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1 INTERVIEW 2 I'm with Hi, Captain. My name is MR. 3 the U.S. Coast Guard. 4 MR. NGUYEN: Yeah. 5 MR. Okay. 6 INTERPRETER: (Untranslatable), 7 (untranslatable), Coast Guard. 8 MR. NGUYEN: Yeah. Since your vessel is a U.S. flagged commercial 9 10 vessel, we are in -- doing a safety investigation into the fire. 11 INTERPRETER: (Untranslatable). The Coast Guard 12 (Untranslatable). 13 MR. NGUYEN: (Untranslatable). 14 INTERPRETER: He say electrical issues. 15 Yeah, okay. So the purpose of our investigation 16 is to determine what happened and how to prevent it from happening 17 again. (Untranslatable conversation) 18 19 INTERPRETER: He say so he didn't expect it to happen, so now 20 he just abandoned the ship. 21 MR. Yep. 22 INTERPRETER: He don't know what's the matter. 23 So we'll ask him questions here in a MR. Yep. 24 second, and he can address those answers. 25 MR. NGUYEN: (Untranslatable).

I just wanted to frame the interview. 2 basically want him to know that nobody is in trouble. 3 INTERPRETER: Mm-hm. 4 And we just want to get all of the facts about 5 the fire so that we can sort of piece together a timeline and look 6 for things that could have been present to prevent it from 7 happening again. 8 INTERPRETER: Right.
