Email Report:

The Vehicle Recorder Division received the following personal electronic devices: Apple iPhone SE 2020 (IMEI: 356470103757543), iPhone 11 (IMEI: 356804117704473), Kazuna eTalk (S/N: F0192011007551). The devices arrived exhibiting signs of impact damage (IMG_3294.jpg, IMG_3295.jpg, IMG_3297.jpg). The iPhone 11 powered on normally using surrogate parts and was protected by a numeric passcode. A potential passcode provided to the investigation team was unable to unlock the device, thus no data were recovered. The iPhone SE 2020 was unable to power on using surrogate parts, thus no data were recovered. The Kazuna eTalk was unable to power on, thus no data were recovered.
