24	was driving really, really fast. And all of a sudden, the car was

2 She tried to hold on to the seat in front of her? Ο. 3 Yeah. She really doesn't remember where, but she tried to Α. 4 hold something. She says on the left there was some, like --5 The handle? DR. SWEENEY: 6 INTERPRETER: Handles on --7 MR. KAMINSKI: Like, the armrest. DR. SWEENEY: 8 Armrest. 9 INTERPRETER: Armrest, that she tried to hold on this. She 10 said all of a sudden the -- drive so fast, shift on the left. And 11 hit the center divider, maybe. 12 BY MR. KAMINSKI: 13 Hit the guardrail, maybe? Ο. 14 She said she vividly remembers she might try to Α. Yeah. Yeah. 15 hold the front seats, actually. And then the car was driving --16 she says the car was -- just started speeding fast. Everybody 17 told them the same story. The driver was so fast, and all of a sudden the car shifted to the left side. So she hit the divider, 18 the pinning, whatever --19 20 Ο. The quardrail. Yeah. 21 -- guardrail so hard, and then shifted to the, to the other Α. 22 side. The opposite direction. Okay. She said that the car was 23 hit on the, on the guardrail and starting, like, shift back and 24 forth, back and forth, back (indiscernible) jumping side --25 Did it flip? Did it flip? Q.

- 1 A. The very beginning there, it was just jumping and --
- 2 Q. Shaking?
- 3 A. -- shaking. Yeah.
- 4 Q. Okay. And then they hit the guardrail and --

5 So hit the guardrail first. Very, very fast, and then hit Α. 6 the guardrail, and then the shaking back and forth. She said that 7 she vividly recall that, after the car was hit the quardrail, the 8 car was, like, jumping, lost the control. Then all of a sudden, 9 then she remember the car was flip towards the -- towards to the 10 left -- the right side. She said that, she said that there was 11 one moment she lost the connection. Like, from this way to the 12 other way, she know the car start flipping. But she doesn't 13 remember how the car landed, to which side, how they landed. But 14 when the car finally stop, she said -- she was telling me, the 15 seatbelt is on the feet.

16 Q. Oh, okay.

A. Yeah. So she said she doesn't remember how many times the car was flipped. That's the, that's the seatbelt. The seatbelt landed here. She said they hold this part, the leg. She said she's -- body was outside the car, but the feet was inside because the seatbelt, the belt.

- 22 Q. The belt -- seatbelt kept her --
- 23 A. Yeah. So that was -- saved the life. That's important.
- 24 Q. Yes. Very important. Yes.
- 25 A. Yeah. Her body was outside of the car. Her leg was inside

8	car. It's like this car has just been fixed, just painted it.	
9	Like, this is an older car being a little remodeled whatsoever.	
10	And she's questioning. She said, how can this car this is so	
11	old. Like, in China, we don't even use this kind of car. That's	
12	what's in her mind.	
13	Q. Okay.	
14	A. She said they have four friends, two family of four. They	
15	all believe this car is, like, a very lousy car.	
16	Q. Okay. And then how about did the bus driver ever mention	
17	about wearing seatbelts or any emergency exit windows, any	
18	A. She said she doesn't recall that. She said her husband	
19	reminded everybody, said that you have to put the seatbelt on,	
20	because this car is kind of, you know, not good. So she said that	
21	she had a habit. Every time she get in the car and she put	
22	seatbelt on. But you can see that save her.	
23	Q. Yes, it sure did.	
24	A. Yeah.	
25	Q. And what types of injuries did she sustain?	

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1	A. She said that she has some sort of the head injury. And then
2	she

13	arm, multiple fracture. So see, that makes sense, because the one

12	first. So that's the door. Fourth row. Okay. Fourth row?
13	You're in the third row?
14	A. Third row on this side.
15	Q. Third row. Okay. Third row. He is in the aisle seat?
16	A. Yeah.
17	Q. And his wife is in the window seat.
18	A. He's here. Wife by the window.
19	Q. Right. The wife is by the window seat in the third aisle on
20	the passenger side. Okay.
21	A. This, from here.
22	Q. Yes. Yes. Third aisle, passenger side.
23	A. It's on the right side.
24	Q. Okay, wife is in the window seat. Okay, and just, if he can
25	tell me what he remembers about the crash?

1 Α. He said that they left the park and that they're driving. 2 And he doesn't remember. He was dozing or sleeping. All of a 3 sudden, the car starting violent, and he just fell on the ground. 4 He said, I tried to recall what happened, and I vaguely recall that the car was driving very fast. He said, I had a seatbelt on. 5 6 He said that he had a seatbelt on, and when the car finally 7 stopped and he was laying on the ground, and he couldn't find his wife. 8

9 And he tried to get out, but the door was -- cannot open the 10 door. He said that some people, passersby, get out of their 11 truck, get out of their car. Tried to help them open the, open the door. He was able to get off the car, and then he was 12 13 bleeding so bad from the nose. He said that he was looking for --14 when he get out of the car, he said that there's bodies all over 15 the place. You know, some bodies out of the car, some bodies on 16 the ground. And he was looking for the wife. The wife was 17 yelling, screaming for help.

18 Q. And where was she? She was outside?

A. She was halfway outside, halfway inside. The leg was hanging on the edge of the broken car, and yelling for help. He said that his wife's whole body was outside, but that the -- the two legs was hanging on the broken piece. He doesn't know what it is. Q. So she was hanging out, but her legs were caught by some broken piece that was --

25 A. Yeah, so she's hanging there. Yeah. He says he remembers

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1 there was three people laying by the door. He says, even though I
2 have a lot of bleedings, because my mind is too clear that time; I
3 see what happens. He said that there was three persons laying by
4 the door, or three females.

There's one, he doesn't know who are they. He said the ones 5 6 from Nanjing, the -- because the people from -- they all remember 7 where they come from. From Nanjing. He said that there was three people laying at the very first -- the first one is from Nanjing, 8 9 the second one next to Nanjing is from Shanghai. And then the 10 next -- the three lady, the next lady, the number three lady was 11 from Wonju. All these three -- he said that these three 12 passengers, all the husbands standing there. Says, oh, she's 13 gone, she's gone, what I'm going to do, what I'm going to do. And 14 that's the first one -- first lady, from Nanjing. The second one 15 is from Shanghai. Was sitting there, oh, they're gone, they're 16 gone. The number three one looked and started yelling, screaming 17 to the driver, who was standing in front of the --

18 Q. Bus?

19 A. -- bus. He says, you know this car has issue; why don't you 20 stop it? Now they're all gone. So somebody was telling him, 21 let's just don't talk this right now, because -- since happens --22 already happened. We need to focus on how to, how to get our 23 people, you know, emergency service.

Q. Yes, yes. So I had a question. He said that he was on ground. Did he mean he was on the floor of the bus?

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1	A. He fell on the, on the middle of the aisle. He says it
2	happened so quick, you really don't know how this happened in
3	between, like from one way to the other.
4	Q. Right. But he said, he said he was wearing his seatbelt.
5	A. He says, I have a habit to put a seatbelt on, especially this
6	guy was driving so crazy, so people get scared.
7	Q. But he ended up the seatbelt came off?
8	A. So he said, he said that he couldn't remember how he get up
9	on the ground, but he was able to get up. But he was not on he
10	said, I have a seatbelt when he tried to get on the ground. Get
11	on the floor.
12	Q. So does he think the seatbelt I don't want to say I
13	don't want to put words in his mouth. Failed, but
14	A. He said that, you know, the buckle, the buckle is one side.
15	It's the you slide it in, right?
16	Q. Yes.
17	A. He said the other the one side, it's always hanging on the
18	you have to find where they are and then pull out. Yeah.
19	Do you know what he's talking the buckle on one side?
20	Q. Yeah, it hangs on the
21	A. Hangs on the ground, and they when they, when they need
22	it, they have to look around. And sometimes the back seats

14	minutes, because it's two or three or four buses here.

17	MR. XIE: Yes. The whole (Chinese spoken) under the bus.
18	BY MR. KAMINSKI:
19	Q. Right. He went under the bus with a stick?
20	A. Yes. Our driver hit the bus.
21	Q. Right.
22	A. Okay. Okay. Now hit our bus and the way sorry. Hit our
23	bus. I turned the key. Okay. But on the first turn of the key,
24	bus is not working. Okay. Bus not working.
25	Q. Okay.

1	A. And the next time, okay, turn the key, and the bus is okay.

3	A. Okay. And from our gas station to restaurant, I think 30
4	minutes later. Okay. No stop, but okay, 30 minutes later
5	traffic accident is over.

And there's another seat. 20 (Conversation in Chinese) 21 INTERPRETER: He opened the, he opened the --22 MR. KAMINSKI: The driver door? 23 INTERPRETER: -- the driver, the other side. 24 MR. XIE: (In English) No, no, no, not the driver door. 25 Driver's door on --

INTERPRETER: Not driver door. On the other side. 1 2 MR. XIE: -- on the right. 3 INTERPRETER: The side. 4 MR. XIE: Sorry. 5 INTERPRETER: The front door. 6 MR. 7	Q. Okay. Do you know did you or did you or the bus driver
8	ever tell the passengers to wear their seatbelts?
9	A. I told all the people, you must wear seatbelts, but is this
10	bus, but is not that day. It's just you know, they are a
11	group. It's for 2 weeks, you know, America. So it's 3 days; it's
12	our first 3 days, you know, Los Angeles. So I told my group
13	persons every day.
14	Q. So the first couple days of the trip you told them, but then
15	after that you didn't tell me, after every day to wear their
16	seatbelts?
17	A. Yes. Yes. Yes, yes.
18	(Through interpreter) Yes. After 3 days, he kind of tell
19	them, but then
20	(In English) But I think also it review but not every day
21	(Through interpreter) He said, after 3 days, not that he
22	tells people every day, every time, but he will tell remind the
23	people, don't forget seatbelt.
24	Q. Okay. And when you was there anyone sitting next to you
25	in a window seat?

8	resolve yet. That's what it is.
9	MR. KAMINSKI: Oh, yeah.
10	MR. XIE: Okay. Yeah.
11	MR. KAMINSKI: Yeah. We're still looking at everything.
12	Everything, yeah.
13	MR. XIE: Okay.
14	MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. That concludes our interview here at
15	5:20.

11	Q. And his date of birth?

13	Q. Okay. His approximate height and weight?
14	A

17	Q. Okay. And does he remember where he was seated?
18	A. There.
19	Q. In the aisle seat?
20	A. Yes.

22	remembers about the crash?
23	A. Okay. He said they left the hotel about 8, and he didn't
24	see, but some other passenger saw the driver was trying to fix the
25	car. The driver opened the hood. He said the driver was under

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1	the car and the tour guide on the steering wheel. He didn't see,
2	but somebody told him.
3	Q. Okay.
4	A. But they went to a park, called the Zion Park. I don't know
5	the name.
6	Q. Zion Park.
7	A. Zion Park, yeah. They went to view the landscape, take some
8	pictures, then they got to the gas station. But I don't remember
9	the gas station name.
10	Q. Okay.
11	A. The gas station, the driver started to fix the car again.
12	The driver opened the hood.
13	Q. Okay.
14	A. The driver got under the car. But we don't know what he
15	tried to fix.
16	Q. So, the driver got under the car two times, and once at the
17	hotel and then another time?
18	A. Yeah. When they were in the gas station.
19	Q. Okay.
20	A. One of the, someone would ask, what are you trying to fix.
21	He didn't answer. Then the driver said, all fixed. Come out of
22	the, into the car. He closed the hood. Tell everybody to get in
23	the car. They started move on the road.
24	Q. Okay.
25	A. So, he did, about drive 15 miles no, 15 minutes. But the

1	car had some issue. He said, all of a sudden af	fter 15 minutes
2	later when they go back on the road, the car sta	arted to shift from
3	side to side, hit both side on the guardrail.

5	A. He said the highway, both sides has the gua	ardrail and
6	retaining wall on both sides. The hit on the wh	neel, the power is
7	very strong. It's a very strong hit. He said,	I tried to hold
8	the front seats. I cannot hold it.

10	A. Yeah. Next the car started to flip.	
11	Q. Okay.	
12	A. He said, when the car flipped, he closed ey	yes. When the car
13	finally stops, he feels like, so when he woke up, he is on the

So, the man next to him in the window seat, on the Q. 23 driver side, he died? Okay. He said that his wife was on the seat belt and then got on 24 Α. 25 the ground. And something hit the head.

3	eye was swe	lling, bulging. He said when he tried to call her
4	name, he wa	s barely answered. He said, he asked wife, can you
5	move your l	eg.
6	And sh	e said, she moves a little bit. He does assessment.
7	He said tha	t, from the seat belt, it's, it's, it's like a lump,
8	that he tri	ed to pull her up, so he can release her from the seat
9	belt.	
10	Q. Oh, so	how, she was still, she was on the floor, but she
11	still had t	he seat belt on her feet, or where was the seat belt?
12	A. It was	still on the, on the bench.
13	Q. Oh, so	she was just kind of bent over, leaning by the floor
14	there?	
15	A. Yes.	
16	Q. Okay.	
17	A. But he	, the body is on the ground.
18	Q. Yes.	
19	A. So, he	tried to take her, take her from the seat belt, but
20	cannot.	
21	Q. Yeah.	Undo the seat belt. Yes.
22	A. And so	, he had to pull her up, so relieve the seat belt a
23	little bit.	
24	Q. Yes.	
25	A. He can	take off.

1	Q. Yes. And then he could take it off. Okay. Okay.
2	A. Yes. He said that time, America guy got on the car, and
3	speak Chinese, tell him to get out of the car, get out of the car.
4	He said, at that time, he tried to manage it, get the wife off the
5	feet and get out of the car.
6	Q. And what type of injuries did he sustain?
7	A. He got two rib fracture.
8	Q. Which side?
9	A. The right. He had two rib fracture. And then the right, the
10	right, the left forearm, but a muscle, severe laceration. The
11	bone exposed. He said because the car was shifting back inside,
12	he was hurting both sides, his shoulder is very painful.
13	He feels like sometimes he could feel like suffocated and
14	cannot breathe very well. The leg is very hurting.
15	Q. The right leg?
16	A. And no fracture. The knee, the right knee, the right leg.
17	Q. And did he get any seat belt bruising? Oh yeah, yeah.
18	A. Yes, see? Yeah.
19	Q. And ask, did he remember that the, about the driver
20	explaining wearing the seat belts?
21	A. No.
22	Q. No, he doesn't? Driver never mentioned wearing seat belts.
23	A. Okay. No. He says, when he sees something happen because
24	seat belt issues, so they be very cautious and wear seat belts.
25	Q. Yes. Yes. And how is, how is his wife doing?

1 Α. The wife is very, very sick, and want to go and take a look. 2 Oh, she's ICU? Ο. 3 No, she's here. Α. Oh, okay. Yeah, we'll, yeah, we'll probably go talk to her. 4 Ο. 5 She got a subdural hematoma. Now she got a DVT, deep vein Α. 6 thrombosis, after being back. 7 MR. KAMINSKI: Right, right. Right. Okay. 8 Okay. Anything else here? 9 DR. SWEENEY: I think we got it. 10 MR. KAMINSKI: And so, how -- so when the man told him to get 11 off the bus, how did he -- how did he get off the bus? Did he walk out or did he jump out a window or --12 13 They got out from the door. INTERPRETER: 14 MR. KAMINSKI: His wife, too? 15 INTERPRETER: He pulled the wife. He said then they tried to 16 move slowly, get out from the door. You cannot get out from 17 anywhere else. There's a lot of damage in the car. 18 MR. KAMINSKI: Yes. Yes. Very bad. 19 He said he got the wife to sit on the ground to INTERPRETER: 20 wait for the ambulance and they got a towel somebody gave to them, 21 to hold the blood.
