Engine room fire. General Alarm sounded. Emergency generator activated and fuel to main engine and generators secured resulting in loss of propulsion and power. Vessel temporarily Not Under Command. Successful fire suppression and extinguishment with installed CO2 system. Notifications to USCG, DPA and QI made. Shore-side marine fire fighting team (5 members) embarked onboard. No loss of life and no injuries. No pollution observed or reported. No damage to cargo observed or reported.
