Good Afternoon,

They do not have a mission report. They do create a resource sortie in MISLE but there is no way to print out a report. Below is what the narrative states and I could probably do a print screen for that if that is what you are looking for:

At 2127Z on 30 April, ASCC received tasking to fly to an active EPIRB from the F/V Nobska 100 NM East of Cape Cod. CGR6034 took off from Air Station Cape Cod at 2156Z enroute to the F/V Nobska. CGR6034 arrived on scene at 2228Z. Upon arriving on scene, two other good sam vessels were on scene. 5 POB were still on the stern of the F/V Nobska. The wheelhouse and entire bow of the vessel was engulfed in flames. CGR6034 deployed the rescue swimmer and had each POB slide into the water. Rescue swimmer recovered all 5 POB via Rescue Basket. Swimmer recovered. CGR6034 departed scene at 2308Z and arrived at ASCC at 0010Z. Rescue swimmer evaluated the survivors and deemed no hospital was necessary. ASCC Base Fire Departement evaluated all survivors upon returning to ASCC. All 5 survivors required no medical treatment. 5 POB were picked up from ASCC.

Low risk / High gain - risk was mitigated by deploying the swimmer away from the vessel and having the survivors slide into the water in order to keep the rescue swimmer safe distance from the burning vessel. Risk was also mitigated by having the CGR2313 on scene as comms cover.
