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CWO This is Chief Warrant Officer with US

Coast Guard. My last name is spelled Today's date is

April 20th and the time is 10:28 local. We're here at Trident

6 marine facilities investigating the fire on the *Kodiak Enterprise*.

And in the room I have --

SA HELLER: ATF Special Agent Greg Heller. My last name is spelled H-e-l-l-e-r.

LCDR Lieutenant Commander , chief of investigation, Sector Puget Sound.

MR. VASQUEZ: My name is Margarito Vasquez.

MR. ALTENBRUN: Spell your last name.

MR. VASQUEZ: V, as in Victor, a-s-q-u-e-z, as in zebra. And first name is M-a-r-g-a-r-i-t-o.

MR. ALTENBRUN: Thank you.

My name is Larry Altenbrun. I'm with Nicoll Black Feig. We're the attorneys for Trident Seafoods.

David, go ahead.

CAPT FLAHERTY: Hi. My name is David Flaherty. Last name is spelled F-l-a-h-e-r-t-y. I'm the investigator in charge for the National Transportation Safety Board.

CWO : And do you go by Primo?

MR. VASQUEZ: Yeah, I go by Primo.

- 21 A. Yeah.
- 22 | Q. Okay.
- 23 | A. And we receive more work with Tyson than (indiscernible), so
- 24 | Trident (indiscernible).
- 25 | Q. Okay. And you were on -- you're fishing on the --

- $2 \parallel Q$. Okay. So you were a crew member on the vessel?
- $3 \parallel A$. I was to be a -- I was a crew member and then I stay in the
- 4 yard to, you know, do welding, you know, (indiscernible).
- $5 \parallel Q$. Okay. And what's your position now with Trident?
- 6 A. I'm a welder lead.
- 7 0. Welder lead?
- 8 A. Yeah, well, pipe fitter lead, pipe fitter too.
- 9 Q. Okay. Welder/pipe fitter?
- 10 A. Yeah. I think now, I think my title is a pipe fitter lead.
- 11 Q. Pipe fitter lead?
- 12 | A. Yeah.
- 13 | Q. Okay. And how long have you been in this position?
- 14 A. I been over there I think a year.
- 15 | Q. Okay. And on April 6th, were you on board Kodiak Enterprise?
- 16 | A. Yes.
- 17 Q. Okay.
- 18 CWO All right. Greg, I'll --
- 19 MR. ALTENBRUN: Let me just make it clear to Primo. Primo,
- 20 | your native language is Spanish; is that correct?
- 21 MR. VASQUEZ: Spanish?
- 22 MR. ALTENBRUN: That's your native language --
- 23 MR. VASQUEZ: Yes.
- 24 MR. ALTENBRUN: -- your original language, your first
- 25 | language?

MR. VASOUEZ: Yeah.

MR. ALTENBRUN: If you have difficulty understanding today, let us know, okay, and we'll stop the interview and we'll do this again when we have an interpreter.

MR. VASQUEZ: Okay.

MR. ALTENBRUN: This is pretty informal, but I want to make sure that you understand, okay? It is being recorded. This is an important interview. So if you're having any difficulty, let me know, we'll stop it and we'll get an interpreter for you, okay?

MR. VASQUEZ: I think (indiscernible) -- I think we going to have help with, yeah, then it should be okay everything, because we have other two Spanish people. I understand a little bit more than (indiscernible). I think (indiscernible). So if there's any way we can bring an interpreter for me and for the other two workers, I think that they're going to need one.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Who are those?

MR. VASQUEZ: Gonzalo Rivera.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Gonzalo Rivera?

MR. VASQUEZ: Um-hum. And Daniel Guzman. He sounds -- he speaks good English, but I don't if he needs one, you know, but Gonzalo Rivera, I know he going to need help.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right. I already --

MR. VASQUEZ: (Indiscernible), yeah.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I have Gonzalo marked as needing an interpreter.

CWO Okay. Well, at this time we'll stop the interview and we'll make plans to have an interpreter here so we can do this once. Everybody okay with that? SA HELLER: Yeah, if he's not comfortable going forward, that's fine. CAPT FLAHERTY: Yeah, that's fine. All right. Okay. Then we'll stop the interview. The time is 10:33. (Whereupon, at 10:33 a.m., the interview was concluded.)
