Machine was purchased from CAT by WT Byler (railroad contractor). WT Byler (railroad contractor) worked with a railroad equipment company (Ballast Tools and Equipment) to assist with the purchase of this machine, and to equip it to travel and perform work on railroad tracks. The equipment was purchased as is and came equipped with the rubber tracks and digging bucket. BTE, once the equipment was delivered from CAT, retrofitted the machine with hy-rail wheels (railroad wheel attachments) to it can travel and perform work on railroad tracks. BTE also retrofitted this machine so that various railroad work heads (cross tie carrying head, tamping head, shears; ect...) can be inter-changes at the end of the standard-length boom. The CAT sales representative was

At the time of the accident, the operator was using the work head in IMG\_9637.JPG (see attachment) to move three- 20' long by 3' feet wide galvanized steel walkway grates, weighing a total of 2,200 pounds. The operator was carrying the load out-in-front of the equipment and was traveling along railroad tracks when the load somehow shifted and came through the operator cab causing fatal injuries.

BTE supplied operator training on the equipment, including training on the railroad work heads and lifting of materials.
