MR. KAMINSKI: Today's date is January 31st, 2023. My name is Ronald Kaminski with the NTSB. I'm here with John Humm of the NTSB, and also James Edelstein and Juan Gaona-Benitez, who are the interpreters, and we're going to be talking to Baltazar Jimenez-Lopez.

INTERVIEW OF BALTAZAR JIMENEZ-LOPEZ

BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. And his date of birth is?
- 10 A.
- 11 | Q. And approximate height and weight?
- 12 | A.
- 13 Q. Okay. And if you could tell us where he was --
- 14 A. Right here in the middle aisle.
- 15 0. And who was he seated next to?
- 16 A. He just knows him by the nickname.
- 17 0. Antonio Reyes?
- 18 A. No. He said he's not sure. It's just the nickname is all he
- 19 knows.
- 20 Q. Does he remember anybody in front?
- 21 A. Raul Martinez was in front of him.
- 22 | Q. Okay.
- 23 A. He said Jonathan and Oscar were behind him. No, behind him.
- 24 He says behind him right there.
- 25 Q. Right. So he was in the aisle?

- 1 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Yes, but there's -- we have two
- 2 Jonathan's.
- 3 MR. HUMM: Oh, okay.
- 4 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: One Jonathan passed away.
- 5 MR. HUMM: Yes.
- 6 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: The -- Jonathan Lopez-Rodriguez, because
- 7 Jonathan Hernandez-Gomez passed away.
- 8 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 9 A. Andy was behind him.
- 10 Q. Was Jonathan in the window seat or no?
- 11 A. All right. He says Andy Vera-Leon was in the window. He
- 12 | always rides in the window.
- 13 Q. Andy --
- 14 A. Andy Vera-Leon.
- 15 Q. Oh, yes, yes. Okay. And does he remember anyone else?
- 16 A. All right. Jesus -- he said there's two Jesus. All right,
- 17 Jonathan Hernandez-Gomez.
- 18 | O. Was?
- 19 A. Sitting beside him over here.
- 20 Q. Window, aisle?
- 21 A. Jonathan was in the window and Jesus, which would have been
- 22 | Jesus Lopez-Lopez, because he passed away.
- 23 | Q. Was sitting next to him?
- 24 A. Yes, was sitting next to him.
- $25 \parallel Q$. Okay. And if you can just tell us where -- what he remembers

about the crash?

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- A. He said he was in the hallway seat, drinking his coffee because they had just pulled out. And so he raised his head up and he saw the lights of the truck coming. He said that the bus was in the -- in its own lane and he said that the driver was driving slow, because he doesn't drive fast. He said after he saw the lights, he just felt the hit. He said once the bus stopped,
- 9 Q. And where did he end up after?

he started checking himself.

- 10 A. He said he was still in his seat. And he said he had Jesus on top of him.
- 12 0. So he still remained in the same seat?
- A. Yes, he remained in the seat as Jesus ended up on top of him.

 14 Jesus was the one who ended up pinned.
- 15 Q. Okay. Anything else?
 - A. He said after he checked himself -- Jonathan is his nephew -- and he said Jonathan are you okay. And that would be Jonathan Lopez-Rodriguez. And he told him let's get out of the bus. And he said in his mind he kept on thinking in accidents, gas is always flowing out, and he was worried the bus was going to explode.
- 22 Q. And how did they get out?
- A. He said he jumped out the window. Where the whole trunk of the bus was missing, he said that's where they got out. He said he asked his nephew to move because they have to get out. And

- since he was just kind of making noises, he said he just moved to him to the side and got out.
- 3 0. Was Jonathan his nephew?
- 4 A. Yes. Jonathan Lopez-Rodriguez is his nephew.
- 5 Q. Right.
- 6 A. Jonathan Hernandez-Gomez was the one that passed away.
- 7 Q. Right.
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 0. Okay.
- 10 A. There's two different Jonathan's.
- 11 Q. Yes, all right.
- MR. HUMM: But the guy that was pinned is who he moved to the side, right?
- 14 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Yes.
- 15 MR. HUMM: Yes.
- 16 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Because the --
- 17 MR. HUMM: Because he was with --
- MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: The guy he was sitting next to, Jesus
- 19 Lopez-Lopez, who was pinned, and he ended -- Jesus Lopez-Lopez
- 20 ended up on top of him.
- 21 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 22 | Q. Okay, got it. Okay. And then what kind of injuries --
- 23 A. He said just like glass shavings.
- 24 Q. Glass cuts?
- 25 A. Yes. He said he grabbed his book bag and set it where there

- 1 was a lot of glass so that he could get out. That's why he
- 2 doesn't have any cuts. He said his chest hurts because he hit the
- 3 seat.
- $4 \parallel Q$. He hit the seat back?
- 5 A. He said that was the only thing. And then he said once his
- 6 body cooled down, he has a pain in his back.
- 7 Q. Lower back, upper?
- 8 A. He said up like right here, it hurts in his chest, it hurts
- 9 | in the back.
- 10 Q. And did he go to any hospital?
- 11 A. He said just EMS.
- 12 Q. Did he go to the hospital, or does he plan on going to the
- 13 | hospital?
- 14 A. He said they took him last time.
- 15 Q. To what hospital?
- 16 A. He said it's somewhere here down the road, about 20 minutes.
- 17 I can make a phone call.
- 18 | Q. Okay.
- 19 A. Where our other guy, Gregorio, is in the hospital.
- 20 | Q. Right.
- 21 A. I think Syracuse.
- 22 MR. EDELSTEIN: St. John's, I think.
- 23 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Oh, okay. Yes, where he's at.
- 24 MR. EDELSTEIN: St. Joe's, I mean, I think.
- MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: I can call and find out.

MR. KAMINSKI: But the hospital is not in Weedsport here, it's --

MR. EDELSTEIN: No, no, no, it's in Syracuse.

MR. KAMINSKI: Oh, okay.

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MR. EDELSTEIN: Like down -- you know, go down this road and then there's three miles and then you go down the thruway again in Syracuse.

MR. KAMINSKI: Oh, okay.

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: (Telephone call) Hey, the investigators want to know what hospital the guys were taken to last night.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Excuse me.

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: The investigators want to know what hospital the guys were taken to last night.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Upstate New York --

MR. KAMINSKI: SUNY Upstate?

- the face laceration. And I guess he said the rest of them are going today to get checked out.
- 3 Q. To the same hospital?
- $4 \parallel A$. Yes, more than likely.
- 5 Q. Okay. So he jumped out -- you said he jumped out the side
- 6 | opening?
- 7 | A. Yes.
- 8 Q. And he went out with his nephew.
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 Q. They jumped out. He just has little glass cuts and his back
- 11 hurts and his --
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 0. -- neck hurts.
- 14 A. And his chest was hit in the front.
- 15 Q. And the chest, yes. Did he felt any -- was there any kind of
- 16 pre-impact braking?
- 17 A. He said that it braked and pulled to the side trying to get
- 18 away from the truck. He said that's why the bus didn't flip. It
- 19 | just ended up on its side.
- 20 Q. So it pulled to the right --
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. -- away from the truck.
- 23 A. Away from the truck.
- 24 | Q. Okay.
- 25 MR. KAMINSKI: Anything else, John?

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1	MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Do you want his email?
2	MR. KAMINSKI: Yes. I don't think I gave him business card,
3	too. He can have that.

MR. KAMINSKI: Today's date is January 31st, 2023. My name is Ronald Kaminski with the National Transportation Safety Board. With me is Mr. John Humm, another investigator with the Safety Board, and we're going to be talking to a passenger on the bus, Mr. Raul Martinez. And we also have an interpreter with us just in case, and his name is James Edelstein.

INTERVIEW OF RAUL MARTINEZ

BY MR. KAMINSKI:

- Q. And we'll start off. Mr. Martinez, what's your date of birth?
- 12 | A.
- Q. Okay. And why don't you start with just -- you told me you were seated in the front, first row on the right side, passenger side of the bus, by yourself. You're laying down. Correct?
- 16 A. That's correct.
- Q. Okay. And why don't you just tell me from the point of when you realized the accident or if you were snoozing or just start what you remember about the crash.
 - A. Usually I wake up a little bit late, but this time I was early. I woke up at 5:30, got dressed, made it downstairs, was waiting for the driver. He should be there waiting for me, like I said. We left the hotel, the Eco no Lodge, to head to the job site. As soon as -- like around 5:50, same time more or less we usually leave, but that time we left om 5:50. We were on the

road. I sent out a quick text, I crossed my arms, I laid back and like not even four minutes after I was lying down, I just remembered being turned to one side and hearing Christopher scream muchachos, muchachos, esta bien, which is guys, guys, are you guys all right. I got up -- I wake up. I see that we're missing one section of the bus and Peter Lies (ph.) and Jonathan (ph.) aren't there. A lot of people aren't there.

Gregorio's (ph.) on top of me. I nudge him to get up. He wasn't responsive. I started screaming Gregorio, Jonathan, Gregorio, Jonathan. That's when Christopher says for us to get out of the bus, we need to leave the bus. I get out. Baltazar, another gentleman that was in the accident with us, told me that there's two on the -- two under the bus. As I'm walking towards the back of the bus, since he got out of the window -- well, the opening -- I'm walking around and I see a gentleman on the floor and a passenger. A Good Samaritan, was asking if anyone of us knew CPR, and he started performing chest compressions on one of the -- one of our workers that was lying down on the floor.

And I went to see who was under the bus, and that was Peter Lies. He got caught beneath the wheel and the wheel snapped, and at this point there wasn't much that we could do, and Jonathan was right next to him. Then they -- I heard if everybody's off the bus. I was looking for Gregory because he was on top of me. He was still on the bus. They said Gregorio's still on the bus with three others that are trapped. And that's when paramedics got

there, maybe 15, 20 minutes later. I think they were waiting for the fire department to try to cut pieces out of the bus that way they can start -- try to get some of the people that were stuck. And no one understood what the guys were saying so they asked if anyone spoke Spanish over here and to talk back who spoke English. I was trying to talk for them in one section and then going to the ambulance to help everybody else. I was a little groggy during everything.

And going back on back to help the gentlemen who was performing chest compressions on the other gentleman on the floor, he says that we need to move him, it's too cold, we need to get something under for him. So I was pulling at his pants, helping them, trying to put him closer to the sidewalk. Christopher -- I saw Christopher. He hugged me, he was crying. We're all a little bit out of it. That's when he noticed -- that's when we noticed that there was a piece of someone's skull on the street. That's when I replied that's from Peter Lies because he's caught underneath the wheel, the rim that broke and cut that part off.

We were there -- I was there trying to help out as much as I can because they didn't have anyone on site that could talk to them.

22 | Q. Um-hum.

A. And there was a police officer there that was -- everyone else there that was working there was -- they understood that, you know, stuff like this -- there was a time and a place for

everything, and that officer -- there was no need for him to act the way he was acting, saying that we've been looking at -- keeping an eye on this company for so long, and this and that, we were just waiting for something. I just didn't want to help anymore after that, like --

- Q. And that was a police officer, a state trooper or --
- 7 A. My boss has his info.
 - Q. Okay.

A. That -- he told us to leave, what are you doing, you're not supposed to be here, and that's when I told him that I was involved in the accident. Well, that doesn't matter, you're still not supposed to be here, and I told him there's no one here that spoke Spanish. It doesn't matter, go wait in your boss's vehicle. So my boss -- I was waiting in there with my boss. They said for us not to go anywhere because we were going to give a statement. I was waiting there.

Before I gave them my statement, after I had to identify the bodies. So I go with my boss, because my boss knows somebody that has their paperwork, but I only know them by their nicknames. So I started calling one of the other workers up, hey, do you remember who Peter Lie was, do you remember who Little John was, do you remember who Lynch was? What were their real names because I only know them by, like, by their nicknames, like I said.

- 24 | Q. Um-hum.
 - \parallel A. The -- same officer on the scene, what are you doing here,

that we're here to identify the bodies. Well you don't need two people for that and like I said, well, they said he has the list of names and he knows them by their nicknames. That's when I started looking how bad it was. It turns out the three that were stuck inside the bus, they were fatalities. The other three that were outside, which was the gentlemen that was seen by the Good Samaritan, and the -- Peter Lies and John were also deceased. And Gregorio was rushed to the hospital, so was Antonio. And --

- Q. So Gregorio was still --
- 10 A. He was in critical condition.
- Q. Critical condition, okay. Okay. So did you -- how was
 everyone getting out of the bus that -- if they could walk or if
 they could --
- 14 $\mid A$. A few got out of -- through the opening that was there.
- 15 Q. The opening that was torn open?
- 16 | A. Um-hum.
- 17 Q. Okay.

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- A. The front door wasn't able to open as well, but I kind of kicked it and it opened. I got out through the front. And walking by that's when the Good Samaritan saw me and told me to call 9-1-1. I dialed 9-1-1. After that I called my boss at the job site. I said we were in a car accident. And he was a bit upset, he asked if everybody was all right. Then I said no, and the line got disconnected because not so good cell service.
 - Q. Um-hum. Okay. And do you know was there ever any discussion

- 1 about -- did you guys know if there were seatbelts on the bus?
- $2 \mid A$. I'm pretty sure there were seatbelts on the bus, but like I
- 3 said, we would ride from one bus, there was another bus. Not all
- 4 the buses have seatbelts or do all the buses have seatbelts. I'm
- 5 | not 100 percent sure on that.
- $6 \parallel Q$. Okay. And so did you ever know anybody that wore seatbelts
- 7 on the bus?
- 8 A. Yes, the driver.
- 9 Q. Okay. Any of the passengers, do you know?

- 12 A. At the time, like I said when I was up, I just felt real

- 17 MR. KAMINSKI: Oh, right.
- 18 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: He was sitting here and then the other
- 19 Antonio was here -- Antonio Reyes.
- 20 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: No, I gave him the -- yes, the other name
- 21 | Baltazar --
- 22 MR. EDELSTEIN: Oh, okay, Baltazar.
- 23 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Yes.
- 24 BY MR. KAMINSKI:
- 25 Q. Okay. And anyone --

- A. All right. So Axel Rojas (ph.) and Jesus Lopez-Lopez.
- Q. Who was in the window? Who was in the aisle?
- A. All right. Pablo -- I believe that's Jesus Lopez-Lopez.
- $4 \parallel \qquad$ MR. HUMM: So he was the one sitting in the aisle, correct?
- 5 MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Yes, he was in that seat by himself.

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Q. No. And so did he go to the hospital the next day or -(Crosstalk)

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: We've asked him if they want to go -we've taken two -- three of guys have been taken to the hospital.

One, I believe, he had a leg fracture. The other one he got
slashed across his face. He was taken to the hospital.

MR. KAMINSKI: In Massena?

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: Yes, they stitched him up and released him, but they didn't give him antibiotics, nothing for the pain, so we took him again.

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. And did you go back to Massena or a different --

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: No, here.

MR. KAMINSKI: Okay. And what hospital is that?

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: I'm not sure which --

(Crosstalk)

MR. GAONA-BENITEZ: He said they asked them for their names in the ambulance and that was it.
