me that I was partially
- 21 ejected. I think it was long enough that I noticed when some --
- 22 when I -- I noticed when that -- the semi was coming up because
- 23 most of the other cars were pretty slowly trickling in and that
- 24 one was moving quick from what I remember. I didn't really have
- 25 time to put two and two together before they were plowing into us.

- 1 BY MR. RAYBURN:
- 2 Q. Was there a car stopped behind you?
- 3 A. I couldn't tell you, I don't remember.
- 4 Q. It's like five lanes wide out there, I'm assuming you were in
- 5 the right hand lane?
- 6 A. Yeah.
- 7 Q. You were -- that's where you take the exits to come home 8 right --
- 9 A. Yeah.
- 10 0. Priest?
- 11 | A. Yeah.
- 12 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 13 Q. I should go back I mean, get your date of birth if you don't
- 14 | mind?
- 15 A.
- 16 Q. And your approximate height and weight?
- 17 | A.
- 18 Q. Would you be interested -- we could put you in contact with
- 19 our Transportation Disaster Assistance people and they can send
- 20 you emails? You want to give an email address and they can kind
- 21 of give you updates on how the investigation is -- what's going
- 22 on?
- 23 A. Yeah.
- 24 Q. Okay, why don't you give that to me?
- 25 A. It is -- I know it's kind of a

- 2 Q. Is --
- 3 A. Forgot that, yeah,
  - Q. Okay,
- 5 A. Yep.

- MS. GREEN: There's no -- you don't use a hyphen between your two --
- MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: No, not on that one.
- 9 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 10 Q. okay. What types of injuries I know -- I see
- 11 you have a head injury.
- 12 A. Fractured ribs --
- 13 | Q. How many?
- 14 A. They didn't really say.
- MS. GREEN: They told us two.
- 16 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 17 0. Which side?
- 18 A. Left side. I know I can feel the left side. Lacerations on
- 19 my back and my shoulder and my head, nine staples in my head and a
- 20 concussion.
- 21 MR. RAYBURN: When you got knocked into the car in front of
- 22 you did your airbag come up?
- MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: I don't remember. I was -- I went out
- 24 | really quick.
- 25 MR. RAYBURN: How about -- were you wearing a seatbelt?

MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: Yeah. I think that's -- I wouldn't be here today if I wasn't.

BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. But you said somebody told you, you were partially ejected?
- A. That's what they said and that's what I contributed to the scars in the back of my head, but I wore a seatbelt so it wasn't like I wouldn't have been. I don't know if it was just coming out
- Q. (Indiscernible)
- 10 A. Yeah, something like that.
- 11 Q. Yeah, I don't know -- your car was pretty crushed, yeah.
- 12 | A. Yeah.

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- MS. GREEN: Yeah, he's been asking about that today.
- 14 MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: Yeah, to this point I haven't seen it.
  - MR. RAYBURN: I'd show you I don't have the -- we did take some preliminary pictures, but I haven't been to look at the -- just look at the vehicles and take some pictures, but until later on this week we should be able to do a little bit more inspection and get a closer look, but I didn't bring my camera, so I apologize. Maybe down the road I could send -- if you don't --
- you have my card with email and maybe down the road -- I have your email -- I can shoot you a couple photos.
- MR. NICHOLAS GREEN: Okay.
- MS. GREEN: Can I interrupt? He is on medication, I don't know if you need to know that, but he --

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay, I appreciate that. Dave, do you have any other questions?

MR. RAYBURN: No, it normally takes us -- there's like ten of us out here working. Ron and I are from Texas, the rest of the crew is from Washington D.C. and we've been out there. We closed the highway down this morning, went out there and flew a drone and took measurements with the drone and photographs.

It takes us like, 16 months to finish a report because we're real, real thorough. We've gone to the trucking company and got all their records, we interviewed the truck driver. You know, so it will be a real thorough report, but the -- anytime you have questions you can email Ron or --

### BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. Transportation -- TDA we call them, Transportation Disaster Assistance. They will -- once they give your email -- oh, and why don't you give me your phone number just in case, if you don't mind?
- 18 | A.

- 19 Q. They will email you and you can email either me or them and 20 they'll give you some updates on what's going on.
- A. Okay, is there any sort of preliminary reason on why this happened?
- Q. That will be -- and they'll send you that once you get -once they give them email. It should be coming out with the next
  three weeks or so. We'll have preliminary -- a brief preliminary

report and just what occurred in the crash. By then maybe we'll have some more information on the truck driver and any issues with him or his vehicle.

MR. GREEN: A couple questions, one is, is there a separate police report that will be issued prior to --

MR. KAMINSKI: They're working on it now, it's just very involved.

MR. RAYBURN: You know, they do like a couple reports sometimes like the basic police report -- just listing everybody's names and addresses and things like that and they'll have a summary narrative, you know, may be a couple of paragraphs. Then they do their reconstruction report, it will take several months, but it will be done before ours will.

MR. GREEN: Okay. Second question is, so which of the -- we actually got home about an hour ago so we haven't contacted his insurance company, but we'll probably try and do that later today. Do we give them your information?

MR. RAYBURN: You can, that's okay. Yeah, you can tell them the State Police investigated the accident and then --

MR. KAMINSKI: DPS, yeah.

MR. RAYBURN: Yeah, the Arizona DPS and then the NTSB, National Transportation Safety Board is also doing an investigation.

MR. GREEN: Will he have access to -- I don't know if there are things in your car that you might want to see if you can

1	salvage. Will he have access to who controls the access to
2	MR. KAMINSKI: DPS will do that.
3	MR. RAYBURN: Yeah, they're still trying to figure out
4	whether or not they're going to talk to the prosecutors and stuff.
5	We're not still recording are we?
6	MR. KAMINSKI: This concludes our conversation with
7	Mr. Green.

- 5 A. Yeah.
- 6 Q. Did you all have a good time?
- 7 A. Yeah, I mean, considering, yeah.
- 8 Q. Sure. Is she doing okay from the crash?
- 9 A. Yeah, she's a lot better shape than me, thank god.
- 10 Q. Okay, yes. So I guess why don't you tell me -- you were in
- 11 | the Mercedes, correct?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Why don't you start from there, what lane you were in and
- 14 what you recall from about the crash?
- 15 A. I'm in the far right lane so -- and then we hit some traffic.
- 16 So we're just sitting in the stop and go traffic. I'm guessing
- 17 | it's from like the Suns game, the Suns won a big game that night.
- 18 So there's a lot of traffic right there in that spot and we're
- 19 just sitting in stop and go, my daughter's on her IPad.
- 20 We're just -- I just figured we were going to be sitting in
- 21 | traffic for a while because there was a lot of traffic. All of a
- 22 | sudden I heard a huge noise and then I felt impact. There was a
- 23 car behind me and a car in front of me I believe because I mean,
- 24 | from when we got out of the -- when I got out of the car there was
- 25 | -- I saw a car in front of me and I saw a car behind me. Then one

- $1 \mid \mid$  of them was like rolled over I believe.
- 2 0. The one in front or the one behind you?
- 3 A. I think the one behind me. The one in front of me might have 4 been rolled over too, but I know the one behind me was definitely
- 5 rolled into the barricade.
- 6 Q. Okay, take your time.
- 7 A. I could see the fire ahead of me, the truck on fire ahead of
- 8 me. I was just like people -- some people were on the ground,
- 9 some people were sitting, some people were dead. It's just, yeah.
- 10 Q. I'm just trying to write this down that -- take some quick
- 11 notes here. Okay and so you were at stop and go at the time?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. You were seated of course in the driver's seat. Were you
- 14 wearing your seatbelt?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Where was your daughter seated at?
- 17 A. Back passenger and she also had her seatbelt.
- 18 | Q. Is that -- was she behind you, or on the right side?
- 19 A. Passenger side.
- 20 Q. She was in her seatbelt -- was she in a car seat, like a
- 21 | booster seat, or just a regular seatbelt?
- 22 A. Just regular seatbelt.
- 23  $\mathbb{Q}$ . So did you get out and do anything, or just hung out there?
- 24 | I mean, I quess you quys --
- 25 A. My sunroofs broke, my airbags deployed, so I couldn't see

anything after the impact. So I waited like a minute just so that

-- I wasn't sure if we were going to get hit again. Then when I

kind of had heard people I popped my head out of the sunroof,

looked around and saw that everything was kind of at a stop

finally.

From there I got out of the car and I grabbed out of the car and then we just went on the other side of the barricade because I was scared that the cars were going to blow up.

Q. Sure.

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- A. So then we just waited there for the fire -- the police and ambulance to arrive. I tried to keep her distracted and focused on me really because there was a lot of stuff I didn't want her to see.
- 14 Q. Sure. What kind of injuries did you sustain?
- A. Just bruising; my neck, my shoulders and my back were in a lot of pain and like, stiffness. I'm just really, really sore. I have some bruising from the seatbelt on my hips. I have a -- my leg kind of got cut -- like a really, really big cut in that process from the glass or something --
- 20 Q. Which leg was that?
- 21 A. My right leg, on my shin there was like a huge cut, like 22 gash.
- 23 Q. Did you need stiches for that?
- 24 A. No, I didn't.
- 25 Q. Okay, anything else, other than the mental trauma?

- 1 Yeah, no kidding. I think that was it. I'm still in some 2 pain from it, but I went to the hospital. They gave me some meds 3 for the inflammation and stuff so that's been helpful.
- How about ? What types of injuries has she 4 sustained? 5
- 6 None, she did have a little abrasion from the seatbelt. After the crash she started panicking and was -- get this off me, get this off me, it's too tight. So she had a little rubbing from 8 9 the seatbelt.
  - Where would that -- her hips, her shoulder?
- On her neck. 11 Α.

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- 12 Q. Neck? Okay.
- Like neck, towards shoulder and then she had some minor 13 14 bruising from the seatbelt on her hips, it was very minor.
  - So let me just go over -- so you guys were in the far right lane kind of stopped in traffic where you kind of stop and go, do you recall if you were stopped when you were struck from behind,
- or would you -- were you maybe just creeping up -- creeping 18 forward?
- 20 Right when it happened I want to say we were stopped when it
- 21 happened. I know that we had been creeping before that, but it
- 22 was super slow so I want to say we were at a stop.
- 23 Did you see what kind of vehicles, or what color the vehicles were in front of you or behind you? 24
- 2.5 No, not that I can remember, no. Α.

- Q. Sure, that's fine. I mean, you got enough things you're kind of worried about so I don't -- I understand that. Do you have any questions for me?
  - A. So you're just conducting the investigation?
- Q. Yeah and if you'd like if you want to give me your email I can put -- we have what they call a Transportation Disaster
  Assistance and they can send you emails giving updates as to what's going on regarding the investigation if you're interested.
- 9 A. Yes, I would definitely be interested. The only thing I -10 besides getting well and getting better -- I haven't been able to
  11 locate where my car was towed. I don't know if you're able to
  12 even assist with that or not.
- Q. Yeah, well I know where it's at. It's at their -- the
  Phoenix -- or the DPS impound lot, which is like above -- off of
  15 16th street near University.
- A. Okay, let me just write that down just to give to my insurance. They've been asking like -- I'm like, I'm not really the person who's supposed to find the car.
- 19 Q. It's the -- the vehicle -- the address is 2610 South 16th 20 street.
- 21 | A. Okay.

- Q. But I'm not sure if they've been released yet, but I'm sure your insurance company will know where that's located at.
- 24 A. Okay, that's very helpful thank you.
- 25 Q. Yeah, we've seen the vehicles, but we're still not allowed to

even get in them yet. They're still --

- A. Yeah, my insurance said they don't need the vehicle, they don't need possession of the vehicle, they just need to see it, just to see that it's totaled out. So they can go ahead and go forward with their end.
- Q. Why don't you give me your email and if I'm allowed to I will

  allowed to I'll have to check with my boss.

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#### INTERVIEW

MR. KAMINSKI: Today's date is June 12th. I'm at St. Joseph hospital in Phoenix. My name is Ronald Kaminski, investigator with the National Transportation Safety Board. I'll be talking to Jamel Harris, J-E -- J-A-M-E-L Harris, H-A-R-R-I-S. He was a passenger involved in the crash.

INTERVIEW OF JAMEL HARRIS

BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. So Mr. Harris, I guess if you could start with your date of birth?
- 11 A. Yes, date of birth is
- 12 Q. , okay. What's your approximate height and weight?
- 13 A. I'm I'm I'm tripping -- and and approximate weight is I.
- Q. Why don't you, if you could, give me a brief description of where you were seated in the car and what you remember about the crash?
  - A. I was seated in the rear passenger and I don't remember much about the -- all I remember was the initial impact and I blacked out. When I came to the driver of my vehicle, he was crawling out the passenger window. The passenger was flung out of the car and the rear driver passenger was tapping on me to wake me up as he was crawling through the window -- the passenger window too.
  - I then crawled out the passenger window to get away from the car because the truck was on fire and I aligned with the other two

people that were in the vehicle. Smelt fuel so we wanted to get away from the vehicle. After I got out of the vehicle I took a few steps to get away from the vehicle and I sat by the right — the right median I guess you would call it?

- O. The median barrier?
- A. Not the median barrier, but it's like the median barrier and then it's another one on the right side that's not a median, like the shoulder, the right shoulder.
- 9 Q. Shoulder, okay.

A. I sat on the -- I laid -- I sat on the shoulder, then I laid down because I thought of if I had -- just in case I had any back and neck injuries, which is ironic.

Yeah, that's all I remember and then there was -- I don't know who it was, but I guy came over and was helping us. He wasn't like EMT, or police, or none of that, he just came over to help us, was giving us instructions.

While I was laying down I called my sister, I called my mother, let them know what just happened. They was asking for directions on where we were. He told them and everything and next thing I know the EMT's had put me on a stretcher and put me in the back of an ambulance and took me to the hospital

- Q. Now, when you were in the back seat were you on the passenger side or the driver's side?
- 24 | A. Passenger.
- 25 Q. Then you said the driver crawled out the driver window?

- A. He crawled out of the passenger window.
- Q. Okay and the passenger, you said, that was in the right front was thrown out of the vehicle?
  - A. Yes.

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- Q. Do you know how they were thrown out, was it through the windshield or --
- 7 A. I do not know. I'm assuming through the window, passenger 8 window.
  - Q. What types of injuries did they tell you -- you have?
- 10 A. They said I had a neck injury -- do you want like the note of 11 procedure?
- 12 Q. No, do you have any broken bones, strains?
- 13 A. Yeah, okay. So my neck was broken. One of the pieces, or a
- 14 | fragment of my neck bone was pushing on an artery in my neck.
- 15 Luckily, there was two arteries otherwise I would have probably
- 16 lost consciousness and died like that, but one of the bones -- one
- 17 of the bone fragments was pushing on my artery.
- 18 Then he said the way that the bones are supposed to line up
- 19 are like shingles, one on top of the other, layered just like
- 20 that. What had happened was the bone had came up, it was sitting
- 21 directly on top of the other one. I have that and I have some
- 22 major bruising on my buttocks and my tailbone, other than that I'm
- 23 okay, well my shoulder is (indiscernible).
- 24 Q. Your left shoulder?
- 25 A. My right shoulder.

Q. What's wrong with that?

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- A. It lacks movement because they said that the bones -- the two neck bones was pinching the nerve in my shoulder. So it wasn't able to -- I wasn't able to move it because of it.
- Q. So when you were stopped, were you stopped, or were you -and you were in the far right lane? What lane were you in, next
  to the shoulder?
- A. We were on the shoulder from what I remember. Well, here I'm just going to tell you like this because what had happened was we seen that the traffic was backed up already. So Edward, the person who was driving, he had got onto the shoulder and he was reversing backwards so he could get off on the exit.

The exit was like immediately to our right. Like if we were to reverse a hundred feet and crossed over we would have been on the exit, but traffic started moving on the highway. So we got back on the highway -- well, we got back -- we drove forward, we was still on the shoulder. Then I think he merged in into the first lane and that's all I remember. There was an impact after that and I went black.

- Q. So you were -- you started to pull off in the shoulder to get on that -- to get off on the exit, but then you saw the traffic start to clear and then you pulled back into the --
- A. Yeah, we drove back forward into the first lane and I lost -well, I guess yeah, I lost consciousness.
  - Q. So you weren't stopped -- as far as you remember, when you

- l got hit from behind?
- 2 A. Not really.
- 3 Q. You were maybe doing five, then miles an hour, what do you think?
- A. We were maybe going 10 or 15. We weren't exactly behind the traffic, but we weren't exactly close to it either.
- 7 Q. Okay.

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- 8 A. We were maybe five to ten, yeah, because we were still trying 9 to get into the lanes and everything and traffic was still coming.
  - Q. You -- what's a good contact number for you? Would you care to get updates on this? I can get -- if you have an email I can get you updates regarding the investigation and all that. I can send that to you, or have somebody in our Transportation Disaster Assistance send you updates regarding what's going on with the investigation.
- 16 A. Yeah, if you want to just send me text messages, that's fine.
- 17 Q. Okay, what's your phone number?
- 18 | A.
- Q. I'll leave you a couple extra business cards. If you talk with the other passengers or the driver in your car, if you could give them my information and have them give me a call.
- 22 A. Okay.
- 23 Q. Okay, sir. Do you have any questions for me?
- 24 A. I do.
- 25 Q. What's that?

- So in the wreck, there was two items that I can't seem to find. One is my wallet, it's a brown wallet, looks kind of beat up, about three inches wide -- two and a half inches and it's a 3 side clip wallet. I got my original birth certificate in the 4 5 money pocket and I got my original security -- social security 6 card in the pocket where the license is supposed to go.
- Q. Okay.

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- That's why I really need to find it because those are two 8 important documents.
- Well, when we talk to the DPS we will -- I will ask them --10 we meet with them almost every day so I can ask them about your 12 wallet. I'm sure if they have it, they will track you down and 13 get that for you.
- 14 Then, I also had a firearm with a magazine in the car too, in 15 the rear passenger seat. It was a -- I got something in my eye --16 it was a Canik, C-A-N-I-K TP9SFX and there was another 20 round 17 nine millimeter magazine that was full in there too. It also had a TLR -- I think that's what it's called -- a TLR one laser 18 flashlight on it, right under the handguard -- hand rail. 19
- 20 Q. So it was a Canik, C-I-N-I-K --
- 21 Α. No, C-A-N-I-K.
- 22 C-A-N-I-K, TP9FXS --Q.
- 23 Α. SFX, S-F-X.
- 24 Q. S-F-X.
- 25 Α. TP9.

- Q. Right, and you had 20 rounds, nine millimeter magazine.
- $2 \mid A$ . Along with one in -- it was already in the gun.
- 3 Q. Okay and a TLR laser --
- 4 A. Flashlight.

- 5 Q. Flashlight, attached.
- A. I should have took a picture of it. I don't know -- I do
  know I have a picture of the serial numbers -- that's not in this
  phone. Dammit, I'll have to find it.
- 9 Q. Well, I'll be -- we will be inspecting the vehicles and so if 10 you find it, I will hand that over to the DPS officer and they'll 11 get that back to you. I'll tell them that that was yours, as well 12 as your wallet, that still may be in the car as well.
- 13 A. Okay.

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Q. So you think you were going five, maybe ten miles an hour, you went off to the shoulder, tried to get -- because traffic was backed up you're going to get off on the exit, but then you decide the traffic started moving. So you tried to pull back in and that's when you got hit.

You got knocked out and next thing you know when you wake up the passenger next to you tapped you to wake you up. The driver went out the passenger window, the passenger was ejected -- you're thinking out the window. Then the other passenger went out the window -- and you guys went out the right side back window?

- 24 A. Right side passenger --
  - Q. Right side --

- 1 A. The one that the --
- 2 Q. Right, the door window.
- 3 A. Yeah, the right passenger, right front passenger.
- 4 Q. Oh right, you guys -- you crawled out the right front passenger?
- 6 A. Yeah.
- Q. Okay and then so you said you walked over, you smelled fumes so you guys got out, tried to walk away. You went over and sat on the shoulder, you laid down, you called your mom and your sister and told them where you were.

A guy came over to help you, you felt like you had some neck and back injuries, which I guess you turned out you did. You have a neck fracture with a fragment that's sitting on an artery. Then you have some major buttocks tailbone bruises and a right shoulder injury.

16 A. Mhm.

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- 17 Q. Any other bumps, bruises, scrapes?
- 18 A. They said there was a few scrapes on my back, but it isn't nothing major.
- Q. Okay, sir I thank you very much for your time and cooperation. Again, I'll leave you a couple of my business cards and if you talk to anyone else feel free to hand them -- give them that information. It's all voluntary -- if they'd like to give me a call and give me a statement I'd appreciate it.
- 25 A. Okay.
