| 18 | fire extinguishers. But basically, you're just watching to make |
| 19 | sure the welder's safe is what I was brought about to. |
| 20 | Q. Okay, so you worked on the <i>Kodiak Enterprise</i> for the week |
| 21 | leading up to the incident. What can you tell us what jobs you |
| 22 | were doing specifically in that week leading up to the incident? |
| 23 | A. For the first week, we were taking out the back two I |
| 24 | think they were heaters. They're right by beside the freon |
| 25 | tank. About three of us were doing that for the week and then the |
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Thursday is when I was moved into the second deck, in the back 1 2 room, just chipping the foam. 3 LTOkay. 4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- get the drawings out. 5 LTYeah. 6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: So, make sure it's the correct room 7 that you're talking about here. 8 BY SA PETRULAK: 9 Ο. Are you familiar with the decks and the levels as far as the 10 01 deck, 02 deck? 11 Α.
